Subj: Implementation of National Deworming Day in August 2016 in the Municipalities and Municipal Corporation areas in West Bengal.

Sir,

Soil Transmitted Helminths (STH) are a public health concern in India. Around 68% children in the 1-14 year age group are estimated to be at risk of parasitic intestinal worm infestation. Evidence has shown detrimental impact of STH infestation on physical growth, anaemia, under-nutrition and cognitive development as well as school attendance. Periodic deworming can reduce the transmission of STH infections.

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare had appointed NCDC as the nodal agency to conduct STH prevalence surveys across the country to formulate evidence based strategy for the National Deworming programme. The STH mapping has been completed in West Bengal. As per the report received, it has been decided by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare that bi-annual deworming is to be conducted in the State.

In view of this, deworming will be conducted in the State during the months of August and February every year. Hence the State is to take up the next deworming round in August 2016. The target group will be all children in the in the age group 1-19 years.

In West Bengal, Mass Drug Administration will be conducted simultaneously in the 5 districts of Bankura, Birbhum, Burdwan, Purulia and Murshidabad from 10th August 2016. In these districts NDD will not be conducted separately, but the performance in the age group of 2-19 years will be extrapolated in the NDD coverage also.

While school children will be administered the medicine by the teachers, I am to request you to instruct all Urban Local Bodies to involve FTS (First Tier Supervisor) and HHW (Honorary Health Workers) for administering Tab. Albendazole to out of school children from 2 years to 19 years on 10th August and for the missed out children on the day of Mop-Up activity on 17th August 16.

In the ULB areas, the CMCH will train the teachers and urban health workers on the NDD programme. The ULBs may be requested to facilitate these training sessions.

The active involvement and cooperation of Municipal Affairs department is essential for the success of NDD August 2016 in municipal areas.

ISSUES DISCUSSED AND THE RESOLUTIONS TAKEN

Implementation of National Deworming Day

National Deworming Day (NDD)

- The National De worming programme will be held from 10th to 13th August 2016.
- In the Sub Centres, on 10th August the under-five and out-of- school children will be administered Tab Albendazole by the ANMs. (1-2 yrs - half tablet, >2yrs -1 Tablet). The tablet should be crushed, dissolved in water and administered. AWWs and ASIAs will mobilise the children at the SCs.
- On 11th August and 12th August Children in the age group 6-19 yrs will be administered tablet Albendazole by the teachers in the Schools.

Mop Up Day (MUD) 13th AUGUST

- The 13th August will be the Mop up Day, both in Sub Centres and in the Schools

Modalities

- 5 districts (Purulia/ Bankura/ Birbhum/ Bardwan/ Murshidabad) will conduct Mass Drug Administration with DEC & Albendazole tablets for elimination of Filaria. The 1-19 yrs data of administration of Tab Albendazole will be extrapolated. These districts will not conduct NDD.

- For awareness generation ASHAs will distribute leaflet on NDD during the last week of July to all households during Intensified Diarrhoea Control Fort night. Soft copies of the leaflets/ Posters/ Banners on NDD will be sent to the Districts for printing.
- IEC materials to be displayed in the school and community.
- Primary and Secondary School teachers to be oriented on NDD. (Focus --- Students to chew the tablet and then swallow).
- Parent -teacher meetings to be ensured in all the schools before NDD.
- The ANMs will supervise the schools in their area on the day of NDD.
- Sub-centre wise micro plan to be prepared and schools to be tagged with the nearest PHC/BPHC/RH/SDH/DH. The referral linkage to be shared with the schools. Contact number of the nearest health facility to be shared.
- Block and district level Rapid Response Team to be kept alert.
- Block and district level Monitoring teams to be deployed from 10th -13th August 2016.
- Control rooms to be set up in the BPHC/RH and district HQ.

PUBLIC HEALTH

- Water samples will be sent from hospitals of different tiers for testing in the nearest PHF lab or PHF accredited lab in every quarter. PHED may please provide adequate number of containers on requisition.
- Water Quality reports and the recommendation should come to the related office (Panchayet / Health) in non-technical terms so that everyone can understand. The report to be sent to the GP Office in Bengali also with important portions highlighted and with a suggestion for management.
- DHS & I.O. Secy. shared his observation regarding the Dengue outbreak going on South Dumdim Municipality area. The field workers working there were unable to identify the larvae of mosquitoes. It was decided that repeated training of the field workers will be arranged so that the new workers inducted in any round are trained up properly.
- MD NHM suggested to finalize chapters in the school books about Swine Flu, Malaria, Dengue etc. and to start some awareness generation activities on Dengue prevention during the prayer session at school.
- To respond to a query of Dr. Sibani Goswami of SUDA on hands on experience the students, it was mentioned that weekly premises cleaning rounds should be held in the school with active involvement of the students. The purpose would be to keep the premises clean and free from mosquito breeding.
- It was decided that IEC materials on AES will be prepared by PHF department for 5 districts as usual. the materials for the rest of the districts will be prepared by the Department of Health & Family Welfare.
- On being asked about the status of progress of water supply work in AES areas Dy. S I. of PHF answered that the work is ongoing. MD NHM asked for a report.

- It was decided that a letter will be written to the Municipal Affairs Department regarding testing of the quality of the pipeline drinking water. Water samples may be sent by the respective CLBs to the nearest PHH laboratory.
- The issue of issuing disability certificates in different format by different districts was also discussed. MD NHM stated that the latest formats will be shared.
- Dr. N Roy drew attention to the desirability of a nodal officer in the PHED for coordination of the activities between the PHED & Department of Health & Family Welfare for Fluorosis & Arsenicosis. MD NHM advised that a proposal for the same may be forwarded to the PHED.
- Regarding liquid food sample testing, Mr. Nirjhar Sur informed that they have only water testing facility.
- The newly prepared JJ Home Health Card was handed over to shri. Him.
- Shri. Subhrangshu Das informed that the Food & Supply Departmental Software is ready now and Dept. of Health & FW can access it with a password. Once the software is operational, the SRC discharged children will receive the food coupons during discharge within 15 days of discharge. MD NHM instructed that DADHS (CH) & IMSAM consultant will visit the F & S office to have a demonstration. MD NHM requested the WCD&SW for reorientation training on MUAC measurement of the AWWs.





১) অল্পের কৃষি কি ?

কৃষি একধরনের পরজীবী, যা মানুষের অস্ত্রে থাকে এবং সেখান থেকে খাদ্য সংগ্রহ করে। কৃষিরা মানুষের শরীরের দরকারি পুষ্টি শোষণ করে নেয়। এর ফলে মানুষের শরীরে রক্তচাপ, পুষ্টির অভাব এবং বৃদ্ধি বন্ধ হয়ে যেতে পারে।

২) শরীরে কৃষি থাকলে কি হতে পারে? শিশুদের কৃষিক্ষেত্র করা ছরুরী কেন ?

কৃষির সংক্রমণ শিশুর স্বাস্থ্য, পুষ্টি এবং শিক্ষার ক্ষেত্রে বাধার সৃষ্টি করে। কৃষি সংক্রমণের শিকার শিশুর অ্যানিমিয়া বা অপুষ্টির সমস্যা তৈরী হতে পারে-যা তার মানসিক এবং শারীরিক বৃদ্ধিতে বিরূপ প্রভাব ফেলতে পারে। অপুষ্টি এবং অ্যানিমিয়ার আক্রান্ত শিশুদের ওজন প্রায়শই কম হয় এবং বৃদ্ধিও বিধিমেত হয় না। যে সমস্ত শিশুরা গুরুতর সংক্রমণের শিকার তারা প্রায়শই খুবই অসুস্থ থাকে অথবা স্থলে যেতে পারে না বা স্থলে মনোসংযোগ করতে পারে না।

যে সমস্ত শিশুরা নিয়মিত কৃষির চিকিৎসা পায় :

- তারা স্বাস্থ্যবান হয় ।
- তারা স্থলে সক্রিয় থাকে , তাড়াতাড়ি শেখে এবং নিয়মিত স্থলে যায় ।
- তাদের রোগ প্রতিরোধ ক্ষমতা বেশী হয় ।

৩) সমস্ত শিশুকে দেখে অসুস্থ মনে না হলেও কেন সমস্ত শিশুর চিকিৎসা প্রয়োজন ?

কৃষির সংক্রমণের দীর্ঘমেয়াদি ফল শিশুর সার্বিক বিকাশ, শিক্ষা এবং স্বাস্থ্য ক্ষেত্রে দেখা যায়। শিশুরা দীর্ঘদিন ধরে কৃষি বহন করে চললেও অনেক সময় তাদের দেখে অসুস্থ মনে হয় না। কিন্তু তাদের যথাযথ ভাবে বৃদ্ধি হয় না এবং স্থলে ভাল ফল করতে পারে না। যেহেতু শিশুর দেখে কৃষি আছে কিনা, তা নির্ণয়ের পরীক্ষা অত্যন্ত ব্যয়বহুল এবং কৃষির ওষুধ কৃষিতে আক্রান্ত বা কৃষিহীন, উভয় শিশুর পক্ষেই নিরাপদ-তাই প্রত্যেক শিশুকে কৃষির চিকিৎসা করাটাই শ্রেয় ।

৪) শিশুদের কৃষির কি ধরনের চিকিৎসা প্রয়োজন ?

ভারত সরকার দ্বারা কৃষিক্ষেত্র ট্যাবলেট হিসাবে অ্যালবোভোজেল ট্যাবলেট খাওয়ানো হয়। এটি কৃষি চিকিৎসার একটি নিরাপদ উপায় এবং বিশ্ব স্বাস্থ্য সংস্থা (W.H.O) সারা বিশ্বে এর মান্যতা রয়েছে। ১-২ বছর বয়সী শিশুদের অর্ধেক (1/2) ট্যাবলেট গুলো করে জলে গুলে খাওয়ানো, ২-এর বেশী থেকে ১৯ বছর বয়সী শিশুদের একটি ট্যাবলেট (৪০০ এমজি.) খাওয়ানোর সুপারিশ করা হচ্ছে।

৫) কৃষি চিকিৎসার কি কোন পার্শ্বপ্রতিক্রিয়া রয়েছে ?


অ্যালবোভোজেল ট্যাবলেট সম্পূর্ণ নিরাপদ। কিছু ক্ষেত্রে খুব অল্প পার্শ্বপ্রতিক্রিয়া দেখা দিতে পারে। যেমন মাথাব্যথা, মাথাব্যথা, বমিবমি ভাব অথবা বমি হতে পারে। এগুলি হয় কারণ ওষুধের প্রভাবে কৃষি শিশুর শরীর থেকে বার হতে থাকে। এই পার্শ্বপ্রতিক্রিয়া গুলি কিছুক্ষণের মধ্যেই ঠিক হয়ে যায়। যে সমস্ত শিশুরা গুরুতর কৃষি সংক্রমণের শিকার তাদের দেহেই মূলতঃ এই পার্শ্বপ্রতিক্রিয়া গুলি দেখা যায়।

এই পার্শ্বপ্রতিক্রিয়া সাময়িক। সাধারণত ৫-৭ ঘণ্টা পর এগুলো কমে যায়। যদি তারপরও পার্শ্বপ্রতিক্রিয়া থাকে তাহলে সম্ভবত তা অন্য কারণে হয়েছে। এই শিশুকে নিকটবর্তী স্বাস্থ্যকেন্দ্রে নিয়ে যাবার দরকার।





Issues discussed and the resolutions taken.

Implementation of National De-worming Day (NDD)

1. **Objective of National De-worming Day (NDD):** To de-worm all pre-school and school age children (1-19 years of age) in order to improve their overall health, nutrition status and quality of life.
2. **Date of NDD & MUD in 2016:** In our state the **National De-worming Day (NDD)** will be observed on 09/03/2016 and the **Mop up Day (MUD)** on 15/03/2016.
3. **Target beneficiary of NDD in 2016:**
 - i. All Children in age group 6-19 years, with the exception of Bankura, Birbhum, Murshidabad, Purulia and Bardhaman districts, who had conducted MDA in December 2015.
 - ii. All the children of 1-5 years age in all the 28 districts (including HDs) were covered in the Vitamin A Supplementation Programme during December 2015 round and will be excluded from the March 2016 round of NDD.
 - iii. Hence, **the target age group for the March 2016 round of NDD is the 6 years to 19 years children who are enrolled in Government, Government-aided School and Private Schools and out of School children and adolescents, excepting Bankura, Birbhum, Murshidabad, Purulia and Bardhaman districts.**
4. **Data requirement:**
 - i. The School Education Department will provide the recent data of class I to class 12 students in govt, govt aided and non-government schools.
 - ii. Sarba Siksha Mission (SSK) will provide the recent data of class I to class 12 students in private schools, and out of school children.

- iii. The names of the Juvenile Destitute Homes (Govt & NGO run), the name of the Superintendent with his contact details and number of children present in home will be provided by Department of WCD & SW.
- iv. There are also around 15 homes for street children in Kolkata and list of those homes and children will be provided by the Sarba Siksha Mission, Kolkata.

5. **Albendazole tablet provider on NDD & MUD:**

- i. In the Schools the School Teacher will be responsible to administer the Albendazole tablets under direct supervision.
- ii. Children of juvenile homes (both Govt and NGO run) will be covered by the respective jurisdiction in a planned manner by the health personnel.
- iii. The ASHAs will administer medicine to the out of school children of her area.
- iv. The children of the 15 Sarba Siksha Mission (SSM) home in Kolkata (meant for the 1500 street children), will be covered following a micro plan drawn up jointly by the DFWD, Kolkata and the SSM, Kolkata.

6. **The drug - Albendazole-400 mg:**

- i. The fund from the state has already been sent to the CMOHs/DFWO-Kolkata for procurement of Albendazole.
- ii. The district health department will arrange the tablets to reach all the Schools/ ASHAs or other places through the health departments' infrastructure. *It is suggested that the tablets, reporting formats and the IEC materials be handed over to the end units at the respective training venue at the end of the training sessions.*
- iii. The Officers of different stakeholder departments will supervise and monitor the whole NDD & MUD in their jurisdictions.

7. **IEC/ BCC:**

- i. Different formats and IEC materials will be printed at the district and CMOHs and DFWD of Kolkata will send those along with the Albendazole tablets to the BMOHs/ ACMOHs etc for distribution and display as per their micro-plan.
- ii. The School Education Department will provide the C.D. containing the name and mobile number of school headmasters for sending bulk SMS to the headmasters for NDD.

8. **Training:**

- i. For the Municipality and Corporation areas, the CMOH (DFWD for Kolkata) will organise and conduct half day training programme on NDD to the drug administrators and the D.I. of schools will invite and ensure the teachers attend the training of NDD and implementation of the NDD programme.
- ii. BMOH will organise and conduct half day training programme on NDD and the D.I. of schools will invite the teachers to attend the training of NDD and implementation of the NDD programme.

9. **NDD Kit:**

- i. Albendazole tab, IEC materials, FAQs and Dos & Don'ts as a kit for NDD will be supplied by Health & Family Welfare Dept to the schools and ASHAs.

10. Administrative actions:

- i. The health department will issue a formal letter to all the stakeholder departments.
- ii. An official letter will be send to SUDA for involvement of FTS / HIW in municipality area.
- iii. The School Education Department will issue an order to the districts.
- iv. For both the Government and Private schools, the District Magistrate will write a letter to the private school authorities and will make Block-wise / ULB-wise small teams with his machinery that will supervise and monitor the NDD activities specially in the private schools.
- v. There will be a separate state level meeting with KMC officials regarding NDD activity in the KMC.

ISSUES DICUSSED:

Implementation of Weekly Iron & Folic Acid Supplementation Programme to cover out of school adolescent girls in Non SABLA districts:

- Health Department has already started to distribute IFA in SABLA districts for Out of School Adolescent Girls. Now this program is to be implemented among the out of School adolescent girls in Non SABLA district also.
- Identification of targeted beneficiaries of out of school children under WIFS is to be done.
- Decision needs to be taken, if incentive may be given to the Anganwadi Workers for feeding IFA to out of school adolescent girls. The amount of incentive may be fixed by the WCD &SW Department.
- It was proposed by the Director of CINI that link workers may be involved to distribute IFA in each village of West Bengal to cover out of schools adolescent girls.
- Online reporting format of WIFS will be implemented soon.
- Deworming in Primary School may be initiated.
- Prophylactic supplementation of IFA is needed to be streamlined in JJ Homes.

MUAC distribution to AWCs

- MUAC tapes will be distributed to all AWCs once UNICEF supplies the tapes to the Dept of H&FW.

Distribution plan of Sanitary Napkin under Menstrual Health Scheme

- Proposal was placed to supply free sanitary napkin for the adolescent girls of JJ Home.
- The scheme for reaching sanitary napkins to adolescent girls under NHM is in the final stages of preparation before launching.

Expansion of Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram Program

- Identification of institutions needs to be expedited for treatment of correctible deformity/disability i.e for surgery of congenital cataract, Glaucoma, Vision impairment, Locomotor disability, Visions correction by providing spectacles.
- It was proposed by the Secretary, School Education Department to make a provision for Medicine box / First aid box for each and every school containing with common medicine, thermometers etc.
- Information about RBSK and the activities of Mobile Health Team Flex, posters may be displayed in schools, AWCs, Sub centres, Gram Panchayats and PHCs.

Disability Certification

- A protocol for disability certification may be formed by the Director of Health Services. The disability may be identified by Mobile health Team RBSK from Schools and AWCs which will be referred to Block facilities. Block facilities will decide whether the disability is correctible or permanent. Correctible disability may be treated by providing suitable appliances, which may be provided by the WCD&SW Dept. Disability certification may be done at Block level.


- As peer educators are the key agent to deal with adolescent group, so training of Peer educator is a primary necessity for smooth implementation of RKSK. Child In Need Institution (CINI) has been chosen as the National Training Partner for RKSK in North eastern State and West Bengal.
- It was proposed by the Secretary, WCD&SW department that Convergence with Kanyashree and SABLA may be done for the identifying Peer Educators.
- Assistant Director of CINI Adolescent resource explained the components and work strategy of RKSK.
- Importance of strategic partnership to roll out the RKSK programme was discussed.
- It was advised by the Secretary, WCD&SW Department to use Kanyashree club for adolescent group where they can discuss about their problems and also they can share different information to each other.

Public Health issue (Water supply and Sanitation)

- PHE department has been requested to provide a consolidated report of their survey findings of drinking water sources in the villages affected with non JE, AES (A list of villages affected in 2014 was sent to PHE dept earlier)
- PHE Dept was also requested to take a stock of the action taken by them in response to survey findings and share the same with H & FW Dept
- Regarding the list of accredited laboratories for water quality testing the PHE Dept representative informed that such list and lab wise allocation of block available in the departmental website
- Addl Chief Secretary H& FW asked the PHE Dept to ensure sample test of Hospital Water for screening the Coliform and turbidity level of drinking water.
- Secretary WCD & SW also stated that although mentioned in GOI letter, no fund yet not received by the dept, for additional nutritional supplementation in JE endemic districts.

Health check-up for JJ Homes and victims of Sex trafficking

- The Secretary, WCD&SW Department thanked Health Department for taking action for health check-up of inmates of the NGO run Homes and for the victims of Sex trafficking.
- An orientation for Anvesha counsellors regarding sex trafficking may be planned with a comprehensive module.
- The necessity for Physical and Psychological treatment of the victims under POCSO Act was elaborated on by the Secretary, WCD& SW.
- It was proposed that the Home visit may be done by the non-service doctors, on payment of an honorarium.
