Reimbursement claim for Cell Phone Charges of Sri M.K. Pradhan, Jt. Secretary , M.A. Deptt.

Sri M.K.Pradhan , Jt. Secretary to the Government of West Bengal in Municipal Affairs Department has submitted two Cell phone bills for the month of August 2010 and September 2010 amounting ₹1395 and ₹538 respectively for reimbursement from the fund of SUDA. It is also certified by him in his note that the cell phone was used for official purpose.

Incidentally, it may be mentioned here the officers of State Urban Development Agency are getting reimbursement of telephone call charge as per resolution taken in the 38th meeting of the Governing Body meeting of SUDA wherein it has been decided to the effect that the officers who are not provided with exclusive direct phone in their chambers will be reimbursed a maximum amount of ₹ 800/- as reimbursable charge for cell phone/residential telephone and charge for Broadband Service altogether and in the case of officers who are provided with the exclusive direct phone in their chambers will be reimbursed a maximum amount of ₹ 400/- as reimbursable charge for cell phone/residential telephone and charge for Broadband Service altogether.

In view of above, the claim for full reimbursement of bills for cell phone is placed before Governing Body for consideration and approval.

Consideration of proposal for inclusion of all categories of employees of SUDA under Employees' Provident Fund benefit Scheme

The Employees' Provident Fund Organisation under memo no 39755/cc III/38 dated 07.01.2002 regarding applicability of the Employee's Provident Fund & Miscellaneous Provision Act, 1952 and the schemes framed thereunder) informed us that the State urban Development Agency had been included as scheduled-I class of establishment under Employee's Provident Fund & Miscellaneous Provision Act, 1952. The inclusion of our organisation under this Act has become effective on and from 06.02.1997. For the purpose of making compliance with different provisions under this Act and the schemes framed there under namely Employees Provident Fund Scheme 1952, Employees Pension Scheme 1995 and Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme a code vide no WB/CA/39755 has also been allotted.

In compliance with the directive issued by the authority from Employees' Provident Fund Organisation we have been depositing provident fund contribution as employers share @ 10% on pay (B. Pay + D. Allowance) of Sri Samir Sen, Computer Operator and Sri Netai Ghorai, Cashier cum Accountant of this office.

Incidentally, it may be mentioned that with effect from 01.11.90 in terms of E.P.F. scheme 1990 an employee becomes eligible as soon as he is employed in the establishment where the scheme applies. Sub rule of rule 2 of this Act defines the term 'Employee' in the following manner:-

'Employee' means any person who is employed for wages in any kind of work, manual or otherwise in or in connection with the work of an establishment and who gets wages directly or indirectly from the employer or any person:-

1. Employed by or through a contractor in or in connection with the work of establishment;
2. Engaged as an apprentice not being an apprentice engaged under the Apprentice Act 1961 or under standing orders of the establishment.

Since the application of this Act is mandatory this may be applied to all categories of employees of this organization except to the retired officials on consolidated remuneration.

Swarna Jayanti Sahari Rojgar Yojana (S.J.S.R.Y)

Implementation of SJSRY in the state (annexure-'A')

SJSRY was launched on 1.12.1997 to provide gainful employment to the urban unemployed or underemployed through encouraging the setting up of self-employment ventures or provision of wage employment. Originally the scheme consisted of two major components - (1) The urban self-employment program (USEP) and (2) The urban wage employment program (UWEP). The cost of the program is shared 75:25 between the Central Government and state governments.

Later, the scheme has been revamped w.e.f 1.04.09. The revised SJSRY has the following components:

1. Urban Self-employment programme (USEP)
2. Urban Women Self-Help Programme (UWSP)
3. Skill training for Employment Promotion amongst Urban Poor (STEP-UP)
4. Urban Wage Employment Programme (UWEP)
5. Urban Community Development Network (UCDN)

USEP provides financial support in the form of bank loan and subsidy to individual poor beneficiaries for setting up gainful self-employment ventures.

USEP also provides for consultancy services, technological knowledge, infrastructure and other facilities for establishing and running business enterprises and marketing of products.

UWSP has two sub-components; i) UWSP loan & subsidy & ii) UWSP Revolving Fund

UWSP loan and subsidy sub-component provides assistance to urban poor women groups for setting up gainful self-employment ventures through bank loan and subsidy.

UWSP Revolving Fund sub-component provides assistance to TCGs / SHGs by way of revolving fund to enable their women members undertake small economic activities.

STEP-UP aims to promote livelihood generation through capacity building and skill development

UWEP seeks to provide wage employment to prospective beneficiaries living below poverty line within the

jurisdiction of the urban local bodies by utilizing their labour for construction of socially and economically useful public assets.

UCDN component aims at creating a network of community development societies, self-help groups and other civil society organisations for poverty reduction and livelihood development.

Implementation of the programme in the state since inception has remained fairly impressive as is evident in the performance sheet annexed.

Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns (UIDSSMT)

Upto date status of UIDSSMT programme are as follows: (Annexure-‘B’)

1. Till February, 2010, total 26 projects have been sanctioned in UIDSSMT programme at an estimated cost of Rs. 385.65 crores and town-wise break up is shown in **Annexure-I**.
2. Out of seven projects, all on Water Supply, cleared in the 8th Meeting of State Level Sanctioning Committee (held on 27.01.09), Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India have accorded approval for 4 projects in March'09 (Taherpur, Kharar, Nalhati and Khirpai) thus leaving 3 projects awaiting approval of Govt. of India and shown in **Annexure-II**.
3. Another set of 5 Water Supply projects in 5 towns have been approved in principle in the 9th Meeting of SLSC held on 25.02.09 at an estimated cost of Rs. 158.51 crores and out of these five projects four have been cleared by CPHEEO and one project is awaiting their clearance, details are also in **Annexure-II**.
4. An aggregate sum of Rs. 204.31 crores have been received by SUDA as Central Share (excluding incentives of Rs. 3.47 crores towards DPR preparation cost) and Rs. 39.44 crores as State Share for the 26 projects as mentioned in Sl. 1 above. Total fund received is Rs. 243.75 crores and shown in **Annexure-III** and this include 2nd installment for 9 towns amounting 59.42 crores.
5. An aggregate sum of Rs. 59.42 crores has been received towards 2nd installment of nine towns (viz. Rs. 50.04 crores as ACA and Rs. 9.38 crores as State Share) are shown in **Annexure-IV**.
6. An Aggregate sum of Rs. 213.94 crores have so far been released to 26 ULBs which includes Rs. 181.61 crores as Central Share and Rs. 32.33 crores as State Share.
7. Field level execution works in respect of seventeen Water Supply Projects, two Drainage Schemes and one Road project are in progress Work Order for Sewerage Scheme (for STPS) in Kurseong has

been issued. Tender formalities for Diamond-Harbour Water Supply Scheme (WTP) is almost complete.

8. Field level works have also started in the four Water Supply projects sanctioned in March, 2009.
9. Total Expenditure incurred for the on-going projects is Rs. 155.67 crores.
10. Out of 7 Water Treatment Plants proposed for seven towns, works in seven towns are in progress. Remaining 1 no. is in tendering stage.
11. Overall 60% of the distribution system is completed already.
12. 85% of the Drainage work have been completed for Siliguri town and nearly 65% completed for Balurghat town.
13. Bituminous work of Habra/ Ashokenagar-Kalyangarh By-pass road have nearly been completed (95%).

Decided that with a view to effective monitoring and implementing the project within timeline two Project Implementation Cells comprising of retired Engineer, preferably experienced in Public Health, Municipal Finance Officer from retired West Bengal Audit and Accounts Service Officers and retired officer experienced in Community Development be formed. It is also decided that Director, SUDA will be entrusted to take necessary measures to form the cell including initiating steps for selection of manpower for the cell.

Agenda-4

Integrated Housing & Slum Development Programme (IHSDP)

The progress of IHSDP is as follows: (Annexure-‘C’)

- ◆ So far 94 projects in 80 Non-Mission towns with a total approved Project Cost of Rs. 925.85 crores have been sanctioned by the Govt. of India (vide Annexure-I).
- ◆ The year-wise position of sanction of IHSDP projects is as follows
 - 2006-07 16 projects Rs. 188.81 crores
 - 2007-08 44 projects Rs. 359.96 crores
 - 2008-09 34 projects Rs. 377.08 crores.
- ◆ Total number of Dwelling Units sanctioned is 52600 nos.
- ◆ Total cost of Dwelling Units is Rs. 499.54 crores and that of Infrastructure Development is Rs. 426.30 crores
- ◆ The Tenth, Eleven, Twelfth and Thirteenth Meetings of the State Level Co-ordination Committee (SLCC) were held on 24.02.2009, 11.01.2010, 29.01.2010 and 15.02.2010 respectively.
- ◆ An aggregate sum of Rs. 406.359 crores has been received so far as Central Share out of which Rs. 340.55 crores is towards first installment and Rs. 65.81 crores represents second installment for 13 projects.
- ◆ Out of Rs. 68.747 crores received so far as State Share Rs. 31.97 crores is against first installment, Rs.5.99 crores is against second installment and Rs. 30.79 crores is towards Additional State Share for

Dwelling Units.

- ◆ A sum of Rs. 302.119 crores has so far been released to the ULBs as Central Share and Rs. 54.51 crores as State Share aggregating to Rs. 356.629 crores as total release.
- ◆ Proposals for Second installment for 31 projects involving an ACA of Rs. 95.08 crores have been submitted to the Government of India for approval. The Government of India has approved in-principle some of the proposals the remaining have been held up pending submission of Third Party Inspection and Monitoring Agency (TPIMA) reports. No funds against the aforesaid 31 proposals have so far been released by the Government of India.
- ◆ About 29400 Dwelling Units are in different stages of construction out of which about 17300 are fully complete. Work Orders have been issued for about 37000 units.
- ◆ As regards Infrastructure development the value of works for which work orders have been issued is Rs. 189.36 crores.
- ◆ Total expenditure incurred so far is Rs. 284.61 crores (Rs. 193.17 crores for Dwelling Units and Rs. 91.44 crores for Infrastructure Development).
- ◆ On representation from the State Government for enhancement of ACA allocation for the State under IHSDP, Government of India agreed to a diversion of Rs. 250.00 crores of ACA from BSUP to IHSDP. DPRs for 36 towns with a total project cost of Rs. 230.39 crores with a number of Dwelling Units of 10805 and involving an ACA of Rs. 170.23 crores was forwarded to the Government of India for sanction against the enhanced allocation. The Government of India, however, suggested recasting the DPRs on the principle of 'whole-slum approach'. SUDA is taking up the matter with the concerned municipalities for identification of the slums to be covered under the recast DPRs.
- ◆ M/S Infrastructure Professionals Enterprise (P), Ltd. have since been engaged by KMDA to act as PMU for IHSDP as well as UIDSSMT. With consent of Government of India, the said firm has also been engaged as PIU for IHSDP. They have started functioning as such from Nov.-Dec.-2009.
- ◆ SUDA has initiated a proposal for engagement of the same firm viz. M/S Infrastructure Professionals Enterprise (P), Ltd. to function as PIU under UIDSSMT. This proposal needs clearance of the Governing Body of SUDA as well as State Level Sanctioning Committee under UIDSSMT.
- ◆ KMDA in consultation with the Government of India has since engaged the following three firms as Third Party Inspection and Monitoring Agency (TPIMA) for IHSDP (and also BSUP).
 - BLG Construction Services Pvt. Ltd.
Jodhpur-08, Rajasthan,
 - M/S SGS India Pvt. Ltd., Kolkata
 - Aarvee Associates Architects Engineers and Consultants Pvt. Ltd.,
Hyderabad

Out of the above three firms M/S BLG Construction Services Pvt. Ltd. Jodhpur-08, Rajasthan, have since started their project inspection work since 11.03.2010.

- ◆ A Socio-economic Survey of Beneficiaries under IHSDP is in progress with a view to prepare a database. City Managers' Association, West Bengal has been engaged by SUDA for this purpose. CMAWB has so far prepared reports for 23 projects under IHSDP.

Informed of the status of Integrated Housing and Slum Development Programme (IHSDP). It is observed that the performance of some of the ULBs under this programme is not up to the desired level. In view of poor performance of some of the ULBs, it is decided that Director, SUDA will be requested to take the necessary measures to improve the performance of those lagging Municipalities.

Integrated Low Cost Sanitation Scheme (ILCS) under Revised Guidelines: (Annexure- 'D')

- Through implementation of this centrally sponsored programme, all the dry latrines and the consequent practice of carrying night soil manually has been eradicated from this State with effect from June, 2007. All the municipal scavengers employed earlier in such manual practice have been liberated from such heinous jobs and are reemployed in some other upgraded jobs. Further schemes have been undertaken under the 'Revised Guidelines of ILCS Programme' in 2008, for provision of new latrines in the holdings having no latrines, in order to eradicate the practice of open defecation as well as for conversion of in-sanitary latrines for proper environmental sanitation. Up-till date, Govt. of India has sanctioned DPRs for 11 towns for a total no of 6798 latrines units for a total project cost of Rs. 6.90 crores. Latest status of works in the sanctioned towns are as under

- Fund released by GoI : Rs. 129.59 lakhs
- Fund released by GoWB : Rs. 25.80 lakhs
- No. of units completed : 1486 units
- No. of units in progress : 315 units
- Expenditure Incurred : Rs. 127.41 lakhs

Further DPRs for 18 towns are under consideration of GoI for a total no. of 9816 latrine units for a total project cost of Rs. 11.29 crores

Having taken into consideration the fact that DPRs of 18 towns for a total no. of 9816 latrines units with a total project cost of Rs. 11.29 crores which are pending for consideration of G.O.I, it is decided that Director, SUDA will pursue the matter with the Government of India for early approval and release of fund against the DPRs.

Activities of Health Wing, SUDA is detailed below :

- a) Health Wing, SUDA is in overall in-charge of all the Community Based Health Programmes namely CUDP III, CSIP, IPP-VIII, IPP-VIII (Extn.), RCH Sub-Project, Asansol, DFID assisted HHW Scheme and Community Based Primary Health Care Services (CBPHCS) in 63 Non-KMA ULBs.
- b) Present tenure of CUDP III, CSIP and RCH Sub-Project, Asansol is upto 31.03.2010.

Communication has been made to the Department of Municipal Affairs for extension of tenure of the said programmes w.e.f. 01.04.2010.

- c) Present tenure of IPP-VIII and IPP-VIII (Extn.) is upto 30.06.2010.
- d) Present tenure of DFID assisted HHW Scheme will close on 31.03.2010. However, window period for three months w.e.f. 01.04.2010 has been granted by HSDI, DHFW for finalization of closing of accounts. As present tenure of Community Based Primary Health Care Services (CBPHCS) in 63 Non-KMA ULBs will expire on 31.03.2010, communication has been made to the Dept. of Health & Family Welfare for further extension.
- e) Estimated budget for FY 2009-10 have been estimated for an amount of Rs. 803.99 lakhs for CUDP III & CSIP and Rs. 2977.70 lakhs for RCH Sub-Project, IPP-VIII & IPP-VIII (Extn.), Rs. 496.49 lakhs for HHW Scheme and Rs. 2317.28 lakhs for CBPHCS.
- f) Dept. of Municipal Affairs has released fund so far during the FY 2009-10 Rs. 767.70 lakhs for CUDP III & CSIP and Rs. 2964.45 lakhs for RCH Sub-Project, IPP-VIII & IPP-VIII (Extn.).
- g) DHFW has released fund of Rs. 225.00 lakhs for HHW Scheme and Rs. 337.50 lakhs for CBPHCS so far during the FY 2009-10.
- h) Present tenure of contractual appointment of Dr. Gargi De, APO; Dr. Sunanda Basu, APO; Dr. Sumit Talukdar, APO; Shri Achinta Saha, MIES Officer; Shri Dipankar Chowdhury, Finance Officer and Shri Sasanka Sekhar Marik, Data Entry Operator is upto 31.03.2010 and Dr. Shibani Goswami, Project Officer, Health upto 16.06.2010.

Informed of the status of National Family Benefit Scheme. In order to mitigate the sufferings of the beneficiaries it is decided that District Municipal Development Officer (DMDO) of each district will be requested to dispose of the pending cases within the shortest possible time. It is also decided that Director, SUDA be requested to take necessary measures in this regard.

Status of USHA: (Annexure- 'F')

The Ministry of Urban Development and Poverty Alleviation (National Building Organisation), Government of India entrust SUDA to conduct a detailed household survey in the slum areas within the selective 67 (sixty seven) Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) which have a census (2001) population more than one lakh. For this purpose they allotted Rs.77 lakhs (Rupees seventy seven only) to SUDA.

To conduct the survey under USHA (Urban Statistics for Human Resources and Assessments) SUDA had completed the total training part to the resource personnel selected by those selected ULBs by 25.01.2010. Seven lakh Detailed Household Survey Schedule were printed from the M/S Saraswati Press Private Ltd., a government of West Bengal undertaking. Forms were also being distributed to the ULBs from 25.01.2010 with an instruction to complete the detailed household survey within the all selected slums (both notified and non-notified) by 07.02.2010. Six lakh eight thousand numbers of forms were distributed to the 53 numbers of ULBs. Details can be seen in the annexure. Forms were distributed to the ULBs within North Bengal by courier. The name of the 14 ULBs, who have not taken any survey schedules still date are Kolkata and Chandernagore Municipal Corporations, Bhadreswar, Bidhannagar, Gayeshpur, Halisahar, Hooghly Chinsura, Konnagar, Ranaghat, Rajarhat Gopalpur, Rishra, South Dum Dum, Titagarh and Durjeeling Municipalities. It may be mentioned that courier company could not able to send forms to Darjeeling Municipality due to political unrest. Negotiation is on progress for the start the survey work in Kolkata Municipal Corporation.

In the mean time Shantipur Municipality had completed the detailed household survey. Survey works in major ULBs are nearly completed. Now, we are waiting for receive of data entry software from the Ministry of Urban Development and Poverty Alleviation, Government of India.

Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns (UIDSSMT)

Upto date status of UIDSSMT programme are as follows: (Annexure-'B')

1. Till February, 2010, total 26 projects have been sanctioned in UIDSSMT programme at an estimated cost of Rs. 385.65 crore and town-wise break up is shown in **Annexure-I**.
2. Out of seven projects, all on Water Supply, cleared in the 8th Meeting of State Level Sanctioning Committee (held on 27.01.09), Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India have accorded approval for 4 projects in March'09 (Taherpur, Kharar, Nalhati and Khirpai) thus leaving 3 projects awaiting approval of Govt. of India and shown in **Annexure-II**.
3. Another set of 5 Water Supply projects in 5 towns have been approved in principle in the 9th Meeting of SLSC held on 25.02.09 at an estimated cost of Rs. 158.51 crore and out of these five projects four have been cleared by CPHEEO and one project is awaiting their clearance, details are also in **Annexure-II**.
4. An aggregate sum of Rs. 204.31 crore have been received by SUDA as Central Share (excluding incentives of Rs. 3.47 crore towards DPR preparation cost) and Rs. 39.44 crore as State Share for the 26 projects as mentioned in Sl. 1 above. Total fund received is Rs. 243.75 crore and shown in **Annexure-III** and this include 2nd installment for 9 towns amounting 59.42 crore.
5. An aggregate sum of Rs. 59.42 crore has been received towards 2nd installment of nine towns (viz. Rs. 50.04 crore as ACA and Rs. 9.38 crore as State Share) are shown in **Annexure-IV**.
6. 2nd installment of ACA for four more projects amounting to Rs.20.05 crore has since been released by GoI. But the said fund along with matching State Share of Rs. 3.31 crore is yet to be placed at the disposal of SUDA.
7. An Aggregate sum of Rs. 228.22 crore have so far been released to 26 ULBs which includes Rs. 193.39 crore as Central Share and Rs. 34.83 crore as State Share.
8. A sum of Rs. 45.00 crore has been received as Additional State Share to compensate price escalation for JnNURM projects. From this kitty so far a sum of Rs.9.10 crore has been released to 6 ULBs under UIDSSMT. Another Rs. 7.00crore from this source has been released to four projects pending receipt of 2nd installment of ACA with the concurrence of Finance Department.
9. Field level execution works in respect of seventeen Water Supply Projects, two Drainage Schemes and one Road project are in progress Work Order for Sewerage Scheme (for STPS) in Kurseong has been issued. Work Order for Water Treatment Plant (WTP) and OHRs for Water Supply Scheme at Diamond-Harbour have already been issued.

10. Field level works have also started in the four Water Supply projects sanctioned in March, 2009.
11. Total Expenditure incurred for the on-going projects is about Rs. 182.00 crore.
12. Out of 7 Water Treatment Plants proposed for seven towns, works in six towns are in progress. Field level work for WTP in Diamond-Harbour will start soon.
13. Overall 70% of the distribution system is completed already.
14. 85% of the Drainage work have been completed for Siliguri town and nearly 65% completed for Balurghat town.
15. Bituminous work of Habra/ Ashokenagar-Kalyangarh By-pass road have nearly been completed (95%).

- ◆ So far 94 projects in 80 Non-Mission towns with a total approved Project Cost of Rs. 925.85 crore have been sanctioned by the Govt. of India (vide Annexure-I).
- ◆ The year-wise position of sanction of IHSDP projects is as follows

- ◆ Total number of Dwelling Units sanctioned is 52591 nos.

- ◆ The fifteenth Meeting of the State Level Co-ordination Committee (SLCC) were held on 17.09.2010.
- ◆ An aggregate sum of Rs. 480.084 crore has been received so far as Central Share out of which Rs. 340.55 crore is towards first installment and Rs. 139.534 crore represents second installment for 44 projects.
- ◆ Out of Rs. 105.204 crore received so far as State Share Rs. 31.97 crore is against first installment, Rs.13.204 crore is against second installment and Rs. 60.03 crore is towards Additional State Share for Dwelling Units.
- ◆ A sum of Rs. 379.805 crore has so far been released to the ULBs as Central Share and Rs. 64.70 crore as State Share aggregating to Rs. 444.505 crore as total release.
- ◆ Proposals for Second installment for 3 projects involving an ACA of Rs. 10.22 crore have been submitted to the Government of India for approval.
- ◆ About 35200 Dwelling Units are in different stages of construction out of which about 24500 are fully completed. Work Orders have been issued for about 39200 Dwelling Units, another 5600 no. of DUs are being taken up through the beneficiaries and departmentally.
- ◆ As regards Infrastructure development the value of works for which Work Orders have been issued is Rs. 241.22 crore.

- ◆ Total expenditure incurred so far is Rs. 382.29 crore (Rs. 264.65 crore for Dwelling Units and Rs. 117.64 crore for Infrastructure Development).
- ◆ On representation from the State Government for enhancement of ACA allocation for the State under IHSDP, Government of India agreed to a diversion of Rs. 250.00 crore of ACA from BSUP to IHSDP. DPRs for 36 towns with a total project cost of Rs. 230.39 crore with a number of Dwelling Units of 10805 and involving an ACA of Rs. 170.23 crore was forwarded to the Government of India for sanction against the enhanced allocation. 25 DPRs out of the above 36 DPRs were conditionally sanctioned by GoI in CSC Meeting held on 08.02.2010. The Government of India, however, suggested recasting the DPRs on the principle of 'whole-slum approach'. Following their suggestions we have since engaged M/S BUIDL to prepare fresh DPRs under Ph-II for selected 30 towns with Whole Slum Approach. In the first lot five DPRs are expected to be sent to the GoI by middle of October. In the meantime the GoI has been informed that the conditional sanctioned of 25 DPRs mentioned above may be treated as void.
- ◆ M/S Infrastructure Professionals Enterprise (P), Ltd. have since been engaged by KMDA to act as PMU for IHSDP as well as UIDSSMT. With consent of Government of India, the said firm has also been engaged as PIU for IHSDP. They have started functioning as such from Nov.-Dec.-2009.
- ◆ KMDA in consultation with the Government of India has since engaged the following three firms as Third Party Inspection and Monitoring Agency (TPIMA) for IHSDP (and also BSUP).

 - M/S SGS India Pvt. Ltd., Kolkata
 - Aarvee Associates Architects Engineers and Consultants Pvt. Ltd.,

The above firms by now have inspected 64 Projects and submitted their reports for 46 projects. So far reports on 41 projects have been forwarded to GoI.

Out of the above three firms M/S BLG Construction Services Pvt. Ltd. Jodhpur-08, Rajasthan, have since started their project inspection work since 11.03.2010.

- ◆ A Socio-economic Survey of Beneficiaries under IHSDP is in progress with a view to prepare a database. City Managers' Association, West Bengal has been engaged by SUDA for this purpose. CMAWB has so far prepared reports for 45 projects under IHSDP.

“ For both the Health Project, the Adviser (Health), SUDA was authorised by the then M.A Secretary and Chairman, SUDA to also function as Controlling Officer for passing and making payments pertaining to T.A. / D.A. bills, Car hiring charges, re-imbursement of telephone charges and other expenses in contingent nature since the inception of the said programme. The Director & Chief Executive, SUDA has intimated the undersigned

today that this practice and procedure needs to be vetted by the Governing Body of SUDA.

As instructed the notes prepared by the undersigned as above may please be placed before the ensuing Governing Body's meeting for ratification with effect from October, 1998, for RCH, Asansol and December, 1998 for IPP-VIII Extension."

Accordingly, the same is being placed with G.B. for ratification.

In this connection, it is suggested that the separate Bank Account that is being maintained for IPP - VIII Extension and RCH, Asansol in Central Bank may be operated by the Health Sector. The signatories in cheques may be Adviser (Health) and Special Secretary, M.A. Department as against the present procedure of Director & C.E., SUDA and Special Secretary. All payments related to Health Sector including establishment matters will be made by Adviser (Health). This will help in operating the Health Sector independently. Health Sector should maintain a separate account which is necessary for keeping proper control on accounts of RCH, Asansol and IPP-VIII Extension. In this connection, it is brought to the notice of G.B. that the total expenditure of Health Sector in SUDA is chargeable to RCH, Asansol and IPP - VIII Extension. Health Sector will keep its own cash book and accounts separately and act independent of SUDA accounts. All necessary reports to be submitted to internal and external agencies and also to audit has to be prepared by the Health Sector. A separate internal audit for Health Sector may also be arranged.

Under the Project on Municipal GIS supported by UNICEF, a Documentation Team was employed by UNICEF directly, who worked in close collaborations with different Municipalities where the GIS is under implementation along with the representatives of SUDA and CMDA as and when required for preparation of "Phasewise Documentation of GIS". The Team submitted its draft final copy on 21st of September, 2001 and also made a dummy draft for the approval of Minister and UNICEF. The same was shown to MIC, UD & MA on 25th of September, 2001, which he approved and expressed his desire to release the document on the day of workshop scheduled to be held on 1st of October, 2001 at Siliguri. The expenditure will be met from the fund placed by UNICEF for GIS work.
