### Report on visit to Dhuliyan Municipality

As per instruction of Secretary, Dept. of Municipal Affairs vide no. 1152/1(6)-S/09 dt. 14.11.2009, the undersigned visited Dhuliyan Municipality on 23.12.2009.

The undersigned met the Chairman, staff of M & S Cell, HHWs and discussed on Health programmes, visited all the five Sub-Centres, talked with bidi workers in five slums.

The following discussions were held and actions / decisions arrived at:

Items of discussion	Actions/ Decisions arrived at
Functioning of Sub-cenres:	
General Treatment Clinic Though five sub—centres have been identified but not yet made functional. To run one General Treatment clinic per week per SC, it needs more than one doctor (other than Health Officer) in position. The ULB is entitled to get one Medical Officer as per guideline in addition to Health Officer. The ULB could not yet engage MO as it is felt that the remuneration is low to get a doctor.	However, the ULB would put all out efforts to engage MO by 1 <sup>st</sup> week of January, 2010. Health Officer will prepare and send date- wise clinic schedule for all the five Sub-Centres to SUDA by 04.01.2010
Immunisation Clinic One BPHC of Health Department is functioning within the Municipal area where one Immunisation clinic is being held once in a week, this service could not be availed by the total population of the ULB due to distant location. Routine Immunisation Clinic from Sub-Centres could not be started by the ULB as there is need for hiring services of vaccinator, which is not available in the town.	The ULB would put all out efforts to identify and hire service of at least one vaccinator by 1 <sup>st</sup> week of January, 2010  Alternative approach would be explored- to impart hands-on training of 25 days duration to the FTSs at Nursing Training School, Murshidabad to create vaccinators. #### Tour notes on Dhulian

Accompanied the MIC to Dhulian on 12.11.2009, when the MIC kindly decided on the following issues:

- Director SUDA and Health expert of SUDA (i.e. Dr. Sibani Goswami) will visit the Dhulian municipality within next two weeks to particularly advise the municipality on schematic actions to be taken with regard to health of Biri workers in particular.
  - 2) Project Director, KiJSP may be approached by Dr. Sibani Goswami to particularly find out whether new sub-centres and / or new schemes for the above could be evolved from out of innovative challenge fund. Alternatively, Dr. Goswami may also approach the Special Secretary (Debesis Mitra) for suitable funding in this regard.
- Director, SUDA will also ensure early release of revolving funds in favour of the reported 190 TCGs that have been formed in Dhulian.
- 4) Director, SUDA will also ensure credit linkages and bank loan facilities towards self employment of the urban poor and will particularly explore whether a micro-market could be established in Dhulian.
  - 5) If the Dhulian Municipality can send an integrated proposal for upgradation / construction of a burial ground, then such projects may be considered by Joint Secretary, Asok Kr. Patra in the department.
  - 6) Some allotment could be considered for SWM land also if a comprehensive proposal comes.
  - 7) A scheme for drainage may be formulated by the municipality with the help of MED in the long run.

MIC may visit Dhulian municipality within a month again to review the progress of works.
