Sub.: Training of Health Officers, Asstt. Health Officers & Medical Officers on Public Health Management under Health component of KUSP.

Community Based Health Programmes are being implemented by each of the 125 ULBs in the state of West Bengal, with the objective of improving health status of poor people by reducing morbidity, mortality and fertility amongst the population particularly urban poor through delivery of primary health care services at door- step level by HHWs and at sub-centre level by the medical professionals, addressing public health care initiatives and implementing National Health Programmes.

In order to deliver such services qualitatively and effectively, the service providers i.e. Health Officers, Asstt. Health Officers & Medical Officers who are associated with planning, implementing, monitoring and supervising need to update their technical skill and to improve managerial capacity. One of the important objectives of KUSP is capacity building of the ULBs. The capacity building is required to improve the competencies of Health Officers and Assistant Health Officers and Medical Officers to take on public health & managerial responsibilities and in turn improve the overall management of health care delivery services. In earlier occasion training of Health Officer and Asstt. Health Officer in public health had been organized for 40 KMA and 22 Non-KMA ULBs by All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health (AIIH&PH) wherein Dr. D.K.Raut, Prof. & Head of Dept. of Epidemiology was the course Co-ordinator. The training was held in 3 batches, one in Maulana Azad Medical College, Delhi; the 2nd one at Institute of Health Management & Research, Jaipur: and 3rd at National Tuberculosis, Bangalore. The said course was highly appreciated by the participants. Hence, Dr. D.K. Raut, Prof. of Public Health, Dept. of Community Medicine, Vardhman Mahavir Medical College and Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi was further contacted by the undersigned for proposed training workshop. Accordingly, Dr. Raut has submitted proposal and budget for such training (copy enclosed at C/P-1).

The key issues to be covered in the training programme are as under:

- * Evolution and framework of health policies in India, Health Care Delivery System in India and Public Health standards.
- Explain the Principals of Epidemiology with respect to management of Public Health programmes.
- * Describe surveillance and monitoring of diseases, steps in epidemic investigation and methods for its prevention & control.
- * Explain the components of important National Health Programmes for its implementation and management.
- Develop managerial skills for effective planning, implementation and evaluation of Public Health issues, National Health Programmes and others.



* Explain the diseases surveillance & monitoring to improve health management information system to monitor, evaluate and control disease occurrence in the municipal area.

It is felt that a residential course outside the State of West Bengal would result in uninterrupted, cohesive and interactive training utilizing cross sharing with the participants of other ULBs, Public Health Institutes, Medical Colleges of other states in planning, implementing and monitoring of Public Health Programmes. From previous training programme it is experienced that the participants would utilize the time beyond schedule class doing group exercises, discussions, preparation of presentations.

Each batch will consist of 25 nos. of participants (approx.), to be facilitated by 5 nos. of outstation Experts, 5 nos. of local Experts both in class room and field sessions. Duration of training will be for 5 days excluding both way journey. Estimated total no. of participants – 80 in KMA ULBs and 85 in non-KMA ULBs out of which 22 are in position. (63 ULBs are yet to engage HO).

The tentative Budget estimate (enclosed at C/P-2) as indicated is Rs.472500/- (Rupees four lakhs seventy two thousand five hundred) i.e approximately Rs.18,900/- per participant for 5 days training.

In this connection it is to state that there will be no difference in the budget estimate for such training programme within the State excepting TA of the medical professionals.

TRAINING ON PUBLIC HEALTH MANAGEMENT FOR HEALTH OFFICERS/ASSISTANT HEALTH OFFICERS OF WEST BENGAL

Introduction:

By the year 2000, about half of the global human population had become urban citizens, most of them living in the rapidly growing cities of Africa, Asia and Latin America. Living in an urban area does not mean "development" for many of these people. In most cases a majority live in "poverty", characterised by household and environmental deprivation and in circumstances of extreme social and economic stress. The attainment by all urban citizens of the highest possible level of health through the strengthening of urban health systems is therefore an important challenge, and a crucial element in the struggle against poverty, underdevelopment and political instability.

Cities offer the lure of better employment, education, health care, and culture; and they contribute disproportionately to national economies. However, rapid and often unplanned urban growth is often associated with poverty, environmental degradation and population demands that outstrip service capacity. These conditions place human health at risk. Reliable urban health statistics are largely unavailable in India and disaggregated intra-urban health data, i.e., for different areas within a city, are even more rare. However, data that are available indicate a range of urban health hazards and associated health risks: substandard housing, over crowding, air pollution, insufficient or contaminated drinking water, inadequate sanitation and solid waste disposal services, vector-borne diseases, industrial waste, increased motor vehicle traffic, stress associated with poverty and unemployment, among others.

Urbanization is rapidly spreading throughout the country and especially in big metro cities like Kolkata. An urban slum poses special health problems due to poverty, overcrowding, unhygienic surroundings and lack of an organized health Infrastructure and well managed public health services.

Public health initiatives in developing countries often fail not because of a lack of scientific knowledge but because of a lack of managerial competence. Most training programs follow categorical funding and have a narrow focus on a particular disease or problem. Emphasis usually is placed on prescriptive management procedures oriented toward technical protocols designed by external experts (e.g., family planning logistics, vaccine cold chain maintenance, treatment protocols, agricultural protocols, infrastructure models). A successful program should equip frontline managers with crosscutting skills in priority setting, planning, and problem solving.²

Lack of management skills among the public workforce has been exacerbated in recent years by the global trend toward decentralization of services. In many countries, decentralization has occurred abruptly and without the benefit of planning for developing

the management capacity of the local public workforce to assume their new roles and responsibilities. 3.5

Public health encompasses multi-sector interventions. To maximize the development impact of health outcomes in urban areas, comprehensive and concerted effort is required to (i) expand access to urban primary health care services; (ii) strengthen municipal public health governance (including institutions, policy, legal and regulatory frameworks, and financial capacity); and (iii) strengthen food and water safety, and improve management of solid waste, including hospital waste. Key issues are the multi-sector nature of public health in an increasingly complex urban physical space; prioritization of investments that balance preventive, promotive and health care needs of the urban poor; and ensuring a strong institutional, policy, legal and regulatory environment for enforcing good public health practices and building on the strengths of the private sector. Apart from institutional and financial issues, trained health care providers are important for sustaining the urban primary health care initiatives.

Urban Health Improvement Programme in West Bengal

In recent years areas in and around Kolkata have seen a tremendous increase in population, initially in the form of migration and later as increased industrial growth attracted people from neighbouring states looking for work. This led to the establishment of a large number of slums in these areas, bringing with it social problems such as poverty and illiteracy and health issues due to unhygienic conditions. Those most affected were women and children. To address these issues, the Health Department of the Government of West Bengal requested the Kolkata Municipal Development Authority (KMDA) to take up urban health services along with its other developmental activities.

Community based health programmes e.g. Calcutta Urban Development Programme – III or CUDP-III (between 1984 and 1992), Calcutta Slum Improvement Programme or CSIP (1992-98), India Population Project - VIII or IPP-VIII* (1994-2002) were initiated. Most recently the Urban Health Improvement Programme (UHIP) is functional since July 2002, to help set up necessary infrastructure to provide Reproductive and Child Health (RCH) services in the KMDA area.

The main features of the system were:

- (i) Honorary Health Workers (HHWs) who work as link workers and are the first point of contact between the public and the health system.
- (ii) Sub centres form the next level and are established for every five blocks. Five HHWs report to the supervisor (usually an upgraded HHW) who is based at the sub centre. Two part-time medical officers and the first-tier supervisor based here provide basic primary health care services including antenatal and post natal care, immunisation of children and family planning services. They also organise periodic meetings for parents.
- (iii) The Health Administrative Unit (HAU) has 6 or 7 Sub centres under it. One sub centre is located at the HAU building. A HAU is manned by a health officer, assistant

health officer, part-time medical officer and second-tier supervisor. The HAUs ensure procurement of drugs, storage and distribution.

(iv) The next level is the Extended Specialised Outpatient Department (ESOPD) serving a population of 200,000 and offering specialist services and charging user fees. For more details see Documents and Illustrations below. In addition, a Regional Diagnostic Centre (RDC) has also been set up for a population of 400,000 providing services such as x-rays, ultra-sonography and other pathological tests. Here again user fees are levied at differential rates for those above and below the poverty line, but charges are slightly lower than the prevalent market rates as the RDC competes with other private diagnostic centers. Under the European Commission-assisted Urban Health Improvement Programme (UHIP), six municipalities were identified as pilot areas in order to integrate the existing health delivery system with other parallel departments and programmes.

The health infrastructure of Kolkata Urban Municipal areas started in 1985 as World Bank aided project "Calcutta Urban Development Project" in which one honorary health worker was recruited per hundred families to provide emergency primary medical care and used to pay home to home visit for awareness generation for prevention and control of diseases. World Health Organization evaluated the programme during 1990-91 & recommended establishment of one sub-centre for each 5000 population where there would be 5 honorary health workers- each looking after 1000 population- and one part-time medical officer to provide curative and preventive services. It was also recommended to set up specialized OPD's in these sub-centres and Municipal Maternity Homes for promoting Institutional Delivery. In World Bank aided IPP-VIII programme these curative and preventive services were extended to whole of the Calcutta Metropolitan Development Authority (CMDA) area covering a population of around 38 lakhs. The DFID had also recommended similar programmes to be instituted in 15 wards of Kolkata Municipal Corporation area in a participatory approach.

Presently under Kolkata urban services for the poor (KUSP), there is a plan to extend these programme in Kolkata Municipal Corporation areas and 40 adjoining municipalities. It is also a plan to extend this programme to another 21 municipalities through-out the state of West Bengal.

To extend the services to this vast number of population, it is important to augment the capacity of the municipal health infrastructure. It is also necessary to increase the knowledge among health officers of the municipal bodies regarding primary health care, Epidemiology, planning and management of health programmes.

The proposal on training workshop aims to improve the capacity of the municipal health officer and update their knowledge regarding the practice of community health and develop the appropriate epidemiological and managerial skills for its practical application.

Justification for Training of Health Officers and Assistant Health Officers:

West Bengal has been successful at reducing poverty in recent decades, with the proportion of people below poverty line falling from 55% in 1983 to 36% in 1993-94. These figures are close to the National average, but leaving 25 million people in poverty. Govt. of West Bengal currently developing a comprehensive health sector strategy and operational plans for the state. Through the proposed Health Services development Initiative (HSDI), it is envisaged to improve health status of poor people in West Bengal through enhanced and equitable utilization of quality health services.

The necessary funding for this programme is provided by DFID to implement "Kolkata Urban Services for the Poor" (KUSP). One of the important components under KUSP is to make available and accessible health services to the urban poor. Therefore it is proposed to conduct the training workshop for the health officers of municipality and corporation to build their capacity and strengthen their skills for providing necessary medical care to poor sections of the population and plan, manage and implement important National Public health programme in all the urban areas.

Aim of the Training workshop:

To improve the competencies of Health Officers and Assistant Health Officers to take on public health & managerial responsibilities and in turn improve the overall management of health care delivery services.






