Sir / Madam,

I am to refer to the Video Conference session at Swasthya Bhawan on 25.05.2016 on house to house surveillance activities with your ULB and District Health Officials. In the said session data on house to house surveillance activities were discussed at length.

Some issues have been emerged out of the discussion regarding inadequate training of team members & supervisors, limited access of team members by the house hold, less no. of container examined by the team members in comparison to house hold visited, discrepancy in no. of fever cases identified, less supervisory activity, non-monitoring of house to house activity, non-analysis of data reported after house to house visit.

Hence, you are requested to please take following actions so that quality of house to house survey could be enhanced:

- Access of team members by the house hold shall be enhanced through intensification of IEC & involvement of concerned Ward Councillors.
- Training & re-training of team members on technical issues, inter personnel communication and reporting before start of house to house visit for each month.
 Sensitisation on inspection of containers in the household as well as peri-domestic area for identification and source reduction of breeding sites of larvae.
- Training & re-training of supervisors regarding supervisory activities and reporting.
- All the training & re-training shall be imparted in consultation with District Health Office.
- Joint monitoring visit by the ULB & District Health Officials during house to house survey.

The following decisions were taken in the meeting chaired by Chief Secretary on 8.3.2016 at the Chief Secretary Conference Hall at Nabanna in connection with the prevention and control of Vector Borne Diseases in ensuing season.

Dengue


Action points

- a) Health and FW Department will release fund to SUDA for House-to-House surveillance activity for Dengue from April 2016 to September 2016 (six rounds) in 45 ULBs. Preparatory meeting with these ULBs has already been held on 16-02-16.
- b) Municipal Affairs (MA) Department will arrange printing of IEC materials shared by H and FW Department and will also arrange display/distribution of leaflets, posters
- Quality of Dengue House-to-House surveillance to be ensured. MA Department would consider changing those volunteers whose quality of work is poor.
- d) All ULBs will arrange pasting of stickers on the outside walls of buildings where volunteers have visited. This will ensure quality of surveillance and monitoring.
- e) CEO, West Bengal will be duly intimated about the Dengue House-to-House Surveillance to be taken up from April, 2016.
- MA Department will instruct all 45 ULBs to share the reports generated following completion of mothly rounds of Dengue Surveillance with the CMOH for analysis and targeted interventions.
 - g) KMC, HMC and BMC will arrange display of big size flex at prominent places for awareness generation on Vector Borne Diseases.
 - h) MA Department will organize meetings with GOI offices especially Railways, Defense, Port Authorities etc. in the Municipal Corporation areas for effective vector control in their premise...
 - i) Both KMC and BMC will arrange for churning of water of different canals flowing through its areas to kill mosquito larva.
 - j) HMC will take special care to prevent Dengue incidences in Liluah, Pilkhana areas.
 - k) KMC, HMC and BMC will take special care for surveillance of under-construction buildings and also the old abandoned premises.
 - ARD and MA Departments will jointly chalk out plan to remove all pigs from Kolkata. Till finalization of this plan, ARD will arrange netting of pigs.
 - m) MA Department is also requested to arrange meeting with KMC and other adjoining ULBs to ensure coordinated efforts for Dengue control.
 - n) MA Department will instruct all ULBs in the State to ensure availability of insecticide.

AES/JE

Vaccination of JE in the age group of 1-15 yr. has been completed in all districts and Kolkata. It is observed that during 2015 deaths due to JE were more in the age group of 50 yr. and

Action points

a) PHE and MA Departments are requested to ensure safe drinking water supply, construction of platforms and raising the platform of tubewells. H and FW Department shares line list of AES/JE affected areas with PHE.

b) CD & WD and SW Department has at present no system of Take Home Ration. They are requested to consider this for AES/JE affected persons.

Malaria

Plasmodium falciparum (PF) cases are rising but deaths are decreasing. Annual Parasite Index in overall is decreasing in the State but rising in Purulia district.

Action points

- a) H and HW will distribute 75,000 LLINs in Purulia, Bankura and Paschim Medinipur districts in the most affected Blocks.
- b) Panchayet & RD and MA Departments to cooperate with the H and FW Department for effective Indoor residual Spray activities and for holding 1000 IEC cum Service camps in high case load villages on monthly basis for 6 months starting in April 2016.

Kala-azar

At present Kala azar problem is limited to 23 Blocks in Darjeeling, Uttar Dinajpur, Dakshin Dinajpur, Malda, Murshidabad and Birbhum districts.

Action points

- a) Panchayet & RD Department is requested to cooperate with the H and FW Department for effective Indoor Residual Spray activity.
- b) Panchayet & RD and CD & WD and SW Departments are requested to take steps for community awareness for early referral of cases.

Zika

An emerging viral disease has been declared by WHO as Public Health Emergency of International Concern on 1st February, 2016. The vector mosquito is same as that of Dengue and Chikungunya. Necessary surve lance for persons coming from affected countries has been put in place by GOI. Reports are being collected from the delivery points and community health centres to detect incidences of micro cephaly, if any. Activities for control of vector mosquito along with personal protection and community awareness generation are to be taken up by concerned Departments.

The next meeting will be held on 04.4.2016 at 10.30 AM under chairmanship of Chief Secretary.

The following decisions were taken in the meeting chaired by Hon'ble Chief Minister on 08.02.2016 at NABANNA in connection with the preparedness for forthcoming season with a view to preventing Vector-Borne Diseases.

Secretary, PHP will follow-up on all the points in coordination with the Director of Health Services.

- 1. From the end of February, 2016 the following activities will be undertaken for prevention and control Vector-Borne Diseases in 2016.
 - o Generation of awareness in the community in both urban and rural areas.
 - Display of publicity material through multi-media like Newspapers, Radio, TV, Hoardings, Leaf-lets, Posters etc. The publicity material will be in different languages for different regions (Bengali, Hindi, Urdu, English & Nepali).
 - House-to-house visits by health workers/volunteers.
- Stagnant water in Kestopur Khal either to be drained or manipulated to prevent breeding of mosquitoes.
- Howrah and Bidhannagar Municipal Corporations will take intensive prevention & control measures along the lines of the work done by Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC).
- The Mayor of Kolkata Municipal Corporation will co-ordinate with the Mayors of Howrah and Bichannagar Municipal Corporations and with Chairpersons of Municipalities around Kolkata.
- Municipal Affairs Department will convene a meeting of 45 Municipalities to review their preparation for preventive & control measures in coming season. The Department will also ensure adequate availability of larvicide at each Municipality.
- 6. KMC, Howrah and Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation will approach the management of Central Government agencies operating in their respective jurisdiction to undertake measures for prevention and control of Vector-Borne Diseases.

- 7. The Municipal Corporations and Municipalities will inspect construction sites in their respective jurisdiction and ensure that breeding of mosquitoes is not at all allowed. Necessary penal measures should be taken against defaulters.

A report on Prevention of Vector Borne Diseases in Urban Areas

- The Hon'ble Chief Minister hold a meeting on 08.02.2016 and 02.08.2016 on Prevention of Vector Borne Diseases i.e. Dengue / Malaria in Urban areas.
- Following to the meeting of Hon'ble Chief Minister, the Chief Secretary convened a meeting on 08.03.2016 with Municiapl Affairs Department and Health and FW Department regarding preparedness to control dengue.
- Chief Secretary hold a meeting on 08.04.2016 with GOI & other officials, Municiapl Affairs Department and Health and FW Department for interdepartmental co-ordination and on 04.08.2016 & 21.09.2016 to follow up the progress.
- Principal Secretary, Department of Municipal Affairs hold a meeting on 29.03.2016 with the ULBs.
- > 41 ULBs have been identified as high risk ULBs by the Department of Health & Family Welfare.
- Training of trainers conducted on 16.02.2016 for identified persons of those 41 ULBs. Technical training had been imparted by the official of Health and FW Department.
- The trainers of ULB organized training at the ULB level for the field volunteers and supervisors wherein technical input provided by District Health.
- All the 41 ULBs have submitted micro plan and started house to house visit for consecutive five days in a month w.e.f. April, 2016.
- Printing of leaflet done by SUDA centrally and delivered to the ULBs.
- Monitoring officials of SUDA visited ULBs (either separately or along with official of Health & Family Welfare Department) during / after house to house visit.
- ACMOHs are the Nodal Officer from Health and FW Department.
- After completion of each round of house to house visit ACMOH concerned and Health Officer of ULB shall analyse the team-wise data and to suggest corrective steps required before implementation of next round. Furthermore, short evaluation note under the joint signature of ACMOH and Health Officer are to be made available with State NVBDCP cell of Health and FW Department through Dy. CMOH-II. ULB send a report as per format provided by Health and FW Department to SUDA for onward submission to Health and FW Department.
- Meeting convened by the Secretary, Municipal Affairs Department with respective DM and Mayor / Chairpersons of all the ULBs.

Officials of SUDA visited the said ULBs mostly in weekly frequency and even twice weekly in some of the ULBs. The visits were made with the ULB officials and workers (conservancy worker and larvicidal sprayer) and it most of the time along with District and State Health Officials. The concerned Councillors were also present.

- All the seven ULBs are continuing with house to house visit five days at a stretch in a month w.e.f.
 April, 2016.
- Furthermore, Health workers pay weekly house to house visit for source reduction and awareness generation in high risk wards / places for rest of the month.

- Porichhanta Soptah w.e.f. 29.08.2016 to 05.09.2016 was observed by the ULBs for ward-wise awareness generation, cleaning of drains, water bodies, collection of solid waste, use of compactors and organization of Health camp. Fund of Rs. 1317.72 lakh were provided to all the ULBs of West Bengal.
- Furthermore, Secretary, Municipal Affairs Department issued a letter to the ULBs w.r.t. sustenance of such cleantiness activity till puja.
- Fever Clinic run by the ULBs given in Annexure II.
- Health check up camps are also being organized in the ULBs. Involving additional Doctors, Lab.
 Technician, Nurses and other support staff. No. of Doctors involved given in Annexure II.
- Additional fund have been released by the Department of Municipal Affairs for purchase of Elisa & Fogging machine by Bidhannagar, procurement of larvicide by Serampore Municipality.
- Coordinated effort of Health, conservancy and sanitary sectors of the ULBs are continuing to deal
 with cleanliness, source reduction of larvae, awareness generation, case detection and treatment.





The Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department, Government of West Bengal chairs the meeting with the Government of India officials and concerned Departments of the State Government for Prevention & Control of Vector Borne Diseases in the ensuing season.

The list of participants is enclosed at Annexure – I.

Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department refers to the previous meeting on premonsoon preparedness for Prevention & Control of Vector Borne Diseases, which was taken by the Chief Secretary on 8.4.2016. He conveys his thanks to all GOI offices and others for cooperating with the State Government to combat Vector Borne Diseases. He states that due to onset of monsoon and high humidity, cases of vector borne diseases are being reported from various pockets in the State. He emphasizes on coordinated approach of both the State Government and Government of India Departments for proper vector control measures till the season is over.

Secretary (PHP), Health and Family Welfare Department, GoWB briefly explains the present situation and the incidences of Dengue cases and states that Health and Family Welfare Department is ready to extend any kind of technical help to all departments.

Director of Health Services, GoWB says that at present identification of breeding pockets of mosquito larva, spray of larvicide to kill larva, solid waste management, training and deployment of volunteers for this work and IEC are the most important tasks.

Following discussions are held.

Metro Rail authority will keep surveillance on the construction sites so that mosquitoes can not breed at those pockets.

Representative of Border Security Forces states that no major construction work is going on at present in their areas. He assures that BSF will keep surveillance inside the residential areas. There is one case of Dengue reported at Alambazar, Murshidabad area under BSF establishment.

Representative of South Eastern Railways requests Howrah Municipal Corporation to send surveillance team to Santragachi carshed area.

Representative of Eastern Railways informs that they have already sent instruction to all concerned to start sensitization and surveillance programme. Three (3) patients suffering from Dengue are admitted to Rail Hospital. Surveillance would be strengthened at the residential area under Eastern Railways at Gulmohar, Howrah.

Howrah Municipal Corporation has identified thirteen (13) vulnerable pockets under its jurisdiction and surveillance and spraying of larvicide is continuing.

Representative of GOC-in-C, Eastern Command and GOC, Bengal Area informs that there is no case of Dengue reported. They are keeping surveillance.

Representative of Coal India states that vector control measures are regularly undertaken in their premises.

Representative of Chief Post Master General requests State Government for imparting training to their staff. Secretary (PHP) requests the representative to intimate the Department of Health and Family Welfare of the training schedule.

Director, State Urban Development Authority informs that instruction has been issued to all municipal authorities for vector source reduction. House-to-House surveillance and spray of larvicide is being done at forty one (41) Urban Local Bodies areas and will continue till October, 2016. IEC activities have been intensified. SUDA assures to supply compactors to municipalities for improved solid waste management.

Joint Commissioner, Kolkata Municipal Corporation says that surveillance, spraying of larvicide and IEC are being done for vector reduction.

Commissioner, Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation informs that all steps have been taken for vector control.

Following decisions are taken.

- All GOI authorities are requested to share information with the Health and Family Welfare Department, GoWB if any case of Dengue is reported under their jurisdiction. Information may be shared by E-mail to idsp.wb@gmail.com
- 2. Surveillance at schools, hostels, residential complex, hospitals and other areas of public assembly under the jurisdiction of GOI authority would be increased.
- Extensive IEC for awareness generation in the form of leaflet, poster, electronic media would be done. Health and Family Welfare Department, GoWB would share IEC materials, if requested.
- 4. Railway and Army authority are requested to make arrangement of sufficient testing kits, medicines.
- 5. Spray of larvicide is most necessary.

- Solid waste management like disposal of plastic cups, green coconut shells etc where water is accumulated and are highly prone to be used as breeding ground of mosquito larva are very much essential.
- 7. The telephone numbers of the concerned State Government Department officials and Chief Medical Officer of Health of the districts would be recirculated along with the Minutes of this meeting for facilitation, as was done on previous occasion.
- The list of Sentinel Surveillance Laboratories of the State Government where ELISA test for Dengue is done will also be circulated with the Minutes of this meeting.

The meeting concludes with the Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department reiterating that there must be no let up in the surveillance and cleanliness drives till the season is over.

ACTION-TAKEN REPORT FROM THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT OF KOLKATA MUNICIPAL CORPORATION [KMC] W.R.T. THE DECISIONS TAKEN IN THE MEETING ON 8 MARCH 2016 AND 8 APRIL 2016 AT NABANNA UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE ESTEEMED CHIEF SECRETARY.

PASTING OF STICKERS: Over 2, 00, 000 stickers [Pix 1] have been pasted so far by the Health Department to mark house-visits by 100 days workers and other staff involved in vector control. The process of pasting such stickers is going on.

DISPLAY OF BIG-SIZED FLEXES: As many as 1050 multicoloured hoardings [8 ft X 6 ft each] containing Do's and Don'ts for prevention and control of VBDs have been displayed at various busy intersections of the KMC area [Pix 2].

PUTTING UP OF MULTICOLOURED BANNERS: Awareness-raising banners @ 20 banners per ward have already been put up in all the 144 wards of KMC by our Health Department [Pix 3]. This apart, the department has begun putting up 7200 banners in KMC area [@ 50 banners per ward].

ADDITIONAL INITIATIVES UNDERTAKEN BY KMC FOR PEOPLE'S AWARENESS:

- Auto-miking twice a week in each of the 144 KMC wards is on since June and the campaign will continue till September [Pix 4].
- Screening of a KMC-produced Documentary by using 3 publicity vans fitted with a LED Screen
 each has been going on since 10 August; the campaign will run for 90 days [except Puja Holidays].
- 16 service-oriented Health Camps have been organised in different places around the city; the health camps will remain open until further order.

LARVICIDAL SPRAY ALONG DIFFERENT CANALS USING ROWING BOATS AS TRANSPORT: In order to control the menace of Culex mosquito, the Health Department of KMC is carrying out larvicidal spray along different canals by using 20 small rowing boats as transport [Pix 5]. According to adepts, this anti-mosquito drive is rarely seen around the world. Many people, especially the canal-side dwellers of over 40 wards of KMC, are directly benefiting from this exemplary KMC-sponsored drive.





As in previous years. House To House Lever Surveillance and Source reduction of vectors for Prevention & Control of Dengue are going on in selected 35 municipalities and 6 municipal corporations since April, 2016. This is scheduled to continue till September, 2016.

After chasing out these activities for 4 consecutive months, however has not yielded desired outcome in respect of Prevention & Control of Dengue. Cases are on the rise in municipalities like Bidhannagar MC (33 cases), Dumdum (15 cases), Rajpur-Sonarpur (7 cases), Maheshtala (4 cases). Further there is an outbreak situation in South Dumdum Municipality (75 cases including outbreak 58 cases in June, 2016) & Sreerampur Municipality (157 cases including 153 outbreak cases in July, 2016). In KMC area, 176 cases have been recorded, while address verification of few more cases are three

In this present scenario, the House To House Fever Surveillance and Source reduction of vectors should be strengthened. Proper supervision & monitoring, and ownership on part of the ULB authorities is also requested for success of the program activities. We have already instructed the district health administration to render all technical support including joint supervision and monitoring and data analysis jointly by health officials of ULBs & ACMOH of the tagged subdivision for corrective measures and feedback to the ULBs.

In this respect, you are requested to pass necessary instruction for successful implementation of the activities so that the Dengue and Chikungunya fever may be controlled effectively.



The Hon'ble Minister-in-charge, Municipal Affairs & Urban Development Department, Government of West Bengal took the chair along with the Hon'ble Mayor, Kolkata Municipal Corporation & Hon'ble Minister-in-charge of Housing, Environment Departments, Fire & Emergency Services Department, and the Hon'ble Minister-in-charge of Irrigation & Waterways Department, Government of West Bengal. The Additional Chief Secretary/ Principal Secretaries of Urban Development, P.W.D., Irrigation & Waterways, Environment Departments, CEO, KMDA, Director, SUDA and other officials were also present. The District Magistrate, North 24 Parganas along with all district level officials of PWD, Irrigation, PHE, MED and the Hon'ble Mayor, Bidhan Nagar Municipal Corporation along with Chairpersons of all the municipalities of North 24 Parganas were also present.

The Hon'ble MIC, Municipal Affairs & Urban Development Department initiated the discussion and explained the background of convening the review meeting as per instruction of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Government of West Bengal. Thereafter, the Hon'ble MIC, MA & UD Department requested the officials of concerned departments to initiate discussion on agenda wise issues and the problems they are facing in implementing the development schemes.

The Secretary, Municipal Affairs & Urban Development Department requested the Mayor, Bidhan Nagar Municipal Corporation and Chairpersons of all the municipalities to submit plan of action for 2016-2022 in respect of Housing for All scheme and also requested to submit pending U.C.s in respect of BSUP, PMAY MIS and other development schemes. He also informed that details on the above matters have already been discussed in the earlier half of this meeting

The Hon'ble MIC, MA & UD Department, Government of West Bengal informed that for better transparency and speed up the schemes the work order, specification / schedule etc. are to be given by the Executing Agencies to the municipalities concerned.

KMDA

- Chairman New Barrackpore informed that DPR of the Water supply scheme have not been received by the Municipality . For the JNNURM Pipe line scheme installation is in half done & Road damaged. Existing water supply line has also been damaged.
- Officials of KMDA informed that problem including labour problem has been solved.

- The Hon'ble MIC MA & UD Deptt. informed that MED/ KMDA water supply scheme should be started only after receiving full work order after convening a meeting with KMDA and Municipality to sort out any further problem.
- The Chairman, Madhyamgram Municipality informed that under Trans-Municipality Water Project, Water treatment plan for 5 Municipality is going on but not completed
- The Hon'ble MIC MA & UD Deptt. Informed that electricity bill before handing over to be paid by KMDA. After hand over a committee to be formed to share the water among municipalities.
- Chairman Halisahar Municipality informed that Sewerage project is going on but the project is not covering total area of Municipality and house to pit connection is not in the DPR.
- It was also discussed that respective agencies should be asked to look after their own
- The Mayor, KMC informed that house to pit connection responsibility is only of the house owner. Minimum subsidy may be allowed by KMDA.
- Hon'ble MIC MA & UD Deptt. requested to put up to him the issues separately for such type of proposal.
- Chairman Barasat Municipality informed about problem regarding the water supply scheme and new scheme not solved in spite of repeated meeting with KMDA. Transmunicipal surface water supply project under Barasat Municipality, work not completed, road demolished but not yet restored and the KMDA agencies not responding. Officers of KMDA informed that the matter will be resolved within July 2016.
- Pipeline water supply scheme (surface water) under Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation, Baranagar Municipality, and maintenance work needs to be improved by KMDA as roads are damaged due to leakage of water.
- Land detail of sewerage project under Naihati Municipality submitted to KMDA for necessary approval. Similarly, Barauni Kalindi Project , South Dum Dum and Basakbazar UGR Project of Baranagar be taken up by KMDA.

IRRIGATION

- The Principal Secretary, Irrigation Department informed in brief the works done in North 24 Parganas like de siltation of Bidyadhari river, embankment strengthening and different canals of Municipalities Hon'ble Mayor KMC intimated that Banikanta Canal to be de-silted by Irrigation Deptt .
- MIC, Irrigation informed that a meeting was convened to sort-out the problem of Baikanthapur Canal and soon it will be de-silted. In the meantime de-silting of Suti and Noal Canal has been completed.

- Chairman, Baranagar Municipality informed regarding inundation of Bagjola Canal & Renovation of Ganga Ghats.
- Hon'ble MIC, Irrigation briefed the house that Vantage has already been increased and the dept has taken all sorts of action regarding their proposals. Storm Water drainage level is higher in Bagjola Canal which create some sorts of backflow.
- Mayor KMC informed that downstream of the Bagjola is to be desilted immediately.
- Hon'ble MIC, Irrigation told that both upstream and downstream are being drazed, but encroachment and dumping of garbage mainly creating the problem. We have also done a very good job regarding installation of pumps.
- Chairman Kamarhati informed that they are also facing the problem of water logging.
- Chairman, South Dum Dum Informed that under Barani Kalindi project 2 Km already taken up by KMDA and the rest part of the 2 Km must be takenup by KMDA to expedite the project.
- Mayor of Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation informed that Treatment plant of sweet water has already been inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister, West Bengal. Its pipeline work to be done. DPR was submitted in DelhiThe Department of Irrigation has done good job for drainage of water through Bagjola canal. Due to Encroachment of lower Bagjola in ward nos. 13, 14, 15, 21 and Jangra-Hatiara Panchayat drainage system collapsed. Building unauthorised Busstop constructed over the declared wetland of BMCunder ward nos. 35, 36, Sukantanagar, Santinagar, Naobhanga, Chingrihata areas. All concerned have been intimated formally that without any sanctioned plan, many buildings are being constructed which are illegal particularly at the outskirts of Bidhan Nagar within BMC area.
- Hon'ble MIC MA & UD Deptt told that Government is for the poor people. Government's
 policy is not to evict anybody without rehabilitation. Everybody shall be restricted at the
 very moment of encroachment of new land.
- Mayor, KMC told that total canal embankment shall be owned by the Irrigation Department and the area is to be demarcated properly. Problem is to be sorted out in gradual manner.
- Principal Secretary, Irrigation Department informed that Sultanpur canal work will be started very soon by our end. Small Irrigation canal within the municipal area to be restored as all are mostly dumped with solid waste. Capacity to be enhanced by the concerned municipality otherwise the problem of water logging can not be eased up though big canals are desilted.
- Hon'ble MIC told that Scheme of Ichhapur and Shyamnagar canals are to be prepared immediately.
- Chairman, Khardah Municipality informed that Khardah Canal catchment area is facing problem for soil erosion of the canal embankment Zone.

P.W.D. :

- Chairman, Panihati Municipality informed that Rs. 19 crores Storm Water Project of NABARD has been sanctioned. PWD is requested to take up the job as soon as possible.
 Engineer-in-chief, PWD (North Division) informed the following:
 - > B.T. Road: from Tala Bridge to Chiria More, newly constructed of 45 crores. But water logging problem at the roadside of Panihati and Kamarhati Municipality is to be solved. Otherwise, the road will be damaged.
 - > Sodepur-Madhyamgraam underground pipeline leakage hampers bituminous work.
 - > Panihati-Madhyamgram Municipality:
 - ✓ Old Calcutta Road Construction hampered due to utility problem.
 - ✓ Ghoshpara Road
 - Patipukur-Rajarhat Road construction hampered due to utility shifting not done by WBSEDCL.
 - Mayor BMC- We will provide all sorts of supports for construction of the road.
 - <u>Chairman Gobardanga</u>- Road from Gobardanga to Habra work is long pending for indefinite period of time. PWD to expedite the job.
 - Exe. Engg. PWD informed that widening work hampered due to utility shifting of trees & electrical posts. The Forest departments issued the tender but work not started due to rainy season. It will be expedited.
 - Engineering in Chief PWD informed that 65% work completed of Sports complex at Barrackpore Municipality.

P.H.E. :

The following action has already been initiated from this ULB

- 1. House to house visits have already started and will cover about 35,000 households, educational institutes, Hospitals, offices & residential premises of state government as well as Central government. This ULB took initiative to cover the areas even on Sundays and other holidays with the help of councillors, Local Clubs, NGOs, community participation and health workers. A special team has been formed comprising of respective Municipal Councillors, Medical Officers, Supervisors and sweeper cum helpers along with representative of ACMOH Barrackpore.
- We have identified the priority wards:- Ward 8,17,18,21 & 22 where larvae has been found in different types of containers and the containers were cleaned and we have taken other measures like spraying of larvicidal oil and burned-up mobil etc.
- 3. Buildings like Jessop & Co and Appollo Zipper & chain co are under lock and key since they have closed long back. Water may have definitely accumulated inside the premises but we are unable to take any measures due to the premise being under lockdown. We have already informed the MA department with a copy to District Administration and we are awaiting necessary instructions. We managed to install a Pump inside the premise of Jessop & Co to take care of the stagnant water.
- Advisory (M.O., RBSK) has already been sent to schools by the ULB and The Educational
 institutions have already been advised on the issue at hand and regular parents meet
 has also been arranged to sensitize on the same by the ULB
- 5. Yes the community is always involved during house to house visits.
- Yes ACMOH of District Health Office analyzed house to house report along with Health Officer.
- Yes ACMOH did provide the analysis report and discussed the same with ULB.
- Larvicidal oil presently in ULB stock is being used to spray regularly but we require more to meet up with the whole of ULB, the requirement is already sent to you.
- Regular spraying of larvicidal oil in under-construction building along with burned-up mobil is used to take care of the Larva problem.

Two rounds of IRS with DDT 50 % at a dose of 1gm/sq meter are carried out in a year. Spraying should be started before onset of Kala-azar transmission season which coincides with time of build-up of vector populations. The build-up in vector population starts in March and peak Kala-azar transmission season is from June to October. The effectiveness of DDT lasts for about 10 weeks. Therefore, two rounds of DDT are done, the first in February - March and the second in May - June, to control the vector population and for providing protection during entire transmission season. As it is difficult to conduct spray operations during monsoon, it may sometimes be necessary to delay the 2nd round till the monsoon subsides.

For Kala-azar elimination, the insecticidal spray is done up to a height of 6 feet only as the sand fly vector cannot hop above this height. Cattle sheds are also to be covered for interrupting transmission of Kala-azar. The varanda and areas with full sun light should be avoided for spray.

The average requirement of DDT is 150 grams per house in the rural areas and the average surface area for spray per house is 75 square meters. For one million population the requirement of DDT is 75 metric ton (MT) for both the round ie 37.5 MT for each round of spray.

Use of Synthetic Pyrethroid (SP) has been recommended in areas showing DDT resistance in pursuit to achieve the goal of elimination. The change is based on studies of RMRI, NCDC and CARE India in some districts of Bihar.

Vector Management for Dengue/Chikungunya

A package of vector control interventions against dengue and chikungunya is advised, targeting both the immature and adult stages of the vector and ideally combining chemical and environmental methods. Unfortunately the evidence base on vector control against dengue and chikungunya is poor. This is due to a lack of well-conducted studies that are unable to attribute declines in cases to vector control interventions or studies that have only entomological endpoints. A critical review of dengue control tools by an expert panel convened by the Partnership for Dengue Control Initiative was not able to recommend specific interventions. Nonetheless in the absence of convincing data we recommend that control programmes should monitor the effectiveness of their interventions. Larval source management should be in place for routine control. If there is an outbreak then these interventions should be intensified with additional interventions implemented such as indoor space spraying, fogging or ultra-low volume (ULV) spray. However, the evidence base for aerial or truck mounted ULV is limited since this intervention has no sustained impact on mosquito populations, is not cost effective for routine delivery during outbreaks and efficacy is variable because droplets may not penetrate inside houses to where Ae. aegypti are resting, especially if householders donot comply with requests to open their doors and windows . Vector control interventions are similar whether the disease is in urban or rural areas, although container types are likely to differ e.g. air conditioning units in urban areas.

Coverage of interventions

Due to the large number of dengue breeding sites and productivity of some cryptic sites, efforts should be put into identifying and treating (whether through removal, covering or larviciding) as many breeding sites as possible.

IEC/BCC activities

IEC and BCC campaigns play an important role in routine and epidemic control of dengue because breeding sites are numerous and close to homes. Campaigns may be carried out through mass media including local vernacular newspapers/magazines, radio and TV, especially using local cable networks as well as outdoor publicity like hoardings, miking, drum beating, rallies, etc. Health education materials should be developed and widely disseminated in the form of posters, pamphlets, handbills, hoardings. Inter-personal communication through group meetings, traditional / folk media particularly must be optimally utilised. Activities should be intensified during anti-dengue month (July).

Coverage of Interventions

High coverage of interventions is required to have maximum effect on malaria vector populations. NVBDCP has specific targets for coverage as follows [17]:

BCC activities are implemented by campaigns during the pre-transmission and transmission season especially, (peaking during anti-malaria month (June) on weekly/fortnightly basis) and as routine (monthly / once in two months, as appropriate) during low transmission season. At sub-national level, BCC relies mainly on inter-personal communication and community outreach, supported by mass media where appropriate. This is because populations in high risk areas such as tribal and rural areas are unlikely to have access to mass media. Activities include a) counselling/one to one direct communication between patient/family members and volunteer, ASHA, health worker, doctor in public and private sector and change agents (religious leader/community leader, educator, traditional healers, etc.); b) peer group interactions between members of associations, youth clubs, etc.; c) community/group meetings of civil society organizations, SHGs, Panchayats, RogiKalyanSamitis, Village Health and Sanitation Committees, etc.; d) infotainment by popular folk song and drama, skits, puppetry, etc. by local groups, animators, etc.; e) village level rally, miking, wall writing, etc.; and f) school activities.
