Sir/ Madam.

I. In partial modification of No. H/8 SNC/CFW/2006 dated 19/06/2006 regarding implementation of JSY Scheme in Municipalities and Corporations, this is to inform you that henceforth the scheme will be implemented as follows:

Eligibility criteria

All SC/ST and BPL pregnant women who are 19 years or above in age will be eligible for the scheme up to two live births irrespective to their residential status..

Please note that henceforth the fund for additional cash assistance @Rs.300/-will be placed from RCH section in lieu of HSDI section vide No. HFW/HSDI/322/JSY-174/08 dated 08/07/2009 of Project Director (HSDI), along with the fund for JSY. In this respect you are requested to let the undersigned know the availability of fund placed from HSDI as on

31<sup>st</sup> March, 2009 for making additional payment of cash assistance to eligible pregnant women after delivery. The expenditure incurred from 01/04/2009 to 31/07/2009 may please be reflected in the FMR of RCH. The statement of expenditure for the same purpose up to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2009 for the year 2008-09 may kindly be placed to the HSDI section. This will help in timely release of fund under JSY.

III. Please recall Memo No. H/SFWB/377(57) dated 18/05/2009 where the rate of reimbursement of out of pocket expense under referral Transport Scheme has been revised as follows based on the distance traveled:

To and fro journey from 0 to less than 10Km	Rs.150/-
To and fro journey from 10 to less than 20Km	Rs.250/-
To and fro journey from 20 to less than 30Km	Rs.350/-
To and fro journey 30Km and above	Rs.450/-

Sub.: Supply of Cold Chain Equipments to the Urban Local Bodies (ULB) in West Bengal for strengthening & providing quality Immunization services in Urban Health Care Programme.

#### Madam.

You may be aware that in West Bengal various Community Based Primary Health Care Programmes like CUDP-III, IPP-VIIII, RCH Sub-Project and CBPHCS etc have been implemented in the Urban Local Bodies in phases assisted by external donor agencies since 1985-86. Till date all the 127 ULBs, out of which 6 are corporations, spreaded over 19 districts in West Bengal have been covered by such Urban Health Programme. To give you an idea about the population status of the ULBs it is stated that as per 2001 census percentage of urban population to total population in West Bengal is 28.03.

As per urban health strategy, Govt. of W.B, responsibility of implementing, supervising and monitoring of urban health programmes has been vested with Dept. of Municipal Affairs through their Nodal Agency i.e. State Urban Development Agency (SUDA) which is a statutory body of M.A. Department.

The table below reflects the number of ULBs according to population size as per 2001 census:

Population size	No. of ULBs
More than 3 lakhs	11
More than 2 lakhs to 3 lakhs	10
More than 1 lakh to 2 lakhs	37

Total	127

A 3 tier system i.e. grass-root level, sub-centre and referral has been developed in the ULBs for delivery of Primary Health Care Services to the population with special focus to BPL population. The nerve centres for service delivery activities are the sub-centre which have been established in the ULBs @ 1 per 5000 BPL population. So far, about 1782 nos. of urban sub-centres have been established in the ULBs under various primary health programmes. At the sub-centres different clinics are being conducted at regular frequency every month including Immunization clinic.

You may also be aware that one of the critical areas with regard to conduct of Immunization is maintenance of quality immunization services to the mother and children. This needs priority attention for strengthening the services with required logistics support.

Recently, SUDA has taken great initiatives for strengthening of Routine Immunization in all the ULBs in phases through their own urban health staff, in collaboration with DHFW, WBSISC, UNICEF and DFID supported CMU-KUSP. The initiatives taken include training / capacity building of the urban health staff on vaccination and strengthening supervision and monitoring the quality Immunization services. After the said training, lot of enthusiasm has been generated in the ULBs and the response by the ULBs is quite encouraging. The ULBs have keen shown interest to strengthen their Immunization services with quality control but the ULBs are facing difficulties for maintaining proper cold chain system due to acute shortage of ILR and Deep Freezer. For this purpose the ULBs are pressing hard to provide these logistics support i.e. ILR and Deep Freezer immediately to enable them to ensure quality Immunization services.

A Shared Market Process of the Superior of the

SUDA have already requested State FW Dept. to incorporate the requirements for ILR and Deep Freezer of the ULBs while consolidating the total demand for the state of West Bengal. But the demand for the cold chain equipments for the ULBs could not yet been matured. Many of the ULBs are still compelled to use domestic freeze for preservation of vaccines.

Unless the ULBs could strengthen their conduct of immunization service activities, a large number of urban children are likely to be deprived of immunization warranting health hazards due to attack of vaccines preventable diseases.

Total number of cold chain equipments i.e. 126 number each of 140L ILR & Deep Freezer and 25 numbers of each 300L ILR and Deep Freezer are required immediately for maintenance of cold chain system at the ULB level to ensure quality immunization services.

In view of all above, you are requested to consider and arrange supply of requisite cold chain equipments for use by the Urban Local Bodies in the State of West Bengel to strengthen Routine Immunization and deliver quality service as well.



## Minutes of meeting held on the 29th of April 2009 at the 1st floor Conference Hall of the Swasthya Bhawan, regarding Implementation of various National Programmes including RCH in Urban Areas

The list of the officers present in the meeting is enclosed.

At the very outset the Commissioner Family Welfare and Mission Director NRHM set the tone for discussion.

Special Secretary, Urban Health, briefed the house that previously the Health initiatives in the urban areas was sought to be funded through the World Bank Project but since all the National disease Control Programme and RCH had provisions for interventions in the urban areas it has been divided to explore the opportunities of using these programmes for urban interventions. He requested the Programme Officers to identify the areas of interventions permissible under various programmes, current status of implementation and need and scope of improvement to meet the critical gaps in health service delivery in the urban areas.

All the Programme Officers agreed that in most cases the National Disease Control Programmes do not differentiate between urban and rural population except in some cases such as RCH and Malaria where urban interventions are separately earmarked. They also agreed that the focus in the urban areas should be increased. The main problem areas that were impending the service delivery in the urban areas were identified as following:

1. Lack of uniform structure for health delivery in the urban areas. Many ULBs do not have any health sep up at all. The ULB level health set up, wherever, created is outside the regular reporting structure of the Health Department.

 Lack of ownership of the health programmes among ULBs though Public Health including Sanitation, Solid and Liquid Waste Management is a mandate with the ULBs according to the 74<sup>th</sup> Amendment.

3. Lack of coordination of the ULBs with the CMOH. There is no designated officer in the ULBs who could coordinate with the CMOH for getting their demands included in the district plan.

4. Multiplicity of Players in the Urban Areas results in un-coordinated intervention with practically no integrated monitoring or reporting system of the disease out break and service delivery by Private Health Service Delivery Channel. The integration of the Private Establishments with the health care delivery would be crucial as the Health Department would not be able to create dedicated set up in Urban Areas like Rural areas and neither it would be required.

5. The reporting system from the ULBs about disease surveillance, disease out break, immunization or curative /preventive care is weak.

It was informed by the Special Secretary (UH) that the Urban Health Strategy formulated jointly by the H&FW Department and Departments of Municipal Affairs and Urban Development has conceptualised a uniform three tier structure of health care delivery especially targeted at the urban poor. The Strategy also addresses the issues related to the coordination mechanism between the ULBs and the Health Department at the State, District and Urban level. The department is also considering designating a Nodal Officer, Urban Health at the district level to coordinate the matters relating to Urban Health, the following suggestions were made by the Programme Officers to improve the service delivery in urban areas.

IMPARY -

 To improve the immunization outreach the FTS of the sub centers should be given special training so as to make them eligible for administering immunization. SUDA is currently organising this training but this need to be technically coordinated and monitored by the Health Department.

2. Mapping of facilities has to be done in a scientific manner including the private Health Facilities. It was learnt that such exercise was done by KMDA earlier.

- 3. In case there is a gap in service delivery in the curative services the strategy should be to fill it up in PPP mode by entering into a contract with the private service providers, to reduce the upfront cost for setting up such facilities and running cost for sustaining and maintaining them.
- 4. The ULBs have to fulfill their constitutional obligation and implement the Health Programmes. The Monitoring of the implementation of the implementation of National Health Programmes and health service delivery in urban areas will be done at the district level by urban committee under the District H&FW Samity.
- 5. To ensure that the monitoring, supervision and coordination at the district level is effective the fund and the reporting should to be routed through the District Health and Family welfare Samity.
- 6. The ULB Health & FW Samities should be reconstituted. These Samities will prepare a detailed Health plan including sanitation, drinking water supply and Waste Management for the ULB.
- 7. The plan templates for ULBs should be prepared so that the ULBs could prepare proper plans. Training and Capacity Building for planning also has to be organized.

On the basis of the above the Following Decisions were taken:

- For the year 2009-10 immediate intervention of the National Health Programmes can be initiated in those ULBs where a structured health care set up has been put in place-(i.e. 52 municipalities identified by MA Dept) other than KMC especially in those programmes which have a specially earmarked intervention for the Urban Areas.
- 2. A workshop should be held with select Chairpersons and Medical Officers of the ULBs and the CMOHs and other stake holders of those districts who have been able to ensure better health service delivery in the urban areas by adopting innovative methods and assess whether these innovative methods can be incorporated in the Health Sector Strategy and rolled out at other places.
- 3. The structure of the urban health delivery mechanism should be finalized and orientation of all stakeholders should start at the earliest. The templates for Urban Health Plan should be prepared and the ULB level Health Plans should be prepared. These plans should form the basis of Health Plan for the urban areas and should be incorporated in the District and State PIP from the year 2010-11.

Separate meeting should be organized for the KMC Area.

As per the above mentioned guidelines issued regarding the Referral Transport Scheme, eligible pregnant woman opting for institutional delivery are being reimbursed the out of pocket expense @ Rs.150/ to Rs.350/- according to distance slab for to and fro journey from residence to the institution where she will deliver.

It has been brought to our notice that in some of the cases the highest limit of reimbursement i.e Rs.350/- could not meet the out of pocket expense for the pregnant

woman who has to travel more than 30 km distance.

Therefore, the distance slab has been modified as follows:

To and fro journey from 0 to less than 10 Km

To and fro journey from 10 to less than 20 Km

To and fro journey from 20 to less than 30 Km

To and fro journey 30 Km and above

Rs.450/-

The above mentioned reimbursement according to distance slab is applicable for all pregnant women of SC/ST and BPL category only irrespective of her age, number of living children and residential status. All the public health facilities including Subcentre and accredited private health facilities under Ayushmati Scheme are to be requested to make the payment before/ during discharge of the mother from the institution after delivery. The other part of the aforesaid memo will remain unchanged. This order will come into force on and from 1<sup>st</sup> June 2009. All concerned may kindly be informed accordingly.

To give honor to the client's choice in respect of the organization (Government or Private) where he/she will undergo Sterilization Operation it has been decided to accredit Private Health facilities who are willing to be empanelled under the scheme and as per direction of Government of India (Vide No. N11019/2/2006-To/Ply dtd. 29.10.07) a detailed guideline has been framed and the same is enclosed.

You are requested to accredit private facility and empanel its doctors (as per Family Planning Insurance Scheme) for providing sterilization services as per the qualification requirements and criteria for accreditation (Please refer the manual on Standards for Female and Male Sterilization Services, Oct 2006, GOI - the Red Book). The accredited private health facility may be reimbursed on monthly basis. For further details please visit web site <a href="https://www.mohfw.nic.in">www.mohfw.nic.in</a>

### The private facility must fulfill the under mentioned criteria:

- i) Must have license under clinical establishment rule.
- ii) Must have trade license, clearance from Pollution Control Board.
- iii) Must have operating surgeon/gynaecologist empanelled.
- iv) Must to apply and give undertaking as per format.

- v) Must have Operation Theater, waiting space as laid down in manual on standards for male and female sterilization services Oct 2006, GOI the Red Book.
- vi) Must maintain the patient register.
- vii) Must submit the report within 10th of next month.
- viii) Must claim for reimbursement monthly.
- ix) Must display the accreditation certificate and as mentioned in point 7.

You are therefore requested to inter act with the private health facilities of your district, explain the scheme to them and to take initiative so that as many private health facilities as possible can be accredited within this financial year. You are also requested to monitor the scheme regularly.

#### Guidelines for Sterilization Operation at Accreditated Private Facilities/ NGOs in NHFS (Non High Focus States).

- (1) The state should accreditate the private facility/NGO & empanel its doctors for providing sterilization services as per the criteria for accreditation (Please refer to the manual on standards for Female & Male Sterilization Services, Oct. 2006. GOI the Red Book).
- (2) At least 2 private facilities (can be more) should be accreditated per block for providing these services. If the block has only 1 private centre for accreditation the centres from the neighbouring blocks could be recognized for this purpose.
- (3) An amount of Rs. 1500/- would be available for the said services out of which accreditated private facility would receive Rs. 1300/- as organizational expense for each case of male sterilization and Rs. 1350/- for each case of female sterilization. The remaining Rs.200/- for each case of male sterilization & Rs. 150/- for each case of female sterilization will be towards the payment of the motivator ANM/ASHA/AWW/Link workers for counseling, motivating & follow up visit of the cases who have undergone sterilization.
- (4) If the client is self motivated then he/she will get the motivator's payment.
- (5) No user fee shall be levied on any client. No charges for whatsoever for drugs & dressing or other incidental costs should be charged from the client by the private facility.
- (6) It will be a cashless service, i.e. the Beneficiaries of the scheme will not have to make any payment for the sterilization services availed in the accreditated private facilities. The BPL Cards (Gram Panchayat/Ward Councilor's Certificates)/JSY Card/MCH Card/SC or ST Certification by the Gram Panchayet/Ward Councilor will be used for the purpose of availing benefit under the scheme.
- (7) If the **client chooses** to go to an accredited private facility he/she **will not be entitled** to any compensation money.

- (8) The upper age limit for men undergoing vasectomy in private facilities is 45 years & it is
  the responsibility of the facility/motivator/ANM/ASHA/AWW/link workers to ensure
  this.
- (9) The private health facility should display prominently its accreditation certificate as well as the range of services provided & quantum of compensation for motivators. It should also display that the sterilization services are provided free to the clients having BPL/SC/ST certificates from the appropriate authority.
- (10) The private facilities should produce the voucher to the District Health & Family Welfare Samiti along with the photocopy of the BPL/SC/ST certificate furnished by the beneficiary. With this proof of sterilization operation the private facilities will submit claim for reimbursement.
- (11) The accreditated private facility may be reimbursed on monthly basis.
- (12) The validity of cases should be ensured by conducting at least 10% sample check.



- 1. The comments on the Draft PIP and Draft PAD were not received from all the officers. The officers are requested to complete the comments at the earliest and sent it by email to Special Secretary (anoop@wbhealth.gov. in).
- 2. Till finalization of the detailed comments, the following general comments may be informed to the World Bank.
  - i. The Process Indicators inserted afresh are not accepted in general.
  - ii. The MSC may do centralized procurements, if fully functioned. This flexibility to be kept in the project.
  - iii. Keeping in mind the need of convergence in Planning, Execution, Monitoring and Supervision at the decentralized level i.e. DH&FW Samity level, the project funding to the ULBs could be through the DH&FWS rather than SUDA. The SUDA would be provided funds for the activities to be done at SUDA level.
  - iv. Specific support to MSC not to be part of the Project funding and the State Government would do it from other sources of funds.
  - v. The phasing of the Project Components would be modified as some of the activities have started not waiting for the World Bank funding. The Delivery Improvement Interventions must be pilot tested in Phase-I for better, smoother and faster rollout in Phase-II.
  - vi. System Strengthening should use ICT enablement.
  - vii. ID&BG Hospital activity has been missed out.
  - viii. Rural issues are to be deleted.
  - ix. PETS may not be agreed.
  - x. Disaster component in PH is missing.
  - xi. Accreditation may not be the correct phase. The quality improvement may be accepted.
- 3. Shri A. Mukherjee, Adviser, HMIS informed that he has made appropriate corrections in the portion reflecting the background of the proposed project on the basis of latest available data. Ms Rajashree Narayan, TAST was asked to collect the same from Shri A. Mukherjee.
- 4. It was detected that some of the statements contained in the Draft PAD were not properly understood. It was decided that clarification may be sought from the World Bank people on the unclear portion, if any.
- 5. It was accepted that initially the basis framework of our Project Proposal including Activities, Phasing of Activities, Institutional Arrangements for implementation, Fund Flow Mechanism and Monitoring and Evaluation should be firmed up and the complete overhaul of the PIP. document may be done after these basic issues are settled with the World Bank people after mutual discussion.



Placed below is the communication from the Chairman , Tarakeswar , Chandrakona and Old Malda bearing nos. TM/HHW/2/2007/4 dt. 14.11.2007 , 724/CH-M/Health/07 dt. 15.12.2007 and 1557 dt 01.01.2008 respectively on the subject.

This to mention here that after completion of training of HHWs, most of the ULBs implementing Community Based Primary Health Care Services already identified Sub-centres and started service implementation wherein conduct of immunization programme is one of the most important service components.

In this regard to maintain the Cold Chain system, the ULBs are requesting for providing them with Refrigerator / ILR for preservation of vaccines at ULB level. It has been learnt that preservation of vaccines using refrigerator is not in vogue now-a-days. Only ILR is being used for the purpose. DHFW procure ILR from GOI for placement at District Health offices for further distribution to Rural areas. There is no such provision exists in Urban areas. It may be appreciated that without having proper Cold Chain system in the ULBs, Routine Immunisation can not be carried out effectively.

Hence, supply of ILR not only to the 63 non-KMA ULBs, but also to other 22 non-KMA ULBs implementing IPP -VIII Extn., RCH Sub-Project and HHW Scheme is an absolute necessity. Commissioner, Health & FW may be requested for such supply to the 85 Non-KMA ULBs.
