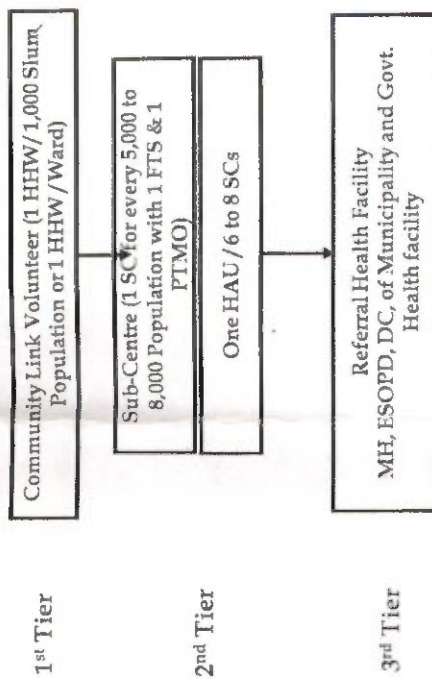

- ◆ Fortnightly home visit by Honorary Health Worker (HHW) engaged from community :
  - Awareness on women and child Health, sexuality, gender equality, age at marriage/pregnancy etc.
  - Treatment of minor ailments at door-step of the beneficiaries
  - Early registration of pregnancies, pregnancy care, nutritional care and identification of danger signs during pregnancy
  - Counseling for breast-feeding, weaning and immunizations
  - Distribution of condoms, oral contraceptive pills, IFA, ORS etc.

## Activities

- Second Tier :**
- Provide clinic services from Urban Sub-Centre covering 5000 to 8000 population. Each Sub-Centre is manned by First Tier Supervisor (FTS) daily and part-time Medical Officer on clinic days
- Provide Clinic base services for ANC / PNC, Immunisation, Growth Monitoring, General Treatment

## **Dissemination meeting on NUHM RoP for FY 2013-14**

A dissemination meeting on NUHM RoP for FY 2013-14 was held at SUDA Conference Hall at 11 a.m. with five Municipal Corporations (i.e. Asansol, Durgapur, Chandernagore, Howrah & Siliguri) and at 2.00 p.m. with 26 Municipalities.

The meeting was facilitated by Department of Health & Family Welfare. MD, NHM talk about general aspect of NUHM and AMD, NHM gave a power point presentation on detailed structure of NUHM followed by question-answer session.

Representatives of all the five Municipal Corporations and 25 Municipalities (except Hooghly Chinsurah) were present in the meeting.

Other participants were Jt. Secretary, Dept. of Municipal Affairs; other officials of DHFW; CMOHs of districts; officials of Health Wing, SUDA.

### **Salient points of the discussion :**

- Fund for NUHM for five Municipal Corporations will be routed from State Health Samity to SUDA for onward transmission to the Corporations.
- Fund for NUHM for Kolkata Municipal Corporation will be routed directly from State Health Samity to KMC.
- Fund for NUHM for 26 Municipalities will be routed from State Health Samity to District Health Samiti for onward transmission to the Municipalities.

### **Immediate activities to be undertaken by the Corporations :**

- MOU are to be signed between each five Municipal Corporations and SUDA separately.
- Formation of City Urban Health Society by five Municipal Corporations and registered under Society Registration Act.
- A separate Bank A/C is to be opened by each of the said City Urban Health Society.
- Preparation of estimate for renovation of already identified UPHCS by the Corporations and submission to SUDA.
- Line listing of approved UPHCs to be constructed under NUHM (New construction)
- Formation of Rogi Kalyan Samity (RKS) by the Corporations.

### **Immediate activities to be undertaken by the Municipalities :**

- Line listing of approved UPHCs to be constructed under NUHM (New construction)
- Line listing of approved UPHCs to be renovated under NUHM and preparation of estimate and submission to District Health Samity.
- Identification of sites (SC, AWCs) where outreach will be done.
- Line listing of AWCs and other sites where UHNDs will be done.

**Land to be provided free of cost by ULB/State government, where the approved new constructions will be done.**

## NUHM Programme Implementation Plan (PIP) for the year 2013-14

- NUHM Programme Implementation Plan (PIP) for the year 2013-14 has been approved by Govt. of India for an amount of Rs. 14.50 Crore and Rs. 45.04 Crore for Kolkata Municipal Corporation and 31 ULBs (rest 5 Municipal Corporations and 26 Municipalities) respectively.
- **Fund flow mechanism as approved by Govt. of India :**
  - State Health Society (SHS) of DHFW will release fund to Urban Health Society / District Health Society.
  - SHS will sign MOU with City Health Mission / Society.
  - As SUDA is not involved in fund flow mechanism, role of SUDA in day to day activities of implementing NUHM at ULB level may be clearly spelt out.
- **Recruitment of manpower (after Parliament Election) :**

  - Who will be appointing Authority ?
  - Implication of EPF & Gratuity shall be taken into account and source of funding may be spelt out.
- Formation of City NUHM Health Society in Municipal Corporations

  - ✓ Location of UPHCS - ULBs to identify and intimate to SUDA in case of Corporations (excepting KMC) and to the respective CMOHs in case of Municipalities

## **Dissemination meeting on NUHM RoP for FY 2013-14**

A dissemination meeting on NUHM RoP for FY 2013-14 was held at SUDA Conference Hall at 11 a.m. with five Municipal Corporations (i.e. Asansol, Durgapur, Chandernagore, Howrah & Siliguri) and at 2.00 p.m. with 26 Municipalities.

The meeting was facilitated by Department of Health & Family Welfare. MD, NHM talk about general aspect of NUHM and AMD, NHM gave a power point presentation on detailed structure of NUHM followed by question-answer session.

Representatives of all the five Municipal Corporations and 25 Municipalities (except Hooghly Chinsurah) were present in the meeting.

Other participants were Jt. Secretary, Dept. of Municipal Affairs; other officials of DHFW; CMOHs of districts; officials of Health Wing, SUDA.

### **Salient points of the discussion :**

- Fund for NUHM for five Municipal Corporations will be routed from State Health Samity to SUDA for onward transmission to the Corporations.
- Fund for NUHM for Kolkata Municipal Corporation will be routed directly from State Health Samity to KMC.
- Fund for NUHM for 26 Municipalities will be routed from State Health Samity to District Health Samiti for onward transmission to the Municipalities.

### **Immediate activities to be undertaken by the Corporations :**

- MOU are to be signed between each five Municipal Corporations and SUDA separately.
- Formation of City Urban Health Society by five Municipal Corporations and registered under Society Registration Act.
- A separate Bank A/C is to be opened by each of the said City Urban Health Society.
- Preparation of estimate for renovation of already identified UPHCS by the Corporations and submission to SUDA.
- Line listing of approved UPHCs to be constructed under NUHM (New construction)
- Formation of Rogi Kalyan Samity (RKS) by the Corporations.

### **Immediate activities to be undertaken by the Municipalities :**

- Line listing of approved UPHCs to be constructed under NUHM (New construction)
- Line listing of approved UPHCs to be renovated under NUHM and preparation of estimate and submission to District Health Samity.
- Identification of sites (SC, AWCs) where outreach will be done.
- Line listing of AWCs and other sites where UHNDs will be done.

**Land to be provided free of cost by ULB/State government, where the approved new constructions will be done.**



## **NUHM Programme Implementation Plan (PIP) for the year 2013-14**

- NUHM Programme Implementation Plan (PIP) for the year 2013-14 has been approved by Govt. of India for an amount of Rs. 14.50 Crore and Rs. 45.04 Crore for Kolkata Municipal Corporation and 31 ULBs (rest 5 Municipal Corporations and 26 Municipalities) respectively.
- **Fund flow mechanism as approved by Govt. of India :**
  - State Health Society (SHS) of DHFW will release fund to Urban Health Society / District Health Society.
  - SHS will sign MOU with City Health Mission / Society.
  - As SUDA is not involved in fund flow mechanism, role of SUDA in day to day activities of implementing NUHM at ULB level may be clearly spelt out.
- **Recruitment of manpower (after Parliament Election) :**

### 3 - Tier Service Delivery Model



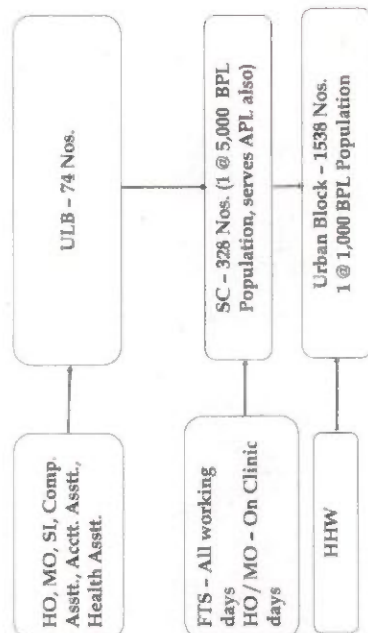

4. ASHA - ASHAs may be engaged as per the norm of one ASHA for 200-500 households in slums. ASHA would serve as an effective and demand-generating link between the health facility and the urban slum population. However, in the meeting it is decided that we will not engage ASHA in our state; instead we will entrust the job on First Tine Supervisors (FTS) and Honorary Health Worker (HHW). The modalities of utilising FTS and HHW will be worked out jointly by the Department of Health and SUDA.
5. Notification by the department of H&FW for NUHM will be soon.
6. The NUHM would promote active participation of the ULBs in the planning and management of the urban health programmes. In Kolkata the NUHM would be implemented through the City Urban Health Society. In other cities/ towns, NUHM will be implemented through the District Health Society.
7. The Director SUDA will write to the Mayor/Chairman for taking initiative for implementation of NUHM.
8. The Commissioner Kolkata Metropolitan Corporation (KMC) will be requested to form the City level Urban Health Society as per the guide line of GOI.
9. The State Family Welfare Officer (SFWO) will write to the CMOHs of all districts to provide data for morbidity profile of their district as required by the ULBs. CMOHs will also be requested to provide support to the concern Corporation/ULBs in preparation of their PIP under NUHM for 2013-14. The DPC, DSM and DAM will assist the ULBs in preparation of their PIP.
10. Follow up meeting for preparation of PIP will be held on 31.07.2013 at Kolkata Municipal Corporation and on 02.07.2013 at SUDA, West Bengal for Siliguri, Asansol, Durgapur, Chandannagar and Howrah Municipal Corporation.

With the self introduction of the participants, Dr Ajay Bhattacharya had introduced the HUP, PFI India team before the house, who came from Delhi to provide technical support for preparing the State PIP under NUHM. The team came to provide technical support as per the instruction of Jt. Secretary, GOI, in response to our request. Dr Ajay Bhattacharya described what we need to do under NUHM in respect to current Urban health status in West Bengal. He also shared his views, described the strategies for implementation of NUHM in our state according to the guide line suggested by the GOI. After a long discussion the house agreed on the following points:

1. The State PIP will have to be submitted by 15 August 2013 as per the guideline of GOI. To submit it by 15 August 2013, the Corporation will submit their PIP to the state by 10 August 2013.
2. As per instruction of CFW list of Govt. health institutions fall within the selected ULBs will have to be sent to SUDA for onward transmission to the selected Municipal corporations.
3. As per GOI suggestion the ANM will go for outreach from the Urban Primary Health Centre (UPHC) and there will be no Sub-centre. The house decided that as for Urban Health delivery in our state, there is Sub-Centre/Ward Health Unit, these will be continued as before. The

ANM will provide service from Sub centre, under supervision of PHN/MO of the respective UPHC. There will be a sector concept.

4. ASHA - ASHAs may be engaged as per the norm of one ASHA for 200-500 households in slums. ASHA would serve as an effective and demand-generating link between the health facility and the urban slum population. However, in the meeting it is decided that we will not engage ASHA in our state; instead we will entrust the job on First Tine Supervisors (FTS) and Honorary Health Worker (HHW). The modalities of utilising FTS and HHW will be worked out jointly by the Department of Health and SUDA.
5. Notification by the department of H&FW for NUHM will be soon.
6. The NUHM would promote active participation of the ULBs in the planning and management of the urban health programmes. In Kolkata the NUHM would be implemented through the City Urban Health Society. In other cities/ towns, NUHM will be implemented through the District Health Society.
7. The Director SUDA will write to the Mayor/Chairman for taking initiative for implementation of NUHM.


