Social Mobilisation And Institution Development (SM&ID)

- 4.1 The mobilisation of urban poor households to form their own institutions is an important investment for an effective and sustainable poverty reduction programme. NULM envisages universal social mobilisation of urban poor into Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and their federations. At least one member from each urban poor household, preferably a woman, should be brought under the Self-Help Group network in a time-bound manner. These groups will serve as a support system for the poor, to meet their financial and social needs. Normally, women SHGs will be formed, however male SHGs of handicapped persons will be allowed to be formed.
- 4.2 NULM would lay particular emphasis on the mobilisation of vulnerable sections of the urban population such as SCs, STs, minorities, female-headed households, persons with disabilities, the destitute, migrant labourers, and especially vulnerable occupational groups such as street vendors, rag pickers, domestic workers, beggars, construction workers, etc.
- 4.3 SHGs will federate at the Slum/Ward-level into an Area Level Federation (ALF). ALFs will organize into federation at the City level as a City Level Federation (CLF). The existing area-based structures created under SJSRY Neighbourhood Group (NHG), Neighbourhood Committee (NHC) and Community Development Society (CDS) may be suitably transformed into SHG-based structures in due course. The Area Level Federation and City Level Federations will be registered bodies.

Sub-Component - Building Community Institutions: SHGs and their Federations

- 4.4 For catalysing the formation of SHGs and their federations and to promote the financial inclusion of SHG members under NULM, Resource Organisations (ROs) will be engaged to facilitate the formation of SHGs, their development and bank-linkages, formation of their federations at the area and city levels, training and capacity building, and establishing links to ULBs and to mitigate social, occupational and residential vulnerabilities.
- Autonomous registered agencies set up by State or Central Government or well established long-standing federations of SHGs having significant experience in managing large-scal-community driven programmes and developing successful implementation strategies in social moblisation and institution building in urban or rural areas may be preferred as Resource Organisations
- In addition, non-government organisations may be selected as a Resource Organisation on the basis of strict criteria including registration status of the organisation, turnover, number of years of experience, sound procurement and financial management capacity, number of dedicated expert staff, domain knowledge and prior experience in social mobilisation of poor households, training and capacity building, livelihood promotion, and bank linkage of the community organisations.



Formation of SHGs: Engagement of Resource Organisations (ROs)

- The experts hired under City Mission Management Unit (CMMU) along with the community organizers will work at the field level for formation of Self Help Groups under NULM. The services of ASHA / Anganwadi workers and other community level functionaries under various schemes / programmes of the Central and State Governments may also be utilised for this purpose.
- However, for catalysing the formation of SHGs and their federations and to promote the financial inclusion of SHG members under NULM, Autonomous registered agencies set up by State or Central Government or well established long-standing federations of SHGs or non-government organisations may be engaged as Resource Organisations (RO). The Resource Organisations will facilitate the formation of SHGs and their development, banklinkages, their federation at the area and city levels, training and capacity building, and establishing links to ULBs.
- A maximum of Rs. 10,000/- can be spent per self help group for its formation, handholding, training of all the members, bank linkage, formation of federation and other related activities. The ULB will decide on the area to be covered per RO depending on their capacity. A RO should cover a minimum of 50 SHGs. States or the ULB will be expected to enter into an agreement with Resource Organisations and payment will be made on the basis of milestones like SHG formation, training of members, bank linkage, formation of federation at the area and city levels and access to benefits under NULM, including revolving fund. The Resource Organization will handhold the SHG for a period of two years.
- The functions of the RO are as follows: 16.
- Identifying Affinity Groups: ROs should identify prior relationships of trust and mutual support and encourage those individuals to form SHGs. The membership should be 16.1. preferably through participatory approach and self-selection.
- Capacity Building: Once the SHG is formed, ROs will be expected to train ALL members of the SHG (not just the leaders/representatives) in: (a) The basic concepts 16.2. of functioning of a SHG like how to conduct meeting; basics of savings, lending money, repayment habits; responsibilities of group members,(b) book-keeping and accounting, fund management, building bank and credit linkages; (c) communication, decision making, conflict resolution, self-assessment, etc.; and (d) accessing government benefits under NULM and other programmes of the savings
- 16.3. Handholding support for at least 15 months: Once the groups are formed, ROs will be required to attend their meetings on a regular basis. The ROs will also bring in bankers, government officials from various departments, and members from established SHGs (for cross-learning) to interact with the SHGs. The ROs will assist the Community Organiser in the evaluation of the performance of SHGs being supported by it. Within a month of formation of the SHG, all groups which do not have bank-accounts should be helped to open SHG bank accounts and the ROs will also facilitate credit to SHG from banks. Groups should be encouraged to access credit from other formal sources as well.
- Withdrawal of support between 15-24 months: In this period, ROs will be expected to withdraw active support from those SHGs that are formed and performing

satisfactorily. At this stage the level of monitoring will increase and at the end of the 24 months of support, a critical evaluation of the supported SHGs in collaboration with the Community Organiser must be undertaken to determine whether the SHG is self-sustaining. ROs will also ensure that SHGs are federated into ALFs and work closely with ALFs and CLFs to build their capacity.

16.5. ROs will also facilitate UID enrolment, opening of basic service accounts and credit counselling of SHG members

A model Framework for engagement of ROs under NULM is at Annexure IV. These are indicative and for guidance only; State/ULBs may suitably amend these based on local conditions.

17. Selection of ROs:

- 17.1. The autonomous registered agencies set up by State or Central Government or well established long-standing federations of SHGs or non-government organisations having significant experience in managing large-scale community driven programmes and developing successful implementation strategies in social mobilization and institution building in urban or rural areas may be preferred as Resource Organization.
- 17.2. In addition, non-government organisations may be selected as a Resource organization on the basis of domain knowledge and prior experience in social mobilization of poor households, training and capacity building, livelihood promotion, and bank linkage. While assessing the capacity of a NGO weightage should also be given to registration status of the organization, turnover, number of years of experience, procurement and financial management capacity and number of dedicated expert staff etc.
- 17.3. State Urban Livelihood Missions (SULMs) will be responsible for the selection of ROs across NULM cities in a transparent manner. SULMs are free to engage ROs at the state level or allow ULBs to empanel ROs on their own.
- 17.4. Care must be taken to ensure that the RO chosen is experienced in working with the urban poor at the grass-root level and preference must be given to ROs with a proven track record on this.
- 17.5. Resource Organisations may engage Community Resource Persons (CRPs) on their team for the formation of SHGs under NULM, however sub-contracting will not be allowed. Community Resource Persons are members of a mature SHGs, who have good knowledge and experience on SHG concept, group management norms, SHG meeting process, Bookkeeping, Agenda fixation etc. They have the ability and skills to motivating the poor, conduct trainings by drawing lessons from their personal experiences and the best practices of their SHGs. CRPs act as guides and role models for other poor individuals.
- 17.6. States may empanel the Resource Organizations through an open competitive bidding process based on strict criteria for selection (technical parameters) so that the quality of services is not compromised.

Subject: Nurturing groups formed under SJSRY Engagement of ROs-reg.

As you are aware, under NULM, the emphasis is on the formation of SHGs for thrift and credit activities where groups of 10 - 20 urban poor women, come together to improve their living conditions by group savings and loans. Under SJSRY also groups were formed but thrift and credit was not a mandatory activity whereas under NULM, thrift and credit of SHGs is mandatory. It is suggested that:

- (1) Wherever possible, old groups formed under SJSRY may be nurtured till such time that they are integrated into the NULM structure. Subsequently, these groups may be federated as per NULM norms. It is suggested that long standing and functional CDS, after due evaluation, may be considered to be registered as ALF under NULM.
- (2) NULM provides for engagement of Resource Organisations (ROs) for the purpose of catalysing the formation of SHGs and their federations and to promote the financial inclusion of SHG members. It has been noted during interactions with States that in some cities it is difficult to find good ROs. It is suggested that if good ROs are not found in all cities, the State may appoint ROs in a phased manner based on their availability and in the areas not covered by ROs, Community Organizers (COs) may directly work on the ground for formation of SHGs.

(3) States may also engage strong and well functioning Community Development Societies or federations of SHGs as ROs after assessing their capabilities to take up this work.

Sub: Selection of CDSs as Resource Organisations under NULM

Resource Organisations (ROs) are designated to play a key role in formation and nurturing of SHGs and SHG-federations under the NULM guidelines. RFP was accordingly floated for engagement of ROs in the State. The response to the RFP was meek and only 12 applications in all were received. After evaluation of the applications, the State Committee set up for Selection of ROs etc. found only 5 applications eligible and shortlisted them for engagement as ROs in the State. A communication in the meanwhile was received from MolIUPA, wherein the Ministry directed the States to engage strong and well functioning Community Development Societies (CDSs) as ROs after proper assessment of their capabilities. As per resolution of the 4th State committee meeting held on 2.12.2014, applications were invited from the CDSs, who were willing to work as ROs and fulfilled the minimum eligibility criteria of managing 100 TCGs / SHGs and had annual average turnover of minimum 5 lakhs during the last 3 years. The eligibility criteria laid down was decided by the committee in conformity with the technical qualification as was mentioned in the original RFP. A letter was accordingly issued by SUDA to all the Chairpersons. This time too the response was not encouraging.

In the 6th meeting of the Committee for Selection of RO held on 02.04.2015, for roping in larger number of CDS, the Committee resolved that the existing eligibility criteria fixed for selection of ROs should be relaxed and following criteria be adopted for selecting a CDS as RO.

- Minimum average yearly turnover for past 3 years should be 1 lakh (instead of 5 lakh followed earlier)
- No. of TCGs/ SHGs formed and nurtured by CDS should not be less than 50 TCGs/ SHGs (in lieu of 100 SHGs followed earlier)
- 3. CDS should have adequate experience and expertise in bank-linkages

For the candidates interested in setting up micro-enterprises, the STP shall be responsible for providing support and track the progress of Micro-enterprise for a period of at least 12 months".

This Agreement is made on the 23rd day of September, 2016 between the Mission Director, West Bengal State Urban Livelihoods Mission having its office at State Urban Development Agency, HC Block, Sector III, Bidhannagar, Kolkata 700106 (hereinafter called WBSULM, which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors and assigns) of the **First Part**

WHEREAS:

The WBSULM requires the empanelment of the Resource Organizations to provide the services as defined in Guidelines for Social Mobilization and Institutional Development (SMID) under NULM with the below mentioned Municipalities under National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM) in West Bengal

The SPADE should strictly adhere to the activities mentioned under the Terms of Reference (ToR). The SPADE should also strictly follow time to time instruction given by WBSULM.

AND

The **SPADE** would be empanelled for a period of three years subject to satisfactory performance to be reviewed half yearly.

AND

The documents, statements, credentials and addendum/ clarifications submitted with the Expression of Interest for the Empanelment of ROs, by the respective RO, will form the part of this MoA and fall binding upon the respective RO.

1. EMPANELMENT THROUGH EoI

National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM) under the Ministry of Housing and Urban Pover ty Alleviation (MoHUPA), Government of India envisages mobilization of urban poor into three tiered structure with Self-Help Group (SHG) at the grass-root level, Area Level Federations (ALF) at the slum /ward level and City Level Federations (CLF) at the city level for reducing poverty and vulnerability of the urban poor. ROs will be engaged to facilitate the formation of SHGs, their development and bank linkages, their federation at the area and city levels, training and capacity building, establishing links to ULBs and to mitigate social, occupational and residential vulnerabilities.

The Mission Director, West Bengal State Urban Livelihoods Mission (WBSULM) under the Department of Municipal Affairs, Government of West Bengal had invited the Expression of Interest from well established, interested registered Institutions/ Organizations / Companies/ Trusts/ Societies/ Gol Institutions/ Industry Associations/ MSME Institutions / Sole Proprietorship having sufficient experience in providing support to form Self-Help-Group in urban and rural areas and facilitated their linkage to revolving funds and bank credit for income- generating activities, for empanelment as Resource Organization (ROs) for social mobilization and institutional development, which involves formation and stabilization of self-help groups, and facilitating their linkage to revolving funds and bank credit for income- generating activities to the urban poor families in different ULBs of West Bengal under 'Social Mobilization and Institutional Development (SM&ID)' - a component of National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM). SM&ID has a target to form SHGs approximately 15000 over the period of next three years.

- a. The Letter of Intent- (LOI) have been issued to the successful Bidders for submission of Performance Guarantee (PG). On receipt of such PG, a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) has been executed.
- b. The successful Bidder will be enlisted in a panel by WBSULM as ROs in the approved sector and ULBs to upload the said list on its website.
- c. The Empanelment list will be valid for a period of three years from the date of notification.
- d. West Bengal State Urban Livelihoods Mission (WBSULM) reserves the right to include or exclude the Urban Local Bodies from the enlisted empanelment of the RO or even delist any Empanelled Resource Organisations (ROs) at any time if performance is found unsatisfactory and detrimental to the interest of the urban poor.
- e. The agency may have to work anywhere in West Bengal as per requirement and direction of WBSULM.

2. Award of assignment order

- a. The empanelled agency will be awarded the assignment order by the respective ULB.
- b. Another "Memorandum of Understanding shall be executed between ROs and the enlisted ULBs under the respective RO for work order and payment (on a non-judicial stamp paper).
- c. The ROs shall immediately (maximum 7 days) start the mobilizing, formation of SHGs and federations, capacity building training, bank linkages, handholding support etc. as per the said Agreement / this EOI.

3. SCOPE OF WORK:

The aim of this Memorandum of Agreement, is to empanel the resource organizations for social mobilization and institutional development, which involves formation and stabilization of self-help groups, and facilitating their linkage to revolving funds and bank credit for income-generating activities. This has two parts: (a) building administrative structures, and (b) building community structures. Building community structures revolves around social mobilization, formation of self-help groups, providing Livelihoods skills, and enabling access to capital grants and bank credit. Social mobilization under SM&ID requires universal coverage of every target household in the target towns/cities. Based on a set of institutional capacities and resources, agencies and institutions including industry associations engaged in social mobilization and institutional development are invited to express their interest to Social Mobilization and Institutional Development under National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM). Sub-contracting / outsourcing of the assignment is not allowed. All target households (urban poor households and occupationally vulnerable segments like rag pickers and street vendors) will be included to achieve universal coverage. West Bengal State Urban

Livelihoods Mission (WBSULM) will enter into Memorandum of Agreement and the respective Urban Local Body will enter into Memorandum of Understanding with Resource Organizations.

The mission period (Phase-I) is from 2014-2017.

Objective

SHG model requires continuous and regular hammering at community door step to make beneficiaries understand the concept. Some non-government organizations/civil society organizations have the vital experience in the field of community mobilization, community institution development in a scientific manner. Therefore, the overall objective of this task is to take support of such organizations in the selected cities/towns, so that their experiences and learning can be disseminated to other project areas also. This will also lead to cross learning among different implementing agencies with healthy competition.

- i) Name of Work: "Empanelment of Resource Organizations for social mobilization and institution development under National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM) Programme across different ULBs of West Bengal".
- ii) Location of Work: Urban areas of West Bengal falling under the jurisdiction of Urban Local Bodies (Municipal Corporations/ Municipalities).

iii) Broad areas of work are stated under:

- a. **Identifying Affinity Groups**: ROs should identify prior relationships of trust and mutual support and encourage those individuals to form SHGs. The membership should be preferably through participatory approach and self-selection.
- b. Capacity Building: Once the SHG is formed, ROs will be expected to train ALL members of the SHG (not just the leaders/representatives) in: (a) The basic concepts of functioning of a SHG like how to conduct meeting; basics of savings, lending money, repayment habits; responsibilities of group members,(b) book-keeping and accounting, fund management, building bank and credit linkages; (c) communication, decision making, conflict resolution, self-assessment, etc.; and (d) accessing government benefits under NULM and other programs.
- c. Handholding support for at least 15 months: Once the groups are formed, ROs will be required to attend their meetings on a regular basis. The ROs will also bring in bankers, government officials from various departments, and members from established SHGs (for cross-learning) to interact with the SHGs. The ROs will assist the Community Organizer in the evaluation of the performance of SHGs being supported by it. Within a month of formation of the SHG, all groups which do not have bank-accounts should be helped to open SHG bank accounts and the ROs will also facilitate credit to SHG from banks. Groups should be encouraged to access credit from other formal sources as well.
- d. Tapering off of support between 15-24 months: In this period, ROs will be expected to gradually withdraw active support from those SHGs that are formed and performing satisfactorily. At this stage the level of monitoring will increase and at the end of the 24 months of support, a critical evaluation of the supported SHGs in collaboration with the Community Organizer must be undertaken to determine whether the SHG is stable.
- e. Federating SHG into ALFs/CLFs: ROs will also ensure that SHGs are federated into ALFs as described in the MoHUPA Mission Documents and work closely with ALFs and CLFs to build their capacity to take the handholding function after ROs fully withdraw support.
- f. Training of ALF/CLF Members: Members of the ALF/CLF will have to be trained as per guideline of NULM.
- g. At least 70% members must be Poor: The RO should ensure that at least 70% of members in every SHG are urban poor as per list or criterion for the identification of the poor at the beginning of the project implementation.
- h. General: ROs will also facilitate other entitlements, UID enrolment, opening of basic savings accounts and credit counseling of SHG members.

iv) Expected outcomes of the engagement with ROs

- a) Every target household (urban poor and occupationally vulnerable groups like rag pickers, street vendors) must be covered to achieve universal coverage.
- b) At least one member from each identified urban poor household, preferably a woman has to be a member of an SHG.
- c) At least 70% of the members of SHGs should be urban poor.

- d) ROs to train all SHGs to build their capacity on issues such as: (a) the SHG concept (including savings), how to conduct meetings, responsibilities of group members, etc; (b) book-keeping and accounting, fund management, building bank and credit linkages; (c) communication, decision making, conflict resolution, self- assessment; and (d) accessing government benefits under NULM, and other social programs of the central, state and local governments.
- e) All SHGs to have a bank account for deposit of savings;
- f) All new SHGs to access revolving fund under NULM.
- g) All SHGs to access bank credit;
- h) SHGs will be federated at the area-level and at least one City-level Federation will be formed per City.
- i) ROs to ensure that all members of ALFs/CLFs undergo training to build their capacity on issues such as: (a) the federation concept (including savings), how to conduct meetings, responsibilities of group members, federations etc; (b) book keeping and accounting, fund management, building bank and credit linkages; (c) communication, decision making, conflict resolution, self assessment; and (d) accessing government benefits under NULM, and other social programs of the central, state and local governments;
 - All ALFs/CLFs to be registered as a Society as par guidelines and facilitation support from WBSULM / respective municipalities.
 - All new ALFs formed must access revolving fund support under NULM.

v) Additional Tasks/Responsibilities of RO

- a. To share and learn from the experiences of the other teams.
- b. To facilitate the visits of other officials and non officials for learning, monitoring and evaluation as par advice from the WBSULM / respective municipalities.
- c. To keep proper records of transactions of SHGs, so that it is possible to trace them.
- d. To carry out the tasks assigned by the Mission Director of WBSULM or from the respective ULB from time to time.
- e. To attend (with complete information and progress report) periodic meetings called by the WBSULM/District Coordination Committee from time to time.
- f. To ensure transparency the agencies should clearly spell out to the community that NULM is a Government funded mission being implemented by the West Bengal State Urban Livelihoods Mission (WBSULM) and ROs are merely working as a facilitation agency.
- a. To report to respective ULBs for their day-to-day functioning.
- vi) Mobilization: The ROs will facilitate mobilization of the urban poor for social mobilization and institution building through proper counseling and duly motivating them. RO will explain the importance of social mobilization and institution development along with necessary information regarding advantages of group formation; such as handholding support for bank linkage and bank credit etc.
- vii) Selection of area for social mobilization and institution development: The ULB shall select area in consultation with COs and ROs.
- viii) **Cost norms**: A maximum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) is allotted for per Self-Help-Group (SHG) for formation, handholding support, training of all the members, bank linkage, formation of federations and registration of federations. The ULB will enter an agreement with ROs and payment will be made on the basis of milestones like SHG formation, training of members, bank linkage, formation of federations and registration of federations at the area and city levels and access to benefits under NULM including revolving fund.
- ix) Handholding support: The Resource Organization will handhold the SHG (each) for a period of up to 2 (Two) years.

x) MIS and Reporting:

- a. The ROs shall provide regular progress reports on an agreed format and periodicity with WBSULM.
- b. The ROs shall maintain online management information system (MIS) for a systematic recording and management of the information regarding formation of SHG, training, bank linkage etc.

- xi) The ROs shall not charge urban poor/beneficiaries for mobilization, group formation, bank linkages, capacity building training etc under this scheme under any pretext.
- xii) Terms of Payment: The Fee, including SHG formation, training of members, bank linkage, formation of federation and registration of federations at the area and city levels and access to benefits under NULM including revolving fund, in the following manner (Per SHG on quarterly basis), will be released from the respective Municipality:

xii) Performance Review:

Performance of ROs shall be reviewed every six months on a set of quantitative and qualitative parameters, as listed below:

- a. Achievement of social mobilization
- b. Achievement of formation of SHG, ALF and CLF
- c. Achievement of Capacity Building Training
- d. Achievement of Bank Linkage and Bank Credit
- e. Achievement of Revolving Fund

3. FRAME WORK FOR PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION

- i) WBSULM targets to form SHGs approximately 15000 over the period of next three years with an aim to reduce poverty and vulnerability of the urban poor households through social mobilization and institution development.
- ii) WBSULM/ CMMU shall continuously monitor program performance as per the envisaged monitoring & evaluation framework.

Enclosed herewith a letter received from President, North Dum Dum No-1 CDS or requesting some clarification on CDS/RO/CLF and allied matters.

Detail of above issues have clearly mentioned on the letter issued by WBSULM vide no. SUDA/33/2015/1569 dated 16.11.2015 rules and regulations at RO.

However clarification a suggested is given here under.

- 1) 'Community Development Society' (CDS) which is a self governed registered society having its own Governing Body and General Council. It is decided to allow ULB to authorise the self governed society to act as RO. It is the discretion of the Society to decide who will sign the agreement on behalf of them. CLF is no way the substitute organisation of CDS.
- 2) There is no relation with formation of CLF and functioning of RO in their jurisdiction.
- 3) As RO will function as separate organization, the organisation will decide who will be the member of the organization. There is no illegality of same person being the member of both ALF & CLF.
- 4) It is exclusively the own decision RO regarding formation.
- 5) No, RO will not work beyond their jurisdiction.



(a) having represented to the First Party that it has the required professional skills, personnel and technical resources, has offered to provide in response to the Tender Notice No.1675 dated 25 July 2015 issued by the First Party; and has agreed to the Terms of Reference (TOR) in the said RFP call, the TOR being annexed to this document as a material part of this agreement.

NOW THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH

1. Tasks and Responsibilities of SUDA:

- a. SUDA has identified the RO through a competitive bidding process for engagement in the NULM for discharging duties as detailed in Section 3 below.
- SUDA, through the professional establishment of the State Mission Management Unit (SMMU) in its office, will monitor and calibrate the functioning of the RO in the ULB.
- c. SUDA has also placed in the ULB a City Mission Management Unit (CMMU), comprising of Managers with whom the RO will work in close coordination. The CMMU will have oversight of the functioning of the RO and outcomes of its engagement.
- d. SUDA has clearly defined the role and responsibilities of the RO and the ULB in this document in various Sections and their Clauses and will process reports generated by the RO through the CMMU and SMMU.
- e. SUDA will monitor the program implementation directly or deploy manpower to monitor the same.
- f. SUDA will release funds to the RO after proper certification from ULBs, detailed in this agreement.
- g. All reports generated during the course of this engagement will be the property of SULM-SUDA and may not be shared in any form or media with any audience without the written permission of SUDA.

2. Tasks and Responsibilities of the ULB:

- a. The ULB shall assign the operational area for the RO's functioning and document the same within 15 working days from the date of this MoA. The document must specify the wards in which the RO will operate.
- The ULB Administration must ensure that concerned Community Organizers must extend cooperation to the RO to facilitate its functioning.

3. Task and Responsibilities of the RO:

a. Identification and assessment of existing SHGs

The RO will identify the existing SHGs formed under SJSRY/ Mission Shakti and by other Organizations in the ULB and assess the status of these SHGs in terms of their quality of functioning. The RO will follow a standard questionnaire to conduct the assessment and will collect relevant data to assess the SHG situation. A standard questionnaire template will be facilitated by SUDA for the purpose and the RO must deploy that standardized template only. Based on this exercise the RO will determine the number of new SHGs to be formed and number of existing SHGs to be strengthened in the operational area earmarked for it by theULB. The RO will also identify potential individuals to form new SHGs. - Monthly/quarterly/annual progress reports in the agreed format need to be shared by RC periodically with the ULB. SUDA and ULB jointly will monitor the progress of program implementation at mutually agreed upon intervals and interact with the agency to ensure that the program falls within the schedules and agreed timeline. 10. Reporting and Review Mechanism

Mission Director, NULM, SUDA will be responsible for review and monitoring of progress ofthe partnership. The Review committee may be constituted at various levels to monitor the progress and to interact with theRO. The designated C Project Officer at the ULB will be the Chairperson of the committee at the city level and will include the SMMU Manag in-charge of the ULB and the CMMU expert.

PROPOSAL FOR TAKING UP SOCIAL MOBILISATION ACTIVITIES IN OTHER URBAN AREAS OF OTHER STATES:

The National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM) was launched in September 2013 by the Government of India with the aim of reducing poverty and vulnerability of the urban poor households and resting on the foundation that the mobilization of urban poor households into Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and their federations at the area and city levels, is an important investment for an effective and sustainable poverty reduction programme. Under NULM, to catalyze the formation of SHGs and their federations and promote the financial inclusion of SHG members, Resource Organizations (ROs) may be engaged. In addition to NGOs, ROs can be autonomous registered agencies of the state or central government such as MEPMA. This proposal is for MEPMA to use its experience in social mobilization and institution building and act as an RO for other states under NULM.

I. Scope of the partnership:

The objective of this partnership is

- Through deployment of high quality Community Resource Person (CRP) teams under NULM to other / host states.
- Through deployment of State Resource Persons (RPs) for giving necessary support to ULBs in other / host states.
- Provide technical support in preparation of IEC material for social mobilization and institution building.

II. Key activities and tasks of partnership:

The following are the key activities are envisaged to promote social mobilization and institution building under NULM in the host state:

- Immersion, induction and training of the Host state's officials / staff (all levels), community staff and members in the selected urban areas of the host state
- Deployment of high quality external teams.
- Deployment of high quality resource persons.
- Assistance in designing customized training modules, Books of Accounts to the other state staff
- Any activity jointly agreed by other state and MEPMA and National Urban Livelihood Mission, Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation, GOI.

III. Expected Outcomes/Outputs in an ULB for first year:

- The staff at the selected state and city level will be trained in the areas of Social Mobilization, Institution Building (IB) and Financial Inclusion and other core competencies required for project implementation.
- Comprehensive IB and Training Action Plan will be developed.
- Presuming a city /ULB population of 100,000 people with 6,000 urban poor households, on an average, 600 SHGs will be formed and facilitated to form at least 25 Area level federations and one city level federation in one ULB.. The actual number of SHGs and federations formed and sustained will be based on the need jointly identified by MEPMA and the host state.
- One Book keeper for 3-4 SHGs will be identified and 600 Book keepers will be trained to write the records of the SHGs.
- Community managed Books of accounts will be introduced.
- SHG, ALF and CLF system of Monitoring the meetings will be set up.25 ALF RPswill
 be trained for monitoring the SHG meeting systems regularly.
- By the end of the year city/cluster level federation will be formed and strengthened
- Training of Trainers (ToTs) for up to 10-15 CRPs will be undertaken in IB and book-keeping in one ULB.
- Credit enablement through SHG Bank linkage for SHG groups formed will be ensured in course of year 1 and
- Opening of Bank account and facilitation of financial inclusion for all ALFs and CLFs formed in the course of year 1 will be ensured.

IV.Expected outcomes for the 2nd year:

Extending technical support through providing trainings/exposure visits to the field functionaries involved in the programme for ensuring proper follow up and sustainability.

V. Role and responsibility of each partner agency:

MEPMA:

 Diagnosis of existing level of Social mobilization, promotion of CBOs and IB process in ULBs and suggest suitable strategy to other states for taking up various activities in ULBs.

- Participate in the joint workshop held at other state and guideline for finalization of Books of Accounts for SHG and ALFs and CLFs.
- Participate in the state level meeting and guide the other states in positioning of sensitive support mechanism.
- Deployment of CRP teams &RP teams continuously for a period of one year initially and subsequently, in the 2nd year, based on the requirement
- 30 teams deployed for 6 rounds in the financial year 2013-14 in Urban local bodies in a phased manner.
- Depute teams to ULBs @ 5 teams per ULB to work in the clusters/cities to take up social mobilization activities like formation of SHGs, ALFs and CLFs.
- Assist and guide other states for conducting start up and feedback meetings to CRP teams to assess their work and achieve the outcomes.
- Select nodal CLF by the MEPMA team as per the approved rates and implement strategy through them.
- Assist and guide the other states to formulate city-level training plans and conduct follow up training to the community members and community professional by the state resource persons.
- Conduct training programmes to SHG members, ALF Executive Committee (EC)
 members, CLF EC members, CRPs and ALF resource persons and guide other states to
 utilize their services for continuous monitoring of the functioning of CBOs.
- Attend the joint review meetings conducted by the other states once in 3 months for monitoring the processes and assess the outcomes in the Resource Cities on CRP strategies and resource person's strategies.
- Depute experienced professional to the other states to work as State Anchor Person
- Support other states in designing and development of training modules, Books of Accounts, material, audio visual aids.

Host State:

 Identify select ULBs in the host state (at least 6 per state). These will be treated as Resource Cities. These ULBs/clusters should be accessible by road and be geographically contiguous.

- Recruit and position a state level specialist team in their state for taking up Social
 mobilization activities like IB, Financial Inclusion, HR and Finance who will partner with
 the MEPMA team in the selected cities / ULBs.
- Conduct local immersion programme to the team members in the clusters of the said ULBs at least for 7 days to understand poverty issues and impact of various programme interventions for poverty removal.
- Designate one dedicated Project Manager level person as anchor for ULB strategies and ensure that he/she gives quality time and put in effort towards the objective of resource cities continuously.
- Shall ensure that, the follow-up activities as mentioned in the Annexure-2 would be taken care by the respective local functionaries in other states.
- Shall liaise with SLBC, banking and other financial institutions to ensure bank and credit linkage for SHGs and their federations formed by MEPMA in the selected cities / ULBs.
- Timely release of funds to MEPMA

PRAN Proposal for RO

1. INTRODUCTION

Participatory Research And Action Network as "PRAN" is a non-profit making, self-governed and legatee social development Organisation, established with view to conduct activities related to social development. It aims to develop a self-reliant society in the matters of human, financial and physical resources. Achievement of such aim is possible through implementation of various community development programs that aim to assist national development, utilising local human resources and financial and physical expertise to address problems of disadvantaged, destitute and women in the local level.

We have sufficient experience in providing support to form Self-Help-Group in urban and rural areas and facilitated their linkage to revolve funds and bank credit for income- generating activities to the urban poor families in different ULBs of West Bengal.

PRAN is ready to render services for mobilizing urban poor into three tired structure with Self-Help Group (SHG) at the grass-root level, Area Level Federations (ALF) at the slum /ward level and City Level Federations (CLF) at the city level for reducing poverty and vulnerability of the urban poor. Our main responsibility as RO is to facilitate the formation of SHGs, their development, bank linkages, their federation at the area and city levels, training and capacity building, establishing links to ULBs and to mitigate social, occupational and residential vulnerabilities.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

Our main work are: social mobilization and institutional development, which involves formation and stabilization of self-help groups, and facilitating their linkage to revolve funds and bank credit for income-generating activities. This will be two parts: (a) building administrative structures, and (b) building community structures. Building community structures revolves around social mobilization, formation of self-help groups, providing livelihood skills, and enabling access to capital grants and bank credit. Target groups will be urban poor households and occupationally vulnerable, like rag pickers and street vendors.

Proposal for RO

A. Objective

As PRAN has expertise and experience in the field of community mobilization, community institution development, we will be rendered our expertise and experience in the field of SM&ID sector under NULM and this will also lead to cross learning among groups as well as in the larger society. Broad areas of work are:

- Identification of Affinity Groups: Our first task is to identify Target Women through 'URBAN POOR MAPPING' and to build-up relationships, trust and encourage individuals to form SHGs. The membership should be preferably through participatory approach and self-selection.
- ii. Capacity Building: Once the SHG is formed, we will train all members of the SHG (not just the leaders/representatives) in: (a) The basic concepts of functioning of a SHG like how to conduct meeting; basics of savings, lending money, repayment habits; responsibilities of group members,(b) book-keeping and accounting, fund management, building bank and credit linkages; (c) communication, decision making, conflict resolution, self-assessment, etc.; and (d) accessing government benefits under NULM and other programs.
- Handholding support: Once the groups are formed, our experts will III. attend SHGs group meetings on a regular basis. We will also invite bankers. government officials from various departments, and members from established SHGs (for cross-learning) to interact and share of experience with the SHGs. We will also assist the Community Organizer the evaluation of the performance of SHGs being supported by it. Within a month of formation of the SHG, all groups which do not have bank-accounts will help to open SHG bank accounts and side by side we will facilitate to arrange Bank credit for SHG from banks. Groups would be encouraged to access credit from other formal sources as well.
- iv. Support between 15-24 months: In this period, we will gradually withdraw active support from successful SHGs. At this stage the level of monitoring will increase and at the end of the 24 months of support, a critical evaluation of the supported SHGs in collaboration with the Community Organizer would be undertaken to determine whether the SHG is stable.

PRAN Proposal for RO

v. Federating SHG into ALFs/CLFs: We make ensure that SHGs are to be federated into ALFs as described in NULM guideline. and work closely with ALFs and CLFs to build their capacity to take the handholding function after PRAN fully withdrawn support.

- vi. Training of ALF/CLF Members: We will train all members of the ALF/CLF as per guideline of NULM.
- vii. At least 70% members must be Poor: We will ensure that at least 70% of members in every SHG are urban poor.
- viii. **General:** We will also facilitate other entitlements i.e. UID enrolment, opening of basic savings accounts and credit counseling of SHG members.

B. Our Additional Tasks/Responsibilities:

- To share and learn from the experiences of the other teams.
- To facilitate the visits of other officials and non officials for learning, monitoring and evaluation.
- We will keep proper records of transactions, so that it is possible to trace them.
- iv. We will carry out the tasks assigned by the Mission Director of WBSULM from time to time.
- v. We will attend (with complete information and progress report) periodic meetings called by the WBSULM/District Coordination Committee from time to time.
- vi. We will ensure our transparency and clearly spell out to the community that NULM is a Government funded mission being implemented by the State Urban Livelihoods Mission (WBSULM) and we are merely working as a facilitation agency and shall be subject to Right to Information Act (RTI).
- vii. We will report to respective ULBs for their day-to-day functioning.



C. Expected outcomes of the engagement of PRAN

- Every target household (urban poor and occupationally vulnerable groups like rag pickers, street vendors) would be covered to achieve universal coverage.
- One member from each identified urban poor household, preferably a woman to be a member of an SHG.
- iii. At least 70% of the members of SHGs would be urban poor.
- iv. PRAN to train all SHGs to build their capacity on issues such as: (a) the SHG concept (including savings), how to conduct meetings, responsibilities of group members, etc; (b) book-keeping and accounting, fund management, building bank and credit linkages; (c) communication, decision making, conflict resolution, self- assessment; and (d) accessing government benefits under NULM, and other social programs of the central, state and local governments.
- v. All SHGs to have a bank account for deposit of savings;
- vi. All new SHGs to access revolving fund under NULM.
- vii. All SHGs to access bank credit;
- viii. SHGs will be federated at the area-level and 15 ALFs are to be formed into CLF in the City level.
- ix. All ALFs/CLFs to be registered as a Society;
- All new ALFs formed would be access revolving fund support under NULM.

D. Mobilisation:

PRAN will facilitate to mobilise urban poor for social mobilization and institution building through proper counseling and duly motivating them. We will explain the importance of social mobilization and institution building along with necessary information regarding advantages of group formation; such as handholding support for bank linkage and bank credit etc.

E. Handholding support:

PRAN will provide handhold support to the SHG (each) for the period between 15 and 24 months.

F. MIS and Reporting

- The PRAN will provide regular progress reports on an agreed format and periodicity with WBSULM.
- We will maintain online management information system (MIS) for a systematic recording and management of the information regarding formation of SHG, training, bank linkage etc.


Self-Help-Group (SHG): The objective of the SHG is to empower women through economic support. They also formed a user group for maintenance of community assets.




