PREFACE

Pradhan MantriAwasYojana (PMAY) aims at Providing Housing for All (HFA) by 2022, when the Nation Complete 75 years of its independence. Taherpur Notifies Area Authority was established in 11th June 1993. The Taherpur acquired this status through long struggle of the people. In 1951, refugees from East Pakistan swarmed and settled into this jungle-covered region in Nadia district. In 1971, for the first time, Panchayat elections were held in Taherpur. After long movement under Taherpur People, the government accepted the demand of people to promote the administrative status of Taherpur from Gram Panchayat to Notified Area.

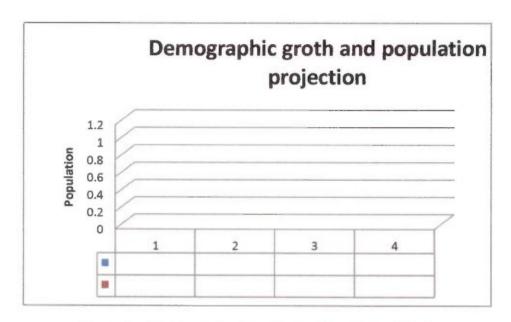

Economic Activity

Economically Taherpur have not evolved during it almost 35 years of existence. Large sections of the population still live a meager living owing to lack of any good economic activities in the area. 20 % of the Population is dependent on service sector and 35 % are involved in the business people. The remaining majority of people are wage labourer. Except few small-scale industries like pottery, wood, soap etc in some wards, Taherpur town is not a industrially dependent town.

PMAY

To give pucca house for every family is currently on the global agenda. One of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) is to 'achieve significant improvement in the lives of slum dwellers, by 2022. Similar goals are set forth by Pradhan MantriAwasYojana in 2022, to create pucca house for every family.

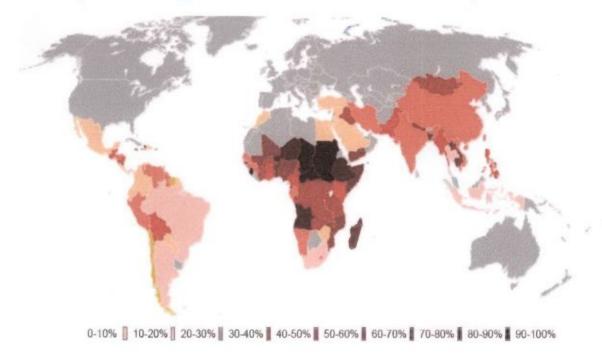
ULB undertake a demand survey through suitable means for assessing the actual demand of housing. While validating demand survey, Cities should consider possible temporary migration from rural areas to the city just to take advantage of housing scheme and exclude such migrants from list of beneficiaries. On the basis of demand survey and other available data, cities prepare Housing for All Plan of Action (HFAPoA). HFAPoA should contain the demand of housing by eligible beneficiaries in the city along with the interventions selected out of four verticals. The information regarding beneficiaries is collected by ULB in suitable. While preparing HFAPoA, ULB and Implementing Agencies should also consider the affordable housing stock already available in the city as Census data suggests that large number of houses are vacant.

Bank account number and Aadhaar number/Voter ID card/any other unique identification details of intended beneficiaries or a certificate of house ownership from Revenue Authority of beneficiary's native district will be integrated in the data base of HFAPoA for avoiding duplication of benefit to one individual family. Beneficiaries is validated by ULBs thereby ensuring their eligibility at the time of preparation of the projects and approval of projects

On the basis of HFAPoA, States/Cities subsequently prepare the Annual Implementation Plans (AIPs) dividing the task upto 2022 in view of the availability of resources and priority. For larger cities, HFAPoA and AIPs is prepared at sub-city (ward/zone etc.) level with the approval of concerned State/UT Government. The result of demand survey, draft HFAPoA and draft AIP is discussed with the local representatives including MLAs and MPs of that area so that their views are adequately factored in while finalising the plans and beneficiary list.

Cities which have already prepared Slum Free City Plan of Action (SFCPoA) or any other housing plan with data on housing, utilise the existing plan and data for preparing "Housing for All Plan of Action" (HFAPoA). Houses constructed under various schemes should be accounted for while preparing HFAPoA

Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY), a path breaking scheme for the slum dwellers and urban poor envisages a 'Pucca house to every family' through encouraging States to tackle the problem of slums in a holistic manner. It calls for a multi-pronged approach focusing on:

- Bringing existing slums within the formal system and enabling them to avail of the same level of basic amenities as the rest of the town
- · Redressing the failures of the formal system that lie behind the creation of slums.
- Tackling the shortages of urban land and housing that keep shelter out of reach of the urban poor and force them to resort to extra-legal solutions in a bid to retain their sources of livelihood and employment.
- Enactment of a set of reforms at the state and city level related to inclusive planning, regulation and financing, which would ensure that adequate fresh housing stock and services get created on an ongoing basis to address both current and future needs of cities.
- An integrated approach covering shelter, services and livelihoods for poor slum communities

The duration of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana [PMAY] 2015 TO 2022

Allotment of dwelling units will be in the name of the female member of the . Alternatively, it can be allotted in the name of husband and wife jointly. Ownership of land required for every Beneficiary

A EWS beneficiary family will comprise husband, wife and unmarried children. The beneficiary family should not own a pucca house (an all weather dwelling unit) either in his/her name or in the name of any member of his/her family in any part of India to be eligible to receive central assistance under the mission. EWS households are defined as households having an annual income up to Rs.3,00,000 (Rupees Three Lakhs). States/UTs shall have the flexibility to redefine the annual income criteria as per local conditions in consultation with the Centre

Following infrastructure will be considered for support under PMAY

- Water connection
- Toilet facilities
- 24 x 7 Electric facilities
- Roads

Need for Projects

This development project models will give benefits in the city. One of the key objectives of developing the Projects is to incentivize innovation and encourage new approaches and solutions that can demonstrably improve the quality and quantity of shelter and services for the poor. Such innovation could encompass

- Projects wise strong community participation i.e.Slum up gradation/ redevelopment projects initiated/spearheaded by the community; or with their demonstrable involvement and participation in design, planning and implementation
- New models of public-private partnerships whereby the private sector can be encouraged to take up affordable housing for the EWS/LIG.
- Innovations in planning, demonstrating integrated livelihoods, shelter and services; or convergence
- · Innovative or cost effective and green building design and technologies
- Financial innovations in delivering the city/state wide programme

Vision and Objectives

Vision

The mission seeks to address the housing requirement of urban poor including slum dwellers through following programme verticals:

- Slum rehabilitation of Slum Dwellers with participation of private developers using land as a resource
- Promotion of Affordable Housing for weaker section through credit linked subsidy
- Affordable Housing in Partnership with Public & Private sectors
- Subsidy for beneficiary-led individual house construction

Objectives

The project has been designed keeping in mind the following objectives

- Integrated development of all existing slums, notified or non-notified, i.e., development of infrastructure and housing in the slums/rehabilitation colonies for the slum dwellers/urban poor, including rental housing.
- Development/improvement/maintenance of basic services to the urban poor, including water supply, sewerage, drainage, solid waste management, approach and internal road street lighting.
- The Creation of affordable housing stock, including rental housing with the provision of civic infrastructure and services, on ownership
- Encouraging Public Private Partnership by having pay and use toilets and educate the slum dwellers for keeping the environment clean and hygienic

State PMAY Mission Director

The Nodal Ministry and National Mission Directorate is Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation, Government of India.

The Nodal Department for West Bengal is Municipal Affairs Dept. (M.A. Department), Government of West Bengal. The state level Nodal Agency is State Urban Development Agency (SUDA) under M.A. Department. State Urban Development Agency was set up in 1991 with a view to ensuring proper implementation and monitoring of the centrally assisted programmes for generating employment opportunities and alleviation of poverty throughout the State. Definition of Slum for Housing

Different definitions of a slum exist in different statutes and in urban poverty literature. For the purpose of HOUSING SCHEME, it is proposed to adopt the definition given in the 2001 Census, which is as follows:

- a. All areas notified as 'Slum' by State/Local Government and UT Administration under any Act;
- b. All areas recognized as 'Slum' by State/Local Government and UT Administration, which have not been formally notified as slum under any Act;

'Slum' or **'Slum Area"**— is a compact settlement of at least 20 households (For NE & Special Category States it is 10-15 households) with a collection of poorly built tenements, mostly of temporary nature, crowded together usually with inadequate sanitary and drinking water facilities in unhygienic conditions.

Situation Appraisal

The people living in the slums all have kutcha (182) housing. In certain cases where pucca housing is available, they are usually in dilapidated condition. The kutcha houses are in very poor condition and require extensive repairs. Most of the houses have tiles on roof. While during the survey some of the houses have been noted to be in average condition, the quality of these houses is also speedily deteriorating.

Proposed Intervention

In line with the vision to 'housing for all', an integrated housing programme is proposed to be implemented. The target will be all the slum /Non Slum dwellers in the pocket.

Building Plan

The buildings are proposed to cover an area of approximate 32 Sq.mt along with provision of 2rooms, kitchen and sanitation facility. The layout, size and type design of housing dwelling units depends on the local conditions and the preferences of the beneficiary. The houses, has been designed in accordance with the desire of the beneficiaries, keeping in view the climatic conditions and the need to provide ample space, kitchen, ventilation, sanitary facilities, etc. and the community perceptions, preferences and cultural attitude

In line with the scheme, carpet area of the house will be not less than 25 sq. mts and preferably two room accommodation plus kitchen and toilet should be constructed

Compliance with Municipal Bye laws

All designs & drawings are created keeping in line with the municipal bye laws

Structural Design

- For all the building, walls of 250 mm and 125mm thick with 20 mm External plaster and 12 mm thick internal plaster are considered.
- Seismic loads are considered acting in the horizontal direction along either of the two principal directions

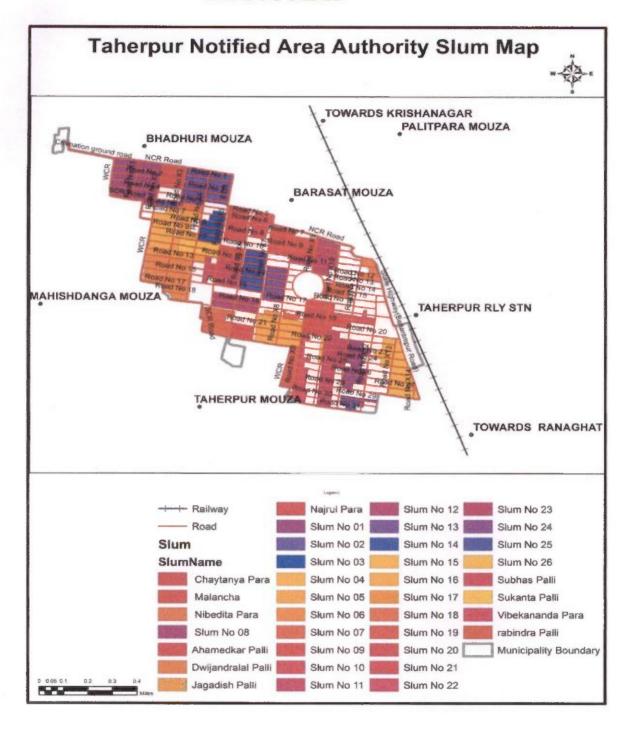

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE

A Monitoring &Evaluation team has to be formed to know the post project impact on the slums and to document the best practices

Health

Slum population as percentage of total urban population is roughly 34%. As mentioned somewhere in the report that IHSDP programme is being implemented in 54 slums. There are altogether 10 primary schools located in slums. The location and distance of nearest primary schools lies between 500 m to 1000 m approximately. Similarly,the location and distance of nearest primary Health Centre / UHP / UFWC lies between 1000 m to 3000 m approximately

Housing Infrastructure

The individual houses in the slum pockets are in general temporary in nature, without having a permanent roof structure. Proper sanitary facilities are absent which not only endangers the individual health, but also the environmental conditions of the slum and consequently the town is general

Water Supply

The existing water supply facilities in the slum pocket is inadequate. Although the slums have sufficient source of water in the form of either tube wells or existing municipal water sources, they lack a proper distribution system for efficient use of the water. In order to solve this problem, a network of distribution lines in slum pockets have been proposed. This will reduce their inconvenience for procurement of water from a distant place as well as improve their personal health and hygiene

Drainage

Haphazard growth and settlement in the slum area has blocked the natural drainage courses, which in turn causes water logging and stagnation in different parts of the slum. This accumulated water causes to generate public health problems. The proposed drainage system by means of construction of new drains will help to provide relief to the slum dwellers by means of efficient and effective disposal of storm water through the outfall channels. This drain will carry both sewerage and storm water. The outcome of this scheme will by and large enhance the quality of civic life by way of promotion and safeguarding the public health and environmental pollution.

Roads

The existing road network system of the slum has become inadequate to cope up with the present and ever increasing needs. In order to bear the additional load due to enhanced civic, economic and commercial activities of the slum, existing road network system in several places are required either to

be upgraded or widened and new roads are also be constructed in a number of places where the network is inadequate. The project is intended to ease at the movement of slum dwellers and smooth flow of pedestrian and light vehicle, which will enhance the quality of civic amenities in the slum. As a result, the quality of life in the slum will also improve substantially.

Street Light

After successful implementation of the scheme will remove prevailing darkness in slum area after sunset. This will ultimately alleviate inconvenience faced by slum dwellers during night.

Primary Education:

Existing facilities for pre school education, non formal education, adult education are not suite adequate but there are a few number of primary education centers in the slum area, with admission rates not suite satisfactory. Moreover every year the dropout rates of student from such primary education is quite significant.

Sishu Siksha Kendra, Mid-day Meal Programme will reduce the dropouts from the school and increase number of school goes at primary level.

Formulation and implementation of O & M Plan

The assets created in project are required to be properly used and maintain The following steps will be taken of the' Operation and Maintenance of plan for slum and non slum:

- i. The ULB along with the CDS working in the Slum where infrastructure works were performed will arrange a meeting(1st)with all slum dwellers of that particular slum.
- ii. At this meeting the Local Councillor ,Chairman-in-Councilor Chairman-in-Council of slum development work, Municipal Engineers,Town Project Officer,Community Organiser, CDS members and RCV that particular slum will be present. Other members/ officials as also be present.
- iii. At this meeting the need for formation of Bustee Works Management Committee (BWMC)for looking after, Operation and Maintenance Plan for Slum Level Infrastructure work' will be explained to the slum dwellers.
- iv. The stock of work done and assets created under slum level infrastructure works of that particular slum will be listed at this meeting.
- v. At this meeting the ULB will brief the slum dwellers about the constitution ,role and functions of the BWM C.
- vi. Asimilar next meeting(2nd) will be held at which the BWMC will be lected as per constitution through informal election. If one meeting is not sufficient more such meetings may be arranged. Minute of each meeting with signature of the participants should be maintained

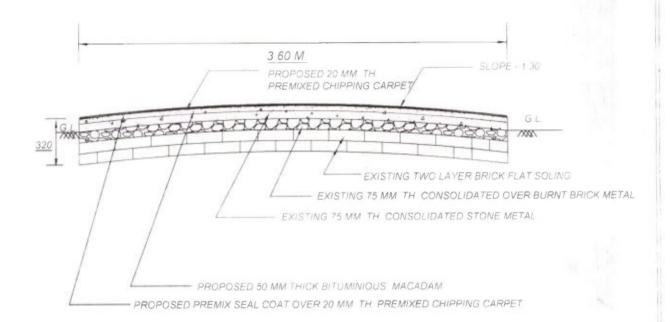

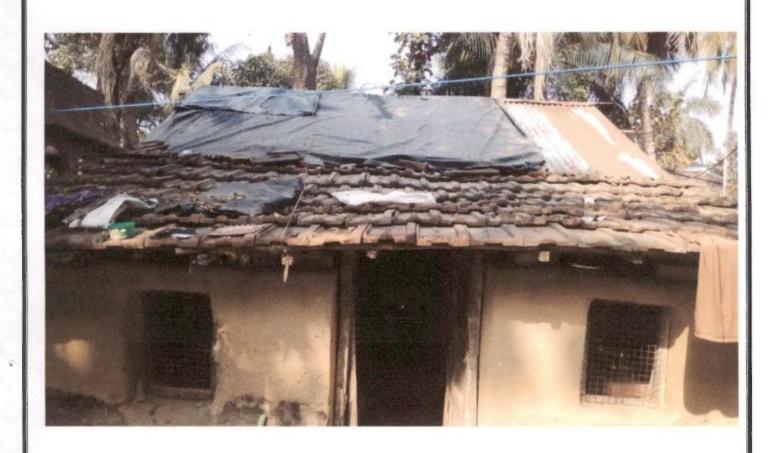

Preface

Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) aims at Providing Housing for All (HFA) by 2022 when the Nation Complete 75 years of its independence.

The urban homeless persons contribute to the economy of the cities and thus the Nation as cheap labour in the informal sector; yet they live with no shelter or social security. The urban homeless service with many challenges like no access to elementary Public Services such as health, education, food, water and sanitation. Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojona (PMAY) also aims at providing a pucca house to every family with water connection, toilet facilities, 24 X 7 electricity supply and access.

The Mission seeks to address the housing requirement of urban poor including slum dwellers through "In Situ" Slum Redevelopment, Affordable Housing through credit linked subsidy, Affordable Housing in partnership and subsidy for beneficiary led individual house. Under the mission, beneficiaries can take advantage under one component only.

Taherpur Notified Area Authority takes only one vertical i.e "Beneficiary led construction". From present Demand Assessment survey for Housing for all (HFA), it is noticed that 2890 household covering under this project. 2890 houses will be constructed through "Beneficiary-led-Construction".

Total beneficiaries of the scheme are 400 nos from 242 nos slum and 158 no of Non Slum projected for the year 2017 -18.



Introductory Note by Chairman

Taherpur N.A.A is a small but an important urban centre in the outer fringe Non-KMA Taherpur N.A.A with the active cooperation of citizen for last so many years has grown up as capable and robust institute for effective service delivery and better governance. Introduction:

Housing is one of those basic social conditions that determine the quality of life and welfare of people and places. Rapid urbanization has placed remarkable strain on housing and service land According to UN HABITAT by 2030, approximately 3 billion people, or above 401 per cent of the world's population, will need proper housing and access to basic infrastructure and servicers such as water and sanitation systems. This translates into the need to complete 96,150 housing units per day with serviced and documented land from now till 2030. However, ironically supply (especially in the developing world) is often limited by inadequate governance system/ human resource deficiencies/ institutions or regulations which are obsolete or lacking in capacity.

The Indian challenge is to place the reality of a recorded (Census 2011) rate of urbanization of 31.1% (377 million people) expected to house 600 million people by 2030 (up by 59% from 2011) with an expected urban housing shortage of 19 million; the slum population which is presently 66 million is projected at 105 million by 2017; the urban housing demand projected for the same year is as 88.78 million. In 2012 the Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation (MoHUPA) stated there was an undersupply of 18.78 million housing units, of which the economically weaker section (EWS) and Lower Income Group (LIG) constituted 95%. Whilst considering housing, it may be noted that Obsolescent houses (est. 2.82 million), as well as those with congestion (est. 18.42% of total households) have to be reckoned with in our Housing Demand.

To fulfill these needs, factors such as affordability of the buyers, development cost and selling price persistently influence the supply and demand in the housing sector. Based on the current situation, housing development is concentrated in the urban and sub-urban areas, where the purchasing power is higher and the market is extensive.

In order to address the current housing needs, both the Government and the private sector must play their respective roles to fulfill their social obligations especially to the low-income and economically weaker sections keeping in view limited public resources available and the heavy investments needed for creating housing infrastructure.

Housing for All:

Access to housing facilities, is a basic human need, next only to food and clothing. Effectively, society as a whole and poor in particular, must have access to livelihoods, finance and technology as well as relevant capacities, knowledge and skills for habitat development in order to enjoy the 'right to shelter'.

In order to address issues related to housing and informal settlements, the governments should create an enabling environment through robust National/ State Housing Policies that will help to increase the supply of affordable housing. This call for working together of key stakeholders such as national and local government bodies, non-governmental organizations, financial institutions, as well as builders and private sector developers. This will enable well defined institutional and operational conditions in order to support the housing sector more effectively and, in doing so, contribute to the provision of affordable adequate Housing for All.

Context of preparation of Housing for All Plan of Action:

The Government of India's transformation programme is to "raise living standard of low income households" for which Ministry of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation (MoHUPA had come up with the "National Housing and Habitat Policy (NUHHP) 2007, a precursor to the current 'Housing for all" by 2022. Several steps would be taken under the Mission to overcome problems pertaining to housing specially involving the poor and the ultra-poor.

An impotent part here is to ensure that only eligible recipient received housing aid, and that they be identified at their current location through a web portal which has a state wide database for capturing on low-income households, with arrangements for constant monitoring and updating.

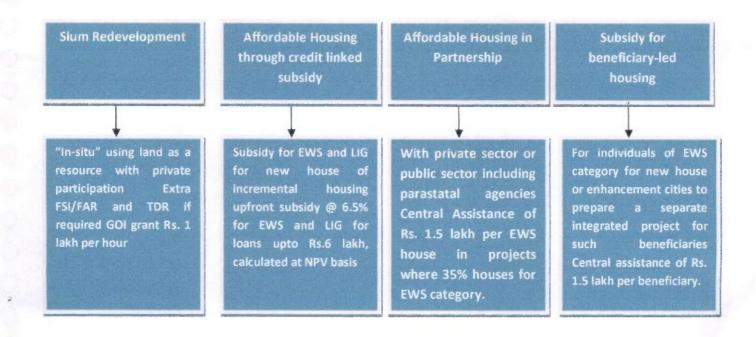
In order to address the current housing needs, both the Government and the private sector must play their respective roles to fulfill their social obligations especially to the low-income and economically weaker sections keeping in view limited public resources available and the heavy investments needed for creating housing infrastructure.

Accordingly, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation (MoHUPA) has launched "Housing for All" Mission through Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) for Urban Area to be implemented during 2015-2022 as a Centrally Scheme (except for the component of Credit Linked subsidy, which will be implemented as a State Sponsored Scheme. The Mission would provide central assistance to implementing agencies through State & UTs for providing housing to eligible families / beneficiaries by 2011. The Mission seeks to address the housing requirement of urban poor including slum dwellers for which all the states are required to prepare 'Housing for All of Action' with Annual Implementation Plans. Mission will assist State /cities in carrying out the activities for preparation of Housing for All Plan of Action (HFAPoA) under capacity building and A & OE funds. HFAPoA addresses urban poor who may not necessarily be slum dwellers.

All 4041 statutory towns as per Census 2011 with focus on 500 class I cities would be covered in three phases as follows:

- Phase I (April 2015- March 2017) to cover 100 Cities selected from States /UTs as per their willingness.
- Phase II (April 2017 March 2019) to cover additional Cities

Ministry, however, will have flexibility regarding inclusion of Additional cities in earlier. The mission seeks to address the housing requirement of urban poor including slum dwellers through following programme verticals giving option to beneficiaries, ULBs and State Governments. 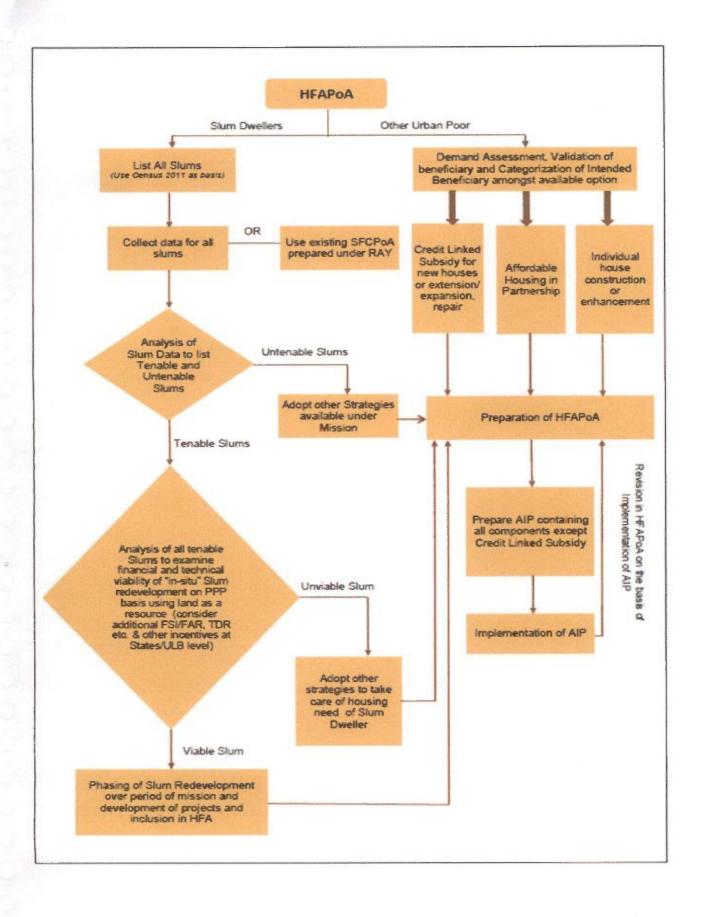
Aims and Objectives:

Aim

The aim of this Annual Implementation Plan is to create an enabling environment for providing "Affordable Housing for All" with special emphasis on EWS/LIG and other vulnerable sections of society. The Action Plan further aims to promote house for all mainly trough Beneficiary Led Construction (BLC) vertical addressing the shortage of adequate and affordable housing.

Objectives

- Reduce housing shortage for Urban Poor (both residing in slum and non-slum areas).
- Ensure an efficient and regular supply of affordable housing unit to satisfy / meet growing demand in the city.
- Ensure that all dwelling units have access to basic physical and social infrastructure like sanitation facilities, drinking water, electricity, roads and other livelihood infrastructure.
- Encourage private developers of all scales in construction of BPL/EWS/LIG categories of houses.
- Create rental housing as transit accommodation for migrants to urban areas.

Town Features:

1: History:

Taherpur Notifies Area Authority was established in 11th June 1993. The Taherpur acquired this status through long struggle of the people. In 1951, refugees from East Pakistan swarmed and settled into this jungle-covered region in Nadia district. In 1971, for the first time, Panchayat elections were held in Taherpur. After long movement by the Taherpur citizen the government accepted the demand of people to promote the administrative status of Taherpur from Gram Panchayat to Notified Area.

The area of Taherpur NAA is 2.01 sq. km. there are 4 nos of Panchayats adjacent to Taherpur Municipality

2: Year of establishment:

Taherpur Notifies Area Authority was established in 11th June 1993

3: Administrative Boundaries:

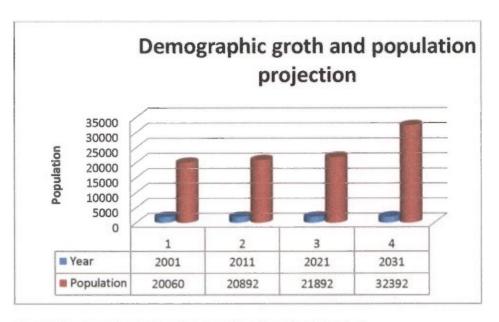
Administratively Krishnanagar bound Taherpur on the North, Birnagar in the south and Shantipur in the west. Taherpur covers an area of 2.01 sq km, which is divided into 13 wards with a total population of 20892 populations. (2011).

4: Linkages of Rail, Road, Port and Air:

Taherpur NAA is situated on Howrah – Burdwan main line. Distance between Memari and Nearest rail station Taherpur rail station which is connect Sealdha – Krishnanagar via Ranaghat and ranaghat Krishnanagar By pass bus road connection.

5: Demographic growth and population Projection:

Taherpur was 20060 in 2001 population census. In 2011 the population is t 20894. Thus within 10years the population have increased by 834 population. Thus population growth rate is only 4.14 % per decade. At the beginning of the planning year 2014 population was 21065. Next 5 year i.e in 2019 population of the tnaa will stands approximately 21501. So in this way next 4 decade population growth trend in Taherpur municipality shows by the bar diagram

6: Climate:

Taherpur Notified Area Authority is located near equator. Its climate is very much extreme, type of climate, having three seasons – summer, monsoon and winter. The summer is very hot and humid and continues from April to June. Summer is dominated by strong south westerly monsoon winds. Monsoon arrives in mid June and stays up to September. Winter is extreme ti lasts for 3 months - December, January and February. Early morning mists are common in winter. The annual mean temperature is 26.80 C. The maximum temperature often exceeds 400 C. The temperature fall below 100 C. in winter Maximum rainfall occurs during the monsoon in August (306 mm) and the average annual total is 1,582 mm. Total duration of sunshine is 2,528 hours per annum with maximum rainfall occurring in mid July/August.

7: Soil and Ground water scenario:

The area belongs to a part of earlier Gangetic delta. As a result, the type of soil is very fertile and capable of producing large quantity of crops, vegetables, and fruits in its present agricultural area. The water level is shallow in the alluvial belt and deep in other parts

8: Municipal Office:

Municipal office located in between ward no7 & 8 and 3 minits walking distance from Taherpur rail station and Taherpur Bus stop

The concept of people oriented planning as promoted in 1st generation DDP process; then the municipality adopted CDP, the approach of integrating people's voices in the development process. Twice a year 'Nagarik Sabhas' are called in which people voice their demands. The ward committees however were constituted in

1993 following the government notification and are reasonably active in identifying projects and raising own revenue. Six standing committees have been constituted for delegated functioning.

The organizational structure reveals the supremacy of the BOC while the chief executive power is vested with the Chairman. The departments have been formed following the Government order, which include PWD, Accounts, Water supply, Tax and Assessment, Health etc. The Municipality has staff strength of 65 out of the sanctioned number of 89.

9: Land Use

All maps, survey results, past technical studies and reports were assembled together and studied. A land use map for the Municipal area showing ward boundaries has been prepared. At present there are no ongoing projects within TNAA

Availability of the facility of a planned bus stand within the Municipal area has been a long-standing demand of the people of the TNAA Interaction with potential agencies revealed that this facility may be constructed by outsourcing in consideration of trend of flow of fund. Such arrangement will fetch an amount, which will take care of the reasonable price of the land in question. Besides, revenue will continue to be generated by the way of renting out part of the structure that will be constructed by the private organization

Various types of land uses exist in the locality. The salient sectors of land uses are as follows:

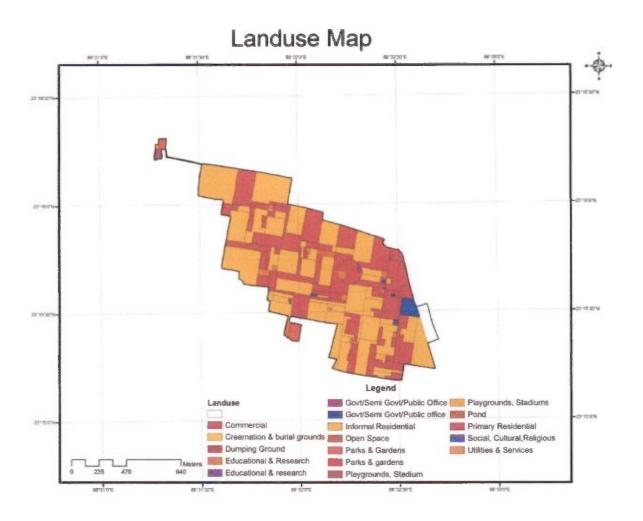

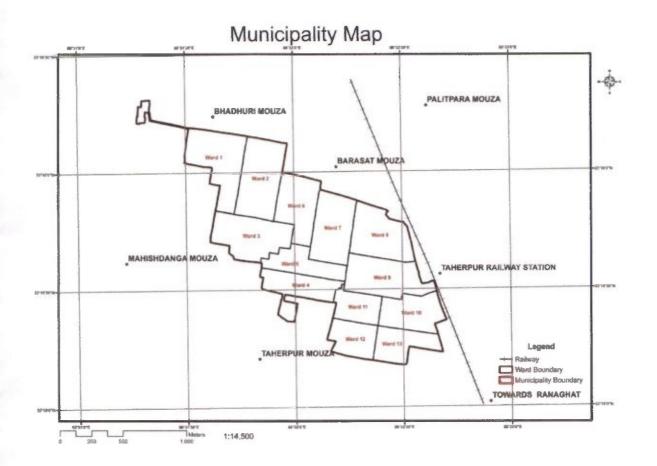
