

Sub. : Organising awareness training of adolescents and Purchase of additional item of drug under Adolescents Health Care Programme at Budge Budge Municipality.

Placed below is the communication of Chairman, Budge Budge Municipality bearing no. 334 dt. 08.05.2007 and 398 dt. 17.05.2007 on the above mentioned subjects, which speaks for itself.

Adolescents Health Care Programme has been piloted at Budge Budge Municipality where 20 nos. of adolescent training programme have been conducted covering 500 nos. of adolescents in total and adolescents' friendly clinic has been established once in a week, from where counselling and treatment are being provided.

It has been observed by the Municipality that the trained adolescent girls are more aware towards accessing services of the clinic. The ULB felt that extension of training to more nos. of adolescents would create not only awareness amongst them but also improve health seeking behavior.

Under the circumstances stated above, the plan on conduction of awareness training in 40 batches, each batch containing 25 adolescents. The duration of each training programme will be for two days for each batch. The said training will be conducted during the period June – July and Sept. – October, 2007. The cost involvement for the purpose will remain same as was approved earlier which is as under:





Sub.: Implementation of Adolescent Health Care under Health component of KUSP - Clearance of the proposal submitted by All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health, Kolkata.

One of the recommendations of study conducted by Interim Support Consultants describes – "A special clinic for Adolescents organized in the Sub-Centre that would link educational & vocational opportunity and counselling to better Adolescent Health and their access to services." Based on their recommendations component of Adolescent Care has been included in the work plan for FY 2005 – 06.

Preliminary discussion on the subject was held with Dr. Raut, Prof. & Head, Dept. of Epidemiology, AIIH & PH during Health Officers' training in public health. Subsequently, a letter was issued to the Director, AIIH & PH to prepare proposal on the subject matter.

During visit of Ms Silke Seco, Human Development Advisor, DFID at Kolkata on 16.08.2005, the issue was discussed and support of AIIH & PH was appraised (Back to Office report of Silke Seco, dated 17.08.2005 enclosed).

Dr. D.K. Raut was contacted and this issue was discussed in details with him. A proposal on Adolescent Care has been developed by Dr. Raut and re-tuned on the basis of comments of Ms. Silke. The final proposal along with cost estimate submitted by Dr. Raut was forwarded to Ms. Silke who sent clearance through e-mail (copy enclosed).

The salient features of the said proposal are as under:

- a) Health care need assessment of Adolescent Awareness on RTIs / STIs, HIV / AIDS (KABP Study).
- b) Assessment of Health status of Adolescent, treatment seeking behaviour and utilisation of Health care services.
- c) Assessment of status of Health care facilities for provision of services for the Adolescent.
 - Study will be conducted in slums of 4 ULBs.
 - 150 BPL Adolescents would be selected from each ULB on random basis from groups of school going and school drop out.
 - Health status of all the Adolescent under study will be assessed.
 - Status of existing health facilities of municipality will be assessed.
 - Existing status of Govt. agency and NGOs be assessed for linkage.
 - Submission of report by AIIH & PH.
 - Time frame for a, b, c is around two months.
- d) Training of Health Officer, Asstt. Health Officer, Medical Officer of 10 ULBs on Adolescent Health be conducted by AIIH & PH.
 - Implementation of Adolescent care will be piloted in 10 ULBs out of 40.
 - 30 nos. of HO, AHO & Medical Officer will be trained in two batches, each batch of 15 participants for 3 days duration.
 - Around one month will be taken by AIIH & PH to plan and organize the above training.
- e) Facilitator's guide and training manual for HHW on Adolescent Health will be developed in Bengali by AIIH & PH.
- f) Training of grass root level functionaries will be rendered by the already trained HO, AHO & Medical Officer.
 - Faculty of AIIH & PH will monitor and supervise the HHWs training as and when required.
