determined in consultation with the Finance Department in the same manner as mentioned above.

- (iii) When such casual/da 'v rated/contractual workers are allowed the entry point basic pay, they will not get any other allowances like dearness allowance, house rent allowance etc. However, their basic pay will be enhanced by 5% after every three years and the three years will be counted by treating the period from 1st August 2011 to 1st July 2012 as completed year for giving effect to 5 per cent increase in basic pay.
- (iv) The remuneration of casual/daily rated/contractual workers who have not yet completed 10-year service will be equivalent to 75% of the remuneration admissible under sub-para (ii) above subject to a minimum of Rs. 5000/- p.m.
- (v) Those casual/daily rated/contractual workers who will-complete 10 year service on 1st July every year will come under the purview of this Order provided no such worker if engaged after 01-04-2010 will come under the purview of this Order.
- (vi) A casual/daily rated/contractual worker who will fulfil the conditions as laid down in sub-para (i) above will continue to be engaged in such a manner till he/she attains the age of 60 years when he/she will be paid an amount of Rs. I lakh as one time cessation of engagement benefit.
- (vii) A casual/daily rated/contractual worker may be allowed 30 (thirty) of 180 (one hundred eighty)days in addition to 30 days off as mentioned hereinbefore.

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- (viii) A casual/daily rated/contractual worker who is engaged in two different Government Departments but has rendered services for 10 years without a break will come under the purview of this Order.
- (ix) It is reiterated that Officer/Officers responsible for any further engagement of such casual/daily rated/contractual worker will be personally liable for violation of this Order. However, having regard to the exigencies of situation and in order to facilitate smooth running of any project/administration or for serving academic interest where it is absolutely necessary contractual engagement may be made for a very limited period necessary contractual engagement may be made for a very limited period observance of recruitment rules and against sanctioned vacancies. Advertisement shall be published in newspaper and applications shall be invited from eligible candidates to fill up those temporary vacancies. Simultaneously steps should be taken to fill up the vacancies on regular basis following recruitment rules. Such contractual engagement may be renewed from time to time, but not exceeding a total period of 6 (six) years. No claim to regularization of this contractual service in terms of G.O. No. 8305-F dt. 26-09-2005 read with G.O. No. 642-F dt. 24-01-06 shall lie.
- (x) The provisions of this Order will not be applicable where contractual engagement has been made without any sanctioned post and for any specific project for a very temporary period upto a maximum 6 (six) years or

In order to provide security of tenure, appropriate emoluments and certain terminal benefits subject to fulfilment of certain conditions to the casual/daily rated/contractual workers who have remained engaged in various Government Establishments for a considerable period of more than 10 years in connection with implementation of various schemes/projects of various Departments of the government two Memorandums vide No. 2966-F(P) dt. 23-04-2010 and No. 11794-F(P) dt. 22-12-2010 were issued by the Government in Finance Department.

The question of making the provisions of the two aforesaid orders more effective and suitable to the convenience of the Government Establishments/Organization has been under active consideration of the Government for some time past.

After careful consideration of the matter and in supersession of the aforesaid orders and all other orders issued by other Departments in the matter, the undersigned is directed by order of the Governor to say that the Governor, has now been pleased to order that the casual/daily rated/contractual workers, who are remaining attached to various establishments of the Government Departments/ Directorates/Regional Offices/other Organizations for not less than 10 years continuously as on 01-08-2011 and have rendered service for at least 240 days each year will be allowed the following benefits:

(i) The casual/daily rated/contractual workers who have rendered 10 years of service continuously with at least 240 days attendance each year may remain engaged in the same status and capacity till their attaining the age of 60 years.

The continuity of service shall have to be certified by a competent officer not below the rank of Assistant Secretary in the case of a Secretariat Department, Director in the case of a Directorate and Assistant Engineer/S.D.O/B.D.O in the case of Regional Offices. 'The concerned officer, who certifies may be advised to exercise extreme precautions and take assistance of an office of WBA & AS, if necessary.

(ii) An entry point basic pay in PB-I i.e. Rs. 6600/- (Rs. 4900 + 1700) p.m. will be admissible to casual/daily rated/contractual Group 'D' workers as consolidated remuneration, similar entry point pay (entry point pay in the Pay Band plus Grade Pay) will be admissible to casual/daily rated/contractual Group 'C' worker and an employee of any other category, if he/she fulfils the required condition will be entitled to a monthly remuneration which will be minimum entry level pay of Pay Band and Grade Pay corresponding to his/her category and the remuneration may be

Payment of such benefit to the family of such casual/daily rated contractual worker who dies before attaining the age of 60 years had been under active consideration of the Government for some time past.

After careful consideration of the matter, the undersigned is directed by order of the Governor to say that the Governor has been pleased to order that in the event of death of casual/daily rated/contractual workers who were engaged following due process delineated under No.9008-F[P], dated 16.09.2011, before attaining the age of 60 years, the legal heirs of such casual/daily rated/contractual workers shall be paid an amount of Rs.2 lakhs as one time death benefit. For implement tion of this Department's Memo No. 2966-F(P), dated 23.04.2010 under which it has been accided to give some financial and other beautits to the Casual/Dailyrated/Contractual Workers who are rendering service for a substantial period remaining attached to various Government Establishments the undersigned is directed by order of the Governor to prescribe the following modalities for due observance of all concerned :-

The benefits detailed at Sl. Nos. 1 to 4 of the aforesaid order will be available w.e.f. 1st January, 2011 to those casual, daily-rated, contractual workers who have rendered at least 10 years of service as on 01.04.2010 with 240 days of work each year.

The continuity of service shall have to be certified by a Competent Officer not below the rank of Assistant Secretary in case of a Secretariat Department, Director in case of a Directorate and Assistant Engineer / S.D.O. / B.D.O. in case of regional offices. The concerned Officer who certifies may be advised to exercise extreme precautions and take assistance of an Officer of WBA&AS, if necessary.

As entry point basic pay in PB-1 i.e. Rs. 6,600/- p.m. will be admissible to casual, daily rated, Gr. - 'D' workers as consolidated remuneration, similar entry point basic pay plus Grade Pay will be admissible to Casual, Dailyrated Group - 'C' worker and other categories of Casual Workers as consolidated remuneration, if they fulfill the prescribed conditions.

When such Casual Workers are allowed the entry point basic pay, they will not get any other allowances like dearness allowance, house rent allowance etc. However, their basic pay will be enhanced by 5% after every 3 (three) years.

The benefit of the G.O. No. 2966-F(P), dated 23.04.2010 will be applicable mutatis mutandis to the Panchavat Bodies / ULBs / Statutory Bodies etc.

A Casual / Dailyrated / Contractual Worker who will fulfill the conditions as laid down in 6)

para (1) above will continue to be engaged in such a manner till he or she attains the age of 60 years.

A Casual / Dailyrated Worker when given a security of tenure may be allowed a benefit of 30 (thirty) off days a year.

Maternity Leave to the Female Workers may be allowed in addition to 30 (thirty) off days

A Casual / Dailyrated Worker who is engaged in two different Government Departments but has rendered services for 10 years without a break will come under the purview of the G.O. No. 2966-F(P), dated 23.04.2010.

The benefit of the G.O. No. 2966-F(P), dated 23.04.2010 will be a one time benefit for the Casual / Dailyrated Workers who have completed 10 (ten) years of service as on 31.03.2010.

11) It is reiterated that such Casual Workers will continue to remain in the status of Casual Workers.

The undersigned is further directed to say that henceforth no further engagement of Gr.-'D' employees who are engaged in the manner as laid down in Finance Department's Memo No. 3727-F, dated 20.05.2009 and paid out of contingencies will be done. Officer / Officers responsible for such engagement will be personally liable for violation of this Government Order.

It has come to the notice of the Government for some time past that for in plementation of various schemes/project of the various Departments of the Government the controlling authorities have been compelled to engaged casual, daily rated workers. In many cases, these employees render service for a substantial period of time even for more than 10 years remaining attached to various Departments of Government. The issue of security of tenure, appropriate emoluments and certain retirement benefits in respect of these employees so engaged on long term basis has been under consideration of the Government for some time past.

After careful consideration of the matter the Governor has now been pleased to order that these casual/daily rated workers who are remaining attached to various establishments of the Government Departments/Directorates/Regional Offices for not less than 10 years as an 01.04.2010 and have rendered service for at least 240 days each year will be allowed the following benefits—

- These casual/daily rated workers may remain engaged fill their attaining the age of 60.
- 2. They will be paid remuneration which will be the minimum pay with corresponding category of workers of Pay Band 1 (PB-1) i.e. Rs. 6,600/- p.m. with enhancement © 5% every 3 (Three) years. They will not be entitled to any other allowances. An employee of any other category, if he/she fulfils the required condition will be entitled to a monthly remuneration which will be minimum entry level pay of Pay Band and Grade Pay corresponding to his/her category and the remuneration may be determined in consultation with the Finance Department in the same manner as mentioned above.
- After the period of engagement of such an employee ceases on his attaining 60 years of age, he/she will be paid an amount of Rs. 1 lakh as one time cessation of engagement benefit.
- During the period of engagement, the service of such an employee may be terminated because of involvement in criminal case/misconduct/delinquency/incapacitation etc. or if the employee intends to opt out of the engagement on his own.

 The enhanced remuneration will be paid w.e.f. 01.06.2010.

 The detailed modalities will be worked out soon for implementation of this order.
- 5. From the date of issue of this order no further engagement of such casual/daily rated worker shall be entertained. Officer/Officers responsible for any further engagement of such casual/daily rated worker will be personally liable for violation of this Government order.

You are aware of the fact that there is provision for engagement of ASHA under NUHM as Community Health Worker. The ULBs under NUHM already have such type of workers namely HHW & FTS. Now, to utilize the existing workforce under NUHM, it has been decided by the Health & Family Welfare Department with the approval of the highest authority that existing HHWs will function against the sanctioned number of ASHA. New ASHA will only be engaged in the ULBs where the number of existing HHWs is less than the sanctioned number of ASHA. Henceforth, HHW and ASHA will function as Community Health Worker (CHW) in all the ULBs under NUHM (this office Memo No. HFW/NUHM/553/2015/2903 dated 15.09.2016, copy enclosed)

At present existing HHWs are getting a monthly honorarium of Rs. 3125/- out of state budget whereas ASHAs will earn incentive on the basis of performance and a fixed honorarium of Rs. 1500/- per month. Thus to keep parity between the work profile and monthly earnings of HHW and newly recruited ASHAs, it has been decided by the competent Authority that the existing HHWs will also earn some performance-based incentives. Accordingly, the job-responsibility for the existing HHWs and ASHA to be engaged has been drafted by us. You are requested to have the draft examined and revert to us with your views.

You are also aware that as per the NUHM framework, one ASHA/ HHW will serve 1000 vulnerable population. Therefore, the area of work on the field will have to be specifically assigned for each CHW. In this regard, the concerned ULBs may be requested from your end, with an intimation to us. to demarcate the field area for each CHW.

The activities mentioned at Category I will be performed by both ASHAs and HHWs. For this, ASHAs will draw an incentive of Rs. 1000/- per month. For this set of activities, the HHWs will draw the remuneration they are currently drawing, ie. Rs. 3125/- per month

- Home visit to each vulnerable families within her area fortnightly
- Motivate the community to avail health services collection of data and filling up of Family Schedule-

- Promotion of IEC activities including group discussion with the community on awareness
- generation towards Primary Health Care. Public Health and National Health Programmes,
 - Assisting implementation of ongoing National Health Programmes.
- Preparation and submission of fortnightly HMIS report,
- Ensure community participation.
- Organize at least two ward level meeting in a month

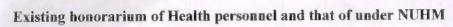
The activities listed at Category II are to be performed by both ASHAs and HHWs and for these activities, both will earn performance-based incentives at similar rates.

 - Has to register of a pregnant woman within 12 weeks of her pregnancy to an ANM either in UPHC or in UHND
 - help her to be included in JSY (if applicable)
- > Complete immunization for a child under one year

- Undertaking six (in case of institutional deliveries) and seven (for home deliveries) home-visits for the care of the new born and post-partum mother
- Ensuring monthly follow up of low birth weight babies and new born discharged after treatment from Specialized New Born Care Units
- > Report death of Child up to 5 years

Sub: Guideline for utilisation of existing HHW against the sanctioned numbers of ASHA under NUHM

Sir,

As per NUHM framework, ASHA has a significant role to play in improving health care services among urban poor. As per NUHM norms, one ASHA will serve 1000-2500 vulnerable population like slum dwellers, homeless/ pavement dwellers, beggars, street children, women working as commercial sex workers, construction workers, rag pickers, rickshaw pullers, elderly poor, disabled people and people with mental illness.

You are aware that Community Headth Workers (CHW), such as First Fier Supervisor (FTS) and Honorary Health Worker (HHW) engaged under various schemes are deployed in all the ULBs approved under NUHM, except Haringhata. Kultisand Dankuni. These FTSs and Hillws serious RCHs Event as Public Health activities with regard to the BPL population. Like the amount innormal innormal in borne on the state budget. As informed by Director: SUDA, vide Memo No, SUDA-Health/411/13/269 dated 6.1.2016, there are 7701 number of CHW (both FTSs and HIIWs taken together) out of which 6403 are HIIWs in the LLBs approved under NUHM.

The sanctioned number of ASHAs under NUHM in these 88 ULBs is 6058. It has been decided by the Competent Authority that instead of engaging fresh ASHAs in these ULBs, the exicting HHWs will be utilised against the sanctioned numbers of ASHA

All existing CHWs will continue under NUHM as FTS & HHW and will provide services as before.

Now on the basis of existing number of HHWs in the ULBs, it has been decided that

- 1. In the ULBs where the sanctioned number of ASHAs, is more than the existing number of HHWs, all the existing HHWs will continue against the sanctioned ASHAs, and the remaining area will be served by engaging new ASHAs.
 - 2. In the ULBs where sanctioned number of ASHAs is less than or equal to the total number of existing HHWs, all the HHWs (even the excess number) will continue under NUHM. No ASHAs will be engaged in such ULBs at present. New ASHAs in these ULBs will be engaged only when the number of existing HHWs becomes less than the sanctioned number of ASHAs under NUHM.
 - 3. After retirement of an HHW, her service area will be served by engaging fresh ASHA. All ASHAs will be engaged as per the guideline to be issued by the Deptt of Health & Family Welfare shortly.
