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The suggested plan of action at nsp 44 touches almost all the important issues that need to be addressed for smooth transition from QPR to MPR system of reporting, as has been recently decided by the Govt. of India.

For easy comprehension the plan of action suggested may be grouped under 3(three) broad categories:

- 1. Modus Operandi for operationalising the new MPR system: This has been dealt at Serial No.: 1-3. Instead of just transmitting the format in the traditional way, it would be better if we perk it on the website—and inform the Nodal Officer, SJSRY of the ULB to go through it and share his views on the format—in a video conference to be specially arranged for the purpose. This will not only cut down the transmission time but will give the ULBs a platform to clear any doubts that may arise after reading the new proforma. Also the video conference will give us an opportunity to discuss the new proforma in detail and the procedure of preparation and submission of the report.
- 2. Technical upgradation: This has been mentioned at SI No:4. We have already engaged an agency to develop and enable our SJSRY data base to determine and plug the financial leakages (if any) that may arise due to inadvertence or wrong reporting /duplication and also to generate different reports including QPR as and when necessary. This work has been successfully completed. However at the time of engaging the agency the MPR format was non-existent and as a result the work relating to creation of additional fields/resource base was not taken into consideration. A switch to MPR will require a simultaneous up gradation of our data base by incorporating the additional fields/ data that will be required for generation of MPR. Since the agency has already worked with the existing data base it would be logical if the upgradation work is entrusted with the same agency at an additional cost that that will be acceptable to both.
 - 3. Enhancement of skilled human resource: Pointed out at SI No5-6. This issue needs no further introduction. That SUDA is reeling under acute man power shortage in general and skilled manpower crunch in particular is known to all. The work of SJSRY requires maintenance of database relating to all the components, holding regular meetings with the stakeholders and above all an effective field monitoring for proper implementation of the programme. Switching to MPR format necessitates a robust data base management system which will be handled by an MIS expert assisted by a dedicated data entry operator. They will at one hand maintain, update and enter data on regular basis, generate different types of reports and on the other hand will liaise with the ULBs, take effective steps to collect MPR in time. This arrangement will relieve the Advisor and the Programme

Sub: Introduction of Monthly Reporting System (MPR) in SJSRY in lieu of Quarterly Reporting System (QPR) existing at present

A suggested Action Plan for operationalising the new MPR system

HUPA Ministry, Govt. of India in the letter under reference has communicated its decision to switch over to Monthly Progress Reporting System (MPR) in SJSRY programme from Quarterly Progress Reporting System (QPR) that is currently in vogue. Information as sought for in the new MPR system is found to be more elaborate and comprehensive in nature than the existing QPR system. A number of steps consequently need to be taken at SUDA's end for the newly designed MPR system to become fully operational. A suggested action plan for transition to the new MPR reporting system is produced below.

- 1. The newly introduced MPR formats (R-I to R-VII) may be uploaded in the CMU website
- A letter may be issued to the ULBs requesting the programme nodal officers to peruse the given formats & information sought for therein
- A video conference may be arranged with ULBs on introduction of the new MPR system
 and necessary clarifications in the matter may be given to ULBs in respect of querries
 raised by them, if any
- A dedicated software for the MPR system may be developed for capturing and compiling all information furnished by ULBs as per new MPR formats
- Early appointment of an MIS Officer at SUDA along with one Data Entry Operator for
 effectively following up with the ULBs for regular submission of MPR and compilation of
 the same at the State level & timely transmission of the same to HUPA Ministry
- 6. Together with appointment of an MIS officer, early deployment of specialist officers at SUDA as per Revised SJSRY guidelines is also of utmost importance in order to achieve the programme targets set by GOI from time to time and effective monitoring of different major sub-components. Major challenges in this regard include achievement and monitoring of skill development training programmes organized at the ULBs under the STEP-UP component and jobs that are created out of such training programmes; proper supervision into credit delivery by banks to the prospective and existing micro-business units under USEP & UWSP sub-components closely monitoring every aspect of bank linkage commencing with sponsoring of loan applications by ULBs to sanction and disbursement of loans by banks culminating thereafter in their proper end-use and recovery; ensuring wide community mobilization and monitoring of action taken on implementation of Prime Minister's new 15 point programme etc.

The action plan suggested above is put up for perusal and decision please.
