Sir / Madam,

You may be aware that India has completed over 12 months without any polio cases d anywhere in the country. This has been possible due to the detected anywhere in the country. This has been possible due to the concerted efforts made by Government, Urban Local Bodies and the partners during the last 12-18 months. While this progress is encouraging, the risk of an importation from currently polio infected countries is high.

From past experience it is learnt that the risk of polio importation is highest in the urban and peri urban areas in our state, particularly in certain identified wards in your Municipal Corporation / Municipality. The areas are at high risk due to the following factors:

- Migratory sites slums, brick kilns, construction sites,
- Poor Routine Immunization,
- Large number of families who refuse vaccination,
- Operational problems.

The Government of India has decided to conduct another national pulse polio campaign on 15th April in order to maintain high immunity against polio particularly in the polio high risk areas. Hence, it is critical to implement the following actions before the next polio campaign to reduce the vulnerability of polio outbreak in the state:

- Organising Municipal task force meetings involving Councillors, Health Officers, Medical Officers, Officials from ICDS, Education, Revenue, District and Sub-Division level health officials, local NGOs & community leaders, religious leaders under your leadership twice before the forthcoming rounds for reviewing, planning and bringing in intersectoral coordination.
- Involving the Councillors who as people representatives have huge influence on the people to carry forward high quality NID specially in mobilization of refusal families. The list of high priory wards in your ULB provided by WHO is enclosed for taking necessary action.
- A meeting of the Councillors specifically for Polio may be convened, where the refusal family list of individual wards may be shared with them.
- Monitoring the preparedness and implementation of immunization activities by the Councillors in their respective wards.
- Involvement of Honorary Health Workers, Anganwadi workers and female vaccinators from the locally predominant community as vaccination team members to improve coverage during the upcoming campaign.
- Special importance needs to be given to the planning and coverage of migratory sites i.e. slums, brick kilns, construction sites and others.

You are requested to ensure implementation of the aforesaid actions during the upcoming nation-wide polio immunization campaigns.

I request you to manage the remaining risks with utmost concerns and to take an intensified efforts to achieve a polio free India.

The progress has been possible due to a very strong inter-sectoral coordination and the active involvement of all concerned departments at the central and state level. While the progress in our country is very encouraging there is ongoing transmission in neighbhouring countries and the risk of an importation of a polio virus into India from countries with ongoing transmission remains high. It is therefore, critical that immunity in children is maintained at high levels across India to prevent any importation and spread of the 2. As part of the exercise to consolidate and protect the gains made by India so far, and to accelerate the control measures and sustain high immunity it has been decided by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India that two Pulse Polio Immunization (PPI) campaigns will be conducted on 19.2.2012 and 1.4.2012 in all States and Union Territories.

- Keeping in view the importance of the matter, it would be of immense help if you could 3. advise and ensure that:
 - Adequate numbers of polio vaccination teams cover the must vulnerable and high risk urban and peri-urban slum pockets, construction sites and nomadic camps
 - Municipal staff are to be part of polio vaccination teams (booths, house to house, mobile and transit teams)
 - NGOs, youth and students make special efforts for increasing community awareness and mobilize families to the polio booths on the immunization days.
- The above points of action are very critical to the successful conduct of the PPI Campaign and its outcomes. I would also request you to monitor and review the efforts of Urban Local Bodies in your State in the PPI campaigns.

Sub: Operational and Financial Guidelines for 2012 National Immunization Days (Pulse Polio NID Round- 19 February and 01 April 2012) in the State

This guideline is to be read in conjunction with 2006 NID Guidelines from GOI

A. Introduction:

The year 2011 has been marked as the year of remarkable achievement in the field of Polio Eradication Initiative in India. Only one wild polio virus case was identified with onset of paralysis in January 2011; more than a year ago. Bihar and Uttar Pradesh, since long known as the epicenter of Polio, are free from any indigenous case (both WPV1 and WPV3) since February 2010. All these have been possible due to the hard work rendered by all personnel involved in Polio eradication initiative across the country. However, West Bengal was under intense focus and the highest priority state in India since it had ongoing polio virus transmission both in 2010 and 2011. You are aware that the only case of 2011 was identified at Panchla block of Howrah.

The state continues to be at risk due to the following factors :

- i. In the previous years polio cases have been identified after a period of 12 18 months and low intensity transmission may still be persisting. Wild polio virus resurfaced twice in West Bengal after polio free periods of 1 yr 8 months.
- ii. Clusters of unimmunized children in different districts of West Bengal make it more vulnerable for having polio cases.
- Large migratory populations in brick kilns, urban slums, shanties along railway tracks and around construction sites further enhance our risk.
- iv. In the earlier years, wild polio virus had migrated from India to African countries like Angola through migratory population. The same path may be taken by the polio virus to return back to India.
- v. Though India has achieved a breakthrough in interrupting wild polio virus transmission, Pakistan, Afghanistan and Nigeria are still highly endemic. China and many countries of Africa have experienced outbreak following importation from endemic countries. Since wild polio virus transmission is persisting in our neighboring country, we are at very high risk.

In the NID rounds we will have to ensure each and every under 5 child in the state gets two drops of oral polio vaccine.

B. Vaccination of the children will be done through vaccination at :

- i. Polio Booths
- ii. House to house visit by vaccinators
- iii. Transit point and congregations (Fairs and festivals eg Mahashivaratri on 20 February)
- iv. Special X P conversion drives in selective HP* areas
- v. Health / Medical camps during NIDs / Doctors' clinics
- vi. Mobile teams

On the basis of polio epidemiology and operational factors, 222 High risk GPs and Municipal wards (* hereinafter called HP areas) in 27 blocks and 9 urban areas of 9 districts have been identified as High risk – they have a higher chance of getting wild polio virus transmission in case of an importation. Activity

Activity in these areas must not be compromised in any aspect. Best quality of planning, implementation, supervision and monitoring need to be ensured in these areas.

All efforts should also be made to properly cover the temporary settlements like brick Kiln, rice mills, stone crusher sites, tea-gardens etc. especially, areas with migrant populations from neighbouring states.

The vaccines to be used during the NID rounds will be tOPV.

C. Booth activity:

One booth to be set up for estimated 250 beneficiaries

Booths are to be located in easily accessible prominent places

ĬĬ. Each booth will have either 2 or 4 vaccinators as per child load / last rounds iii. booth attendance

work continuously from 9.00 AM to 4.00 PM. All booths will If the district decides to change the booth timings for local needs, then the revised timings should be uniform throughout the district and must be ratified through the DTF with intimation to the State.

Booths will also operate from all govt health facilities with OPD during all the ٧. days of activity - all under-five children admitted/discharged/born/attending OPD in any health facility during Pulse polio days (Booth and H-T-H days) to be given OPV and finger marking done. (These doses should not be regarded as RI doses and therefore should not be entered in RI cards. Parents should be advised to take scheduled RI doses including tOPV for those children after completion of SNID activity.)

Booths may be set up in the private clinic of prominent practitioners Vİ. (booths under sl no v & vi will be in addition to booths under sl no i)

NO HOUSE TO HOUSE ACTIVITY ON BOOTH DAY vii.

D. House to House activity:

- 2 3 days of house to house activity will be conducted by each house to house team
- One team will cover around 100 houses in rural area and 125 houses in urban area ij,
- In areas with sparse population (in Hill blocks of Darjiling / forest areas), this number of iii. may be reduced to 75.
- In non HP areas, house load of the teams must not be reduced to extend the days of
- In specific areas with low child-house ratio, the number of days may be extended as per V. need
- In HP areas with clusters of XR & XS houses, daily house load of the teams may be Vi. rationalised based on actual situation
- Biphasic activity every house to house team must conduct biphasic activity on all the VII. days of house to house activity - they are to revisit all the X houses generated on that day ONLY AFTER 2.00 PM with an attempt to convert them to P. Honorarium of the vaccinators reported to be not doing biphasic activity may be deducted.

E. Transit point activity:

- Transit point teams are meant for giving coverage to children passing through transit points railway stations, bus terminus and important bus stoppages, ferry ghats, etc. and visiting congregations and melas like Shivaratri mela or Urs in Mazars. They may also to be deployed in toll booths on national highways and railway crossings
- Importance of transit point vaccination is that the children on transit during the SIA days ii. cannot attend the booths; and house to house teams find them absent in their residence
- Timings of the activity should be planned according to vehicular traffic. Multiple shifts should iii. be planned for busy railway stations and bus terminus.

iv. Both the team members should be physically very active so that they may proactively search for the children (must not sit in one place).

It is mandatory that both the team members will independently vaccinate children and will have separate OPV vials, tally sheets and marker pens.

vi. Transit point teams must be properly supervised.

vii. When teams operate in multiple shifts, there must be 1 hour overlapping period between two shifts

viii. District Health department must coordinate with local Railways and Transport departments to ensure appropriate transit team placement and functioning.

F. Special X - P conversion drives

i. All teams must revisit X houses in the afternoon (biphasic activity)

ii. Special X – P conversion drives (B team activity) may be done only in high risk areas; where substantial number of X houses have been left even after all the teams have conducted Biphasic activity.

Preferably these teams should be multisectoral – along with the health workers, Medical Officers and social mobilisers, plans should be made to iclude ICDS officials / PRI members / local influential persons / officials for general administration / religious leaders

G. Health / Medical Camps

All attempts are to be made to organise health camps in the selective pockets in HP areas, just prior to or during the NID days.

In addition to providing curative care, polio vaccines being used in the NIDs to be

administered to the eligible beneficiaries in the health camps.

iii. Information on the health camps should be properly circulated before hand so that these camps may be fully utilised.

H. Mobile teams

- Mobile teams may be planned for coverage of brick kilns, small population clusters in remote areas, riverine chars etc where there is no polio booth nearby.
- ii. Each team will have two vaccinators and independent mobility for the team.

iii. They will vaccinate the children by house to house visit from the very first day.

Other operational issues:

I. District Task Force meetings & Sub Divisional Task Force Meetings for Polio

- Two DTFs should be held prior to the round to ensure coordination between various government departments, NGOs, review preparedness, determine action points with time line and assign areas of supervision to senior officials
- ii. Dates to be fixed on discussion with District Magistrate and to ensure his presence in the
- iii. For participants list in DTF, please refer to Gol field guide
- iv. Similarly, Subdivision level, Block Level and Urban area level Task Force meetings are also to be conducted at corresponding levels to implement the decisions taken at DTF.

J. Micro Planning and Review of existing micro-plans:

- Micro-plans developed in past rounds should be further refined based on the past deficiencies and renewed requirements.
- Every block / BPHC and urban area must have its own microplan.
- iii. Every house to house team must have one accountable manpower like Health worker / ICDS worker / ASHA. If all such worker list has been exhausted, then only local volunteers may be taken as vaccinator.
- Every team should preferably have one lady vaccinator from the local predominant community.

- Block microplan must have a block map indicating booth locations / high risk areas / vaccine distribution points / supervisory area demarcations and important landmarks
- vi. High priority areas, areas with migratory population and missed areas in previous rounds should receive special attention during micro-planning
- vii. There must be a plan of visiting every brick kiln / crusher site / construction site at least twice (on different days) during each polio round.
- viii. Block level microplans must be reviewed at district level for further refinement
- ix. Booth and house to house microplans are to be prepared in the specific format attached.
- x. Plans for coverage of Transit points and important congregations must be a part of the block / urban area plan
- xi. Block / Urban area microplan will have separate sheets for vaccine/logistics and training plan

K. Training:

- i. All vaccinators and supervisors must be trained before February NID
- ii. Training sessions should be decentralized to GP level for facilitating attendance by vaccinators.
- iii. Trainings must be arranged in a comfortable venue.
- iv. Each session may have maximum 50 participants and to be conducted by trained predesignated trainers.
- v. Training in HP areas must be taken by MO / SMO
- vi. Training to focus on
 - Complete HTH coverage of each and every household, brick kilns, temporary settlements, slums etc.
 - No house to house activity on booth day.
 - b. "Search and Immunize" strategy during HTH work by entering the household and immunize all children.
 - c. Correct finger marking, house marking, proper filling of X tally sheet, immunization of children outside the household, field updating of micro-plan
 - d. Good interpersonal communication
 - e. Proper maintenance of cold chain and interpretation of VVM

L. Social mobilization and IEC:

- West Bengal has a large number of families with vaccine avoidance behavior due to number of reasons.
- ii. Good social mobilization is a key to tackle this problem
- Pockets needing special / more social mobilization effort are to be identified based on past experience.
- iv. Religious leaders and PRI members need to be sensitized before hand so that they help in social mobilization
- v. IEC materials sent from state and received from other organization should be properly distributed so that there is no shortage at one place and excess in another.
- vi. Area Miking with the pre recoded CD to be done on cycle rickshaw or other slow moving vehicle. Announcements should be made from local religious sites such as mosques.
- vii. In the event of shortage of booth incentive materials received from partners, they are to be given to HR areas only.

M. Supervision:

- i. Supervisors must be independently mobile
- ii. All Supervisors must carry OPV vials & marker pen to immunize children they meet on streets, market places, through which they pass during supervision
- iii. Records of children checked and children vaccinated must be noted in his supervisory format.
- iv. Each Supervisor has to cross-check at least 5 'P' marked houses in each of his/her team day area to assess the quality of team activity.

v. In addition, they should visit and try to convert 5 'X'-Houses to 'P' houses every day in each of his/ her team day area and carry out any other relevant tasks assigned by the BMOH/Nodal Officer of Municipal Bodies.

vi. Supervisors are to impart on the job trg to their team members. They are to ensure that vaccinators under them have proper knowledge of VVM, house marking /finger marking and Tally sheet filling and communication with the family members

N. Monitoring by Medical Officers:

- There must be adequate monitoring and supervision by the Dt health officials and BPHC / PHC level MOs.
- ii. Supervision from all levels must focus on the high risk areas in all districts.
- Medical officers of BPHCs/PHCs must monitor on house to house activity days (from afternoon of 1st house to house activity day) and will focus on areas with X house clusters and unusual clusters of 'P zero' houses
- iv. List of children of X houses converted to P by MOs, need to be shared with state immediately after end of the round

O. Evening review meetings:

- Daily evening review meetings are to be arranged on all the days of activity at every district and block / urban area level. All the supervisors and BMOH must be present at the BPHC during these meetings.
- ii. BDOs , CDPOs and PRI members should be requested to be present in the block level evening meetings.
- iii. Compilation of X houses in 9D form and detail review of X house status is to be done daily in the block level evening meetings.
- iv. Main objective of evening review meeting is to plan actions for X to P conversion on the next day, not waiting for the end of the round conversion.
- Dt level evening review should be arranged in the office of DM or CMOH.

P. Reporting:

- i. Daily district performance report (may be provisional) in proper format to be sent through the quickest route - email to adhs_epi@wbhealth.gov.in or fax to any of the following numbers: 033-23573680 -- State F. W. Bureau OR to 033-23371561 - NPSP.
- ii. For tracking of X houses Block wise 9D format is to be sent to SFWB
- iii. Final report to be sent to SFWB, within 3 days of completion of the activity

Financial Guidelines

Funding will be made to the districts as per the following norms:

- a) Vaccinators' honorarium: @ Rs 75/ per vaccinator per day for actual days of work. H-t-H microplan should follow the norms of daily household load as stated earlier.
- **b) Supervisors' honorarium :** @ Rs 75/ per supervisor per day for actual days of work as mentioned in the microplan
- c) Mobility support for supervisors: @ Rs. 75/- per Supervisor per actual day of work as mentioned in the microplan
- d) Contingency: @ Rs 20/- per 4 member booth (Two 2 members booths are taken an one 4 member booth) / 1 TPT. This fund is to be utilized for purchase of vial openers, zip-lock plastic pouches for storing OPV in vaccine carriers and printing of different forms.

- e) Miking: @ Rs.250/day per 12 booth areas for 3 days (2 days prior to the activity and on booth day) to be done only on slow moving vehicles.
- f) TPT Miking: Separate miking units to be deployed at each transit point @ Rs.150/- per transit point x 3 days. Pre-recorded audio CDs will be supplied by the state.
- g) Fund will be provided for district and block level mobility including cold chain support @ Rs. 400 per day per 5 booths for 4 days. This fund may also be utilized to provide mobility support to BPHC/PHC MOs for monitoring as suggested in the guideline above and to meet any shortage in supervisors' mobility and other incidental costs.
- h) Training: Each round @ Rs. 20/- for each vaccinator (H-t-H as well as T-P-Team) and each supervisor.
- Folk Program: @ Rs 20000/- per district (except Kolkata). District / local artists / troupes should be engaged.

You may be aware that ongoing polio transmission in West Bengal is a major risk causing global attention. Transmission of polio virus can be stopped if active & strong efforts are made at the earliest to improve coverage. The suggested salient activities are as under:

Strengthening Micro Plans A.

- Review of micro plans and verification by Health Officers / Medical Officers & Supervisors. The following to be included in the micro plan:
 - Supervisor / Vaccinator names
 - Starting and ending points of each team for each day of work 0
 - Number of households to be covered by each team each day 0
 - Resting point for each team for each day between the morning and afternoon visits (biphasic activity)
 - Names of local influencers and mobilizers.
- Rationalization of workload of vaccination teams: 90 to 100 house per team per day in areas with refusal families and less than 150 houses per team per day in other areas.
- Inclusion of a female from the local community in all the teams.
- All teams working in high risk areas should have at least one accountable vaccinator (HHW / FTS / STS / ICDS workers / other available government manpower).
- High risk areas like slums, brick kilns, shanties along railway track, construction sites, transit points are included and clearly demarcated in the micro plans, dedicated vaccination teams and supervisors should be identified for coverage of these sites; vaccination teams should make at least two visits to these sites at different times of the day on separate days. These teams should have separate supervisors.
- Placement of appropriate number of transit teams covering all shifts at prominent sites with adequate supervision.
- Field validation to clearly demarcate boundaries between team and supervisory areas and prepare meps of the same so that no in between missed area left.

- Daily distribution and return of vaccine and vaccine carriers.

 Wednesday and for the rest wards once or twice in a month. Total no. of wards 35. In ward no. 8,
 there are 20,000 population wherein only 3 no. of HHWs are engaged, causing difficulty to cover all
 the population. ICDS workers are also responsible for catering of RI services the output of which
 is not known to the ULB.



You may be aware that ongoing polio transmission in West Bengal is a major risk causing global attention. Transmission of polio virus can be stopped if active & strong efforts are made at the earliest to improve coverage. The suggested salient activities are as under:

A. Strengthening Micro Plans

- Review of micro plans and verification by Health Officers / Medical Officers & Supervisors. The following to be included in the micro plan:
 - Supervisor / Vaccinator names
 - O Starting and ending points of each team for each day of work
 - O Number of households to be covered by each team each day
 - Resting point for each team for each day between the morning and afternoon visits (biphasic activity)
 - Names of local influencers and mobilizers.
- Rationalization of workload of vaccination teams: 90 to 100 house per team per day in areas with refusal families and less than 150 houses per team per day in other areas.
- Inclusion of a female from the local community in all the teams.
- All teams working in high risk areas should have at least one accountable vaccinator (HHW / FTS / STS / ICDS workers / other available government manpower).
- High risk areas like slums, brick kilns, shanties along railway track, construction sites, transit points are included and clearly demarcated in the micro plans, dedicated vaccination teams and supervisors should be identified for coverage of these sites; vaccination teams should make at least two visits to these sites at different times of the day on separate days. These teams should have separate supervisors.
- Placement of appropriate number of transit teams covering all shifts at prominent sites with adequate supervision.
- Field validation to clearly demarcate boundaries between team and supervisory areas and prepare maps of the same so that no in between missed area left.

Imparting training to all the vaccinators and supervisors by Health Officer / Asstt. Health Officer / Medical Officer for each High Priority (HP) teams.

Activities during campaign C.

- Involvement of Asstt. Health Officer, Part time Medical Officer of existing Urban Health Programmes.
- Local doctors and influencers may also be involved for vaccination of children reported ill and refusing vaccines.
- All supervisors should carry basic medicines, and all Medical Officers should carry their stethoscope and basic medicines to covert maximum sick / refusal houses.
- Evening Review Meeting in each ward with all supervisors and monitors to review daily feedback and to track X house conversions.
- Duplicate list of X houses to be prepared to share with mobilizers, influencers and others to convert these during Routine Immunization days.



 - Supervisor / Vaccinator names
 - O Starting and ending points of each team for each day of work
 - O Number of households to be covered by each team each day
 - O Resting point for each team for each day between the morning and afternoon visits (biphasic activity)
 - Names of local influencers and mobilizers.
- Rationalization of workload of vaccination teams: 90 to 100 house per team per day in areas with refusal families and less than 150 houses per team per day in other areas.
- Inclusion of a female from the local community in all the teams.
- All teams working in high risk areas should have at least one accountable vaccinator (HHW / FTS / STS / ICDS workers / other available government manpower).
- High risk areas like slums, brick kilns, shanties along railway track, construction sites, transit
 points are included and clearly demarcated in the micro plans, dedicated vaccination teams and

Activities to be conducted in High Risk Blocks of West Bengal in preparation for the 27 March SNID and onsaid + SWS cow -

A. Providing effective coordination and oversight to the campaign:

- District Task Force meeting by 18th March 2011 under the chairmanship of the District Magistrate to review preparedness of campaign, involvement of other departments and deployment of district officials to identified high risk blocks and planning units for supervision of preparation and implementation.
- Block Task Force meeting by 22 March 2011 in each high risk block under the chairmanship of SDO/BDO to review the preparedness of the campaign with emphasis on appropriate manpower placement, training status, social mobilization efforts and plan for vaccination of children reported ill and refusing vaccine. All supportive departments like ICDS, Education, PRI, other partners should participate.
- Similar Urban Task Force meetings in each Municipality by 22 March 2011.

- Inclusion of a female from the local community in all the teams
- All teams working in high risk areas should have at least one government accountable vaccinator (ICDS workers/ ASHA worker/ other available government manpower)
- One supervisor for a maximum of 6 teams for effective supervision
- All migratory sites are included in the microplans, dedicated vaccination teams and supervisors should be identified for coverage of these sites; vaccination teams should make at least two visits to these sites at different times of the day on separate days. These teams should have separate supervisors. Requirement of funds for additional manpower, if any, should be communicated to state by 18 March.)
- Placement of appropriate number of transit teams covering all shifts at prominent sites with adequate supervision.
- Placement of booths at clinics of popular practitioners so that sick children could be covered during clinic hours by these practitioners.
- Field validation to clearly demarcate boundaries between team and supervisory areas and prepare maps of the same so that no in between missed area left.

- ENSURE BIPHASIC ACTIVITY IN ALL HIGH PRIORITY AREAS
- Conduct daily evening review meeting to take immediate corrective action and plans for X to P conversion
- Daily distribution and return of vaccines and vaccine carriers

Conclusions

- India is extremely close to polio eradication best ever opportunity
 - both UP and Bihar have made tremendous progress and have probably stopped transmission
- Ongoing polio transmission in West Bengal a major risk to programme – global attention on West Bengal
- Transmission can be stopped only if active and strong efforts are made at the earliest to improve coverage
- Your leadership/actions at Corporation / Muncipal level critical for success

West Bengal is currently the only remaining state between success and failure for polio eradication in India





Guidelines for implementation of Routine Immunization under Universal Immunization Program (UIP) in Urban Local Bodies (ULB):-

A. SESSION NORMS & INJECTION LOAD:

R.I. activities should be held on every / alternate Wednesday (National Immunization Day) at fixed sites

Frequency or number of immunization sessions of an ULB in a month should be determined according to the monthly injection load as per beneficiaries of the catchment area

At a fixed site, one session should be held for every 40-70 injections. If the injection load is more than 70, two sessions should be held. With higher injection load more sessions should be considered.

In general, for every infant there will be 12 (twelve) injections i.e. 2 TT + 1 BCG, 5 DPT, 3 Hep B & 1 Measles injections. In districts where J.E. vaccination has been integrated with R.I. there will be an additional injection of J.E.

 Accordingly, rational microplan should be prepared on the basis of entire population (both BPL as well as non-BPL) of the catchment area of an ULB area

B. NATIONAL IMMUNIZATION SCHEDULE:

- All vaccines (TT, BCG, DPT, OPV, Hep B, Measles) should be made available in all R.I. sessions. JE vaccine should be available in all sessions of ULBs of Burdwan, Birbhum, West Midnapur, Howrah & Hooghly. The practice, if any, of different dates for different vaccines, should be abandoned immediately.
- DT vaccine at 5 yrs of age has been replaced by DPT (2nd Booster).
- The national immunization schedule of GoI indicating vaccine, age of administration, dose, route & site is enclosed with the guidelines for perusal of everybody. The schedule should be displayed at a convenient place of the ULB.

C. VACCINATOR:

- Services of trained FTSs should be utilized as vaccinators.
- Services of untrained FTSs / HHWs, if utilized as vaccinators, should be under supervision of a Medical Officer / Health Officer.
- Before reconstitution / administration, all vaccine vials should be checked for correct vaccine, VVM status and Expiry Date.
- For BCG & Measles (also J.E.) vaccine, the reconstitution time must be noted on the body of the vials.

D. LOGISTICS & COLD CHAIN:

- AD syringes (0.1 ml / 0.5 ml) should be used for administration injectable vaccines. 5 ml disposable syringes should be used for reconstitution of BCG & Measles vaccine (JE vaccine for 5 districts stated earlier).
- Vaccines should be stored in ILRs.
- All vaccines should be kept in the basket of the ILR.
- OPV, Measles & BCG vials should be placed at the bottom of the basket within the ILR.

T-series & Hep B vials and diluent ampoules should be placed in the upper part of the basket within the ILR.

Deep Freezers should be used for preparing ice-packs.

ULB having at least one functional ILR should act as a site with vaccine storage facility. Holding sessions at these ULBs will be treated as fixed site sessions.

Holding sessions at sites having no ILR / no storage facility should be treated as outreach sessions.

E. DELIVERY / DISTRIBUTION:

For transportation of vaccines & diluents to the immunization sites on session days, 4 icepack vaccine carriers should be used.

During transportation of vaccines in vaccine carriers to session sites, diluents should also be carried within the carrier so that they are at the same temperature as that of the vaccines, at the time of reconstitution.

Vaccines, diluents, syringes, droppers, etc. should be collected from the PP unit /

Block, where the ULBs (having no ILR / storage facility) are located.

ULB will identify a nodal person who, on the morning of the session day, will collect logistics from the source, distribute them to the session sites and at the end of the session will return the unused articles to the source on the same day. The unused vaccines with identification mark / tag should be stored in ILR. If any vaccine remains unused after 3 consecutive returns, it should be discarded even if the VVM or Expiry Date remains within usable limit.

Fund required for transportation of vaccines & logistics should be borne by the ULBs. The district / block authorities may help subject to availability of



Sub.: Guideline for implementation of Routine Immunization Programme by the ULBs.

Routine Immunization (RI) activities in the ULBs is facing major challenges due to shortage of trained vaccinators. As a result ULBs are unable to expand RI services in different wards especially in slums and vulnerable areas. At the same time entire ULBs populations are to be covered under RI activities to address Public Health.

With this issue SUDA, CMU, West Bengal State Immunization support cell (WBSISC) and State Family Welfare Dept. decided to train First Tier Supervisors of the ULBs on RI with hands on training for 25 days at Nursing Training Schools of the districts. This training includes RI Micro-planning, Cold Chain, Injection safety and other related issues.

In the mean time, 704 out of 1743 nos. of FTSs have already been trained in batches and they were supposed to improve the existing RI activities. But the trained vaccinators of most of the ULBs are not being utilized fully to cover up the entire population of the respective ULBs. Apart from this the RI activities i.e. starting from vaccination date, RI sites, RI schedule, collection of vaccines, maintenance of cold chain etc. are varied in nature in the ULBs During interaction with the ULBs, it is felt that to maintain uniformity in the ULBs a guideline on RI following Govt. of India norms may be issued. This was discussed with the Project Manager, CMU and Director, SUDA as well as Project Manager, WBSISC.

Guideline for implementation of RI programme by the ULBs is enclosed for kind perusal and approval. On receipt of approval the said guideline may be circulated to the ULBs and the Health Officers be sensitized accordingly so that palpable RI activities covering the entire population of the ULB be achieved.

Guideline for implementation of Routine Immunisation Programme by the ULBs

- The frequency of Routine Immunisation (RI) sessions should be based on rational Micro-Plan based on estimated no. of beneficiaries at the session sites taking into account all population of catchment area (not only BPL population).
- All ULB RI activities shall be on a fixed day i.e. Wednesday to keep parity with National Immunisation day, and at fixed sites.
- Frequency of RI session shall be preferably once in a week or once in a fortnight depending upon the estimated no. of beneficiaries.
- The dose, route, site and UIP schedule must be maintained as per National Guidelines. All available vaccines including Hepatitis B shall be given to the beneficiaries.
- All trained FTSs of the ULBs shall act as vaccinator.
- Immunisation activities must be carried out by Auto Disposable syringes (ADS) which will be supplied from the concerned Block / ACMOH office along with vaccines. Similarly, for reconstitution of BCG and Measles vaccines separate 5 ml. disposable syringes must be used which will also be supplied along with the vaccines.
- All the vaccines must be made available on all vaccination days. The practice of fixation of different dates for different vaccination should be stopped.
- Currently, State Health & FW Dept. do not allow domestic refrigerator for keeping vaccines for the sake of vaccine potency. Hence, domestic refrigerator which are still in use for keeping vaccines should be discontinued immediately.
- ILR is to be used for keeping Vaccines.
- If at least one functional ILR and Deep Freezer are available with the ULB, Vaccines are to be supplied from the ULB itself. If ILR and Deep Freezer are not available with the ULB, vaccines are to brought from nearest BPHC/ PP Unit on the day of immunisation in vaccine carrier by the respective ULB. Vaccine lifting plan should be finalized by the Health Officer of the ULB in consultation with ACMOH/BMOH concerned.
- One person be identified by the ULB to collect vaccines from the source on the day of Immunisation, distribute to the RI sites and return the unused vaccines vials to the said source on the same day after completion of RI session.
- ▶ Fund requirement for vaccines transportation may be met by the ULB concerned at beginning. Later on ULB may submit a consolidated funding requirement to CMOH with copy to Dy. CMOH III through concerned ACMOH. The calculation of funding requirement will be @ Rs.50/- per centre per frequency of monthly session x 12 months.

- ULB should involve Urban ICDS to mobilize the beneficiaries to the fixed vaccination sites. For this purpose a co-ordination meeting should be organised with ICDS workers/ supervisors/ CDPO and other organization wherever existing to share list of vaccination sites.
- Referral slip may be used for referring the beneficiaries to the RI sites either by ICDS / other organizations to the ULB RI sites or the vice versa, as the case may be. RI sites will keep referral slip. It will help to evaluate the strength of referral mechanism.
- GOI approved Universal Immunisation Card which will be supplied by the respective District Health Office, must be used for all the beneficiaries. No other Immunisation Card will be allowed. However, all organization may use their Rubber Stamp on the Cards.
- Report on vaccination is to be submitted by the ULB to the CMOH as per their prescribed proforma with a copy to SUDA. This reporting proforma is to be obtained from the District Health office by the ULB.
- ULB should take a proactive role in strengthening Urban Routine Immunisation and provide quality RI service to all people under the ULB.

Sir,

I am to refer to this office earlier communication under memo no. SUDA-Health/530/09/219 dt. 21.07.2009 on the subject mentioned above (copy enclosed at Annexure – I). It is learnt that Govt. of India is getting KFW (German) assistance for strengthening of cold chain.

You may be aware that SUDA has taken great initiatives for strengthening of Routine Immunization in all the ULBs in phases through their own urban health staff, in collaboration with DHFW, WBSISC, and CMU. The initiatives taken include training / capacity building of the urban health staff on vaccination and strengthening supervision and monitoring the quality Immunization services. After the said training, lot of enthusiasm has been generated in the ULBs and the response by the ULBs is quite encouraging. The ULBs have shown keen interest to strengthen their Immunization services with quality control but the ULBs are facing difficulties for maintaining proper cold chain system due to acute shortage of ILR and Deep Freezer. For this purpose the ULBs are pressing hard to provide these logistics support i.e. ILR and Deep Freezer immediately to enable them to ensure quality Immunization services.

A statement showing requirement of ILR and Deep Freezer by the ULBs, excepting KMC, is enclosed at Annexure - II.

You are requested to consider and incorporate requisite cold chain equipments for the ULBs who are not having ILR and Deep Freezer and make necessary arrangement for such supply to the ULBs at the earliest to strengthen Routine Immunization and deliver quality service as well.



This is to intimate you that most of ULBs under Community Based Primary Health Care Service Programme after completion of training of HHWs have started service implementation wherein conduct of immunization programme is one of the most important service component. They are facing difficulties with regard to storage of vaccines at ULB level as they do not have ILR. It may be appreciated that without having proper cold chain system in the ULBs, Routine Immunisation can not be carried out effectively.

You may also be aware that IPP-VIII (Extn.), RCH Sub-Project and HHW Scheme are being implemented in 22 Non-KMA ULBs where ILR is not existing. These 22 Non-KMA ULBs are in practice of store in vaccines in Refrigerator which, it is learnt, not a recommended practice at present.

You are requested kindly to take necessary steps so that one ILR be provided to each of the 85 Non-KMA ULBs at the earliest. The district-wise list of Non-KMA ULBs implementing Urban Health Programme is annexed.
