

Resolution of STFI meeting with Dept of Health & FW

The meeting of State Task Force on Immunization was held on 3/1/2018 at Swasthya Bhawan to discuss issues relating to IMI(Intensified Mission Indradhanush), NID(National immunization Day)2018,Routine immunisation activities, MR(Measles Rubella ) campaign and AEFI surveillance in presence of The Principal Secretary H&FW Dept., Advisor H&FW,MD NHM,DHS,ADHS(EPI),State CCO. Representative from SUDA, SRTL NPSP, Health officer UNICEF, Dy. CMHO KMC, Dept of ICDS, IAP, also participated in the meeting.

After reviewing the performance of the ULBS in the last IMI round of Nov-Dec 2017 in North 24 pgs , the following observations and decisions were made;

1. The next IMI round is from 7-14th January 2018 to held in NPG .As regards to preparation of microplan and submission to the district, it is reported that the 3 mpls namely Habra, Panihati, New Bkp till date are yet to submit the microplan to the district. MD NHM was requested to look into the matter.
2. Due list submitted by the mpls have been computerised by the district.
3. IEC activities as regards to IMI in the mpls is satisfactory but needs to be strengthened by auto miking, tablos which would be provided by the district.
4. It was suggested by the Principal Secretary, Health & Family Welfare Department that PHNs and BPHNs from the blocks to be attached to the mpls during IMI sessions for training and monitoring of immunisation activities.
5. A training on orientation of vaccinators and Medical officers of the ULBS of NPG district to be conducted by the District HFW. SUDA was requested to send the list of trainees to SFWO for organising training.
6. Sample survey of immunisation coverage and drop outs was proposed to be conducted by UNICEF at the ULB level.
7. The next NID session to be held on 28/1/2018 in all ULBs for the U-5 children.
8. M-R campaign was proposed to be started in the month of Feb 2018 in the ULBs for all the 9 months-15 years old children.

- Social Welfare Department: Engagement of AWW as needed.  
Instruct the CDPO to extend his co-operation as needed by the district.
- School & Education Department : IEC may be done through the students
- Line listing of suspects should be done properly.
- IEC Prototype should be circulated
- NGO may be engaged for the covering up the gap of male health worker.
- CHG (Community Health Guide) , must be engaged as **Male Volunteer**
- Control Room activity: Reports from the LCDC districts should be compiled at the State Level Control Room during the activity.
- The camps for examining the suspects must be well planned.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to say that Mission Indradhanush is a flagship programme of Government of India, which aims at increasing the full immunization coverage of children across the country. Hon'ble Prime Minister has directed Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) to reach the target of 90% full immunization coverage by December 2018 instead of earlier set date of 2020, with focus on selected districts and urban areas coupled with increased convergence with other Ministries. - (iii). Specific directions to big municipal corporations for



Dear DS,

Mission Indradhanush is a flagship programme of Govt. of India which aims at increasing the full immunization coverage of children across the country. Launched in December 2014, the efforts under Mission Indradhanush have accelerated the increase in full immunization coverage from 1% per year to around 7% per year.

In the PRAGATI review meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2017, Hon'ble Prime Minister has directed MoHFW to reach the target of 90% full immunization coverage by December 2018 instead of earlier set date of 2020, with focus on selected districts and urban areas coupled with increased convergence with other ministries.

In this regard, MoHFW has identified 118 districts, 17 urban areas and 52 districts of North East states where Intensified Mission Indradhanush will be carried out from October'2017 (list enclosed at Annexure-1).

Cabinet Secretary also chaired a meeting on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2017 with the concerned Ministries of Government of India regarding the inter-ministerial co-ordinated actions for Intensified Mission Indradhanush.



**Subject: Establishment of Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC) for Mission Indradhanush**

Mission Indradhanush was launched to increase full immunization coverage of 90% by 2020. Hon'ble Prime Minister of India has directed that the objective of 90% full immunization coverage is to be achieved by 2018. Support from various concerned Ministries of Government of India is required to ensure achievement of the goal of Mission Indradhanush. Therefore, with the approval of the competent authority, an Inter-Ministerial Committee for Mission Indradhanush is being constituted that will look into the ongoing mission and work out modalities for its successful implementation. The details of the Committee are as follows:

Composition of Inter-Ministerial Committee:

The Committee shall be chaired by the Secretary (H&FW). One Officer, of the rank of Joint Secretary or above, from the following Ministries may be nominated for the Committee:

2. Ministry of Information & Broadcasting
3. Ministry of Women & Child Development
4. Ministry of Urban Development
5. Ministry of Defence
6. Ministry of Railways- Chairman Railway Board
7. Ministry of Human Resource and Development- Dept. of School Education & Literacy
8. Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs- Dept. of Youth Affairs, Dept. of Sports
9. Ministry of Panchayati Raj
10. Ministry of Minority Affairs
11. Ministry of Labour and Employment

Terms of Reference:

- To ensure coordination and participation of concerned Ministries/Departments at all levels for successful implementation and achievement of high immunization coverage in Mission Indradhanush.
- To oversee the implementation of Mission Indradhanush, the problems encountered, and accordingly propose solutions and new action points.



## खसरा रोग

- खसरा एक जानलेवा बीमारी है और बच्चों में अपंगता और मृत्यु के बड़े कारणों में से एक है।
- खसरा बहुत संक्रामक रोग है और यह एक प्रभावित व्यक्ति द्वारा खांसने और छींकने से फैलता है।
- खसरा आपके बच्चे को निमोनिया, दस्त, और दिमागी संक्रमण जैसी जीवन के लिए घातक जटिलताओं के प्रति संवेदनशील बना सकता है।
- खसरा के आम लक्षण इस प्रकार हैं - तेज बुखार के साथ त्वचा पर दिखाई पड़ने वाले लाल चकत्ते, खांसी, बहती नाक और लाल आँखें।



## रूबैला रोग

- अगर स्त्री को गर्भावस्था के आरंभ में रूबैला संक्रमण होता है तो सी.आर.एस. (जन्मजात रूबैला सिंड्रोम) विकसित हो सकता है, जो भ्रूण और नवजात शिशुओं के लिए गंभीर और घातक साबित हो सकता है। प्रारंभिक गर्भावस्था के दौरान रूबैला से संक्रमित माता से जन्मे बच्चे में दीर्घकालिन जन्मजात विसंगतियों से पीड़ित होने की संभावनाएं बढ़ जाती हैं जिससे आँख (ग्लूकोमा, मोतियाबिंद), कान (बहरापन), मस्तिष्क (माइक्रोसिफेली, मानसिक मदता) प्रभावित होते हैं तथा दिल की बीमारियों का खतरा बढ़ जाता है।
- रूबैला से गर्भवती स्त्री में गर्भपात, अकाल प्रसव, और मृत प्रसव की संभावनाएं बढ़ जाती हैं।

### याद रखें :

- यदि आपका बच्चा 9 माह से 15 साल की उम्र का हो, तो उसे टीका लगवाना चाहिए
- आपके बच्चे को यह टीका तब भी लगवाना चाहिए यदि उसे पहले एमआर / एमएमआर का टीका लग चुका हो, या उसे इन दोनों में से कोई बीमारी हो चुकी हो
- खसरा और रूबैला से जुड़े जानलेवा परिणामों, जैसे निमोनिया, दस्त, दिमागी बुखार से बचाव के लिए टीकाकरण ही एकमात्र बचाव है
- खसरा-रूबैला का टीका सभी टीकाकरण सत्र और सभी सरकारी स्वास्थ्य केंद्रों पर मुफ्त लगाया जाता है
- जब भी आप अपने बच्चे का टीकाकरण कराने जाएं, तब टीकाकरण / माँ एवं शिशु सुरक्षा कार्ड साथ ले जाएं


