
Sir,

4. The amount will be credited to the State Government's account to RBI as per procedure laid down by Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure vide O.M. No. F-II (45/76/SC) dated 22.02.1977.
5. In addition to the entire Scheme being governed by the Guidelines of the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) which is available at [www.moud.gov.in](http://www.moud.gov.in) and following the same while releasing funds to the beneficiaries/UIBs, the release of funds for the Community Toilet component and the Solid Waste Management Component will be restricted to and governed by the guidelines given in paragraph 5 and paragraph 7 of the SBM guidelines.
6. Entry has been made at Sl. No. 6 of Grant-in-aid Register for the year 2014-15.
7. No U.C. is pending for this project from Govt. of West Bengal.

8. This issues with the approval of Finance Division vide their Dy. No. 1/2015 dated 13.2.2015.



No. MC/SWM/MO-190 dt.12.08.2015 from Municipal Commissioner, Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) informing that the Project for strengthening Primary and Secondary Solid Waste Management System (SWM) in Kolkata Municipal Corporation originally submitted by them under cover of their memo No. Con/Com/168/2015-'16 dated 04.07.2015 at an estimated cost of Rs. 152.84 crore may be taken as the Phase - I part of the total Project. Copies of the referred correspondences along with the copy of the project originally submitted are enclosed herewith for reference.

It may be mentioned in this connection that the Detailed Project Report of the above Project was originally approved by the Government of India under JNNURM but could not be finally sanctioned due to imposition of Model Code of Conduct for General Election and other budgetary reasons as may be seen from Memo No. K-14012/9(48)/2013-N-I/N-V dated 24.06.2014 (Copy incorporated in the Project report).

The aforesaid Project has now been submitted by Kolkata Municipal Corporation for approval and release of funds under Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM). It may be recalled that in a meeting held in the office chamber of Principal Secretary, M. A. Department on 10.08.2015 in this connection it was agreed that the fund sharing pattern for this Project will be as follows:

➤ Government of India Share under SBM (@20% of project cost)	: Rs. 30.57 crore
➤ Regular State Share (@6.67% of project cost)	: Rs. 10.19 crore
➤ Additional State Share (@13.33% of project cost)	: Rs. 20.38 crore
➤ KMC's Share (@ 60% of the project cost)	: Rs. 91.70 crore

So in line with that the above 02 (two) DPR's are being forwarded for sanctioning of the project cost of Rs 152.84 Crores as well as release of fund at the earliest.

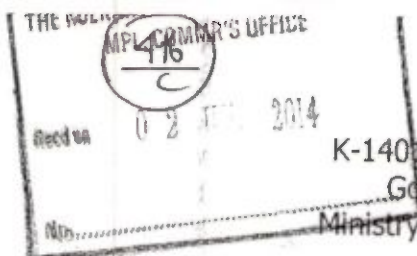

The undersigned is directed to refer to your letter no. con/com/570-2013-2014 dated 18/02/2014 on the above mentioned subject and to say that the 1<sup>st</sup> instalment of above said two DPRs approved in 133<sup>rd</sup> CSMC meeting held on 4/3/2014 could not be released by the Ministry of Finance due to the following reasons:

(i) the proposal mentioned at SI No. (i) above being more than of Rs.100 crore, required approval of the competent authorities, as per the norms of JNNURM scheme. Following the introduction of model code of conduct w.e.f. 5.3.2014 the entire process of approval could not be complied with.

(ii) in respect of the proposal mentioned at SI No. (ii) above, besides Model code of conduct and other technicalities, budgetary ceiling was applicable in last quarter of Financial year 2013-14.

2. It is also informed that in the 135<sup>th</sup> CSMC meeting held on 05/06/2014, it was decided that wherever the projects could not be sanctioned finally by the competent authority, it would be deemed to have not been sanctioned even though CSMC have recommended for sanction. It was also decided that the State Governments would be free to resubmit these projects in the new phase, as and when launched and under the guidelines stipulated for the same.

KMC area comprising about 187.33 Sq.Km. having population of approximately 90,00,000 including floating population and has a density of 24428 per sq.km. Though the MSW rules came into force in 2000, KMC has so far not been able to implement the rule comprehensively. With a view to improving the efficiency of SWM system in the city of Kolkata, KMC has prepared the DPR as strengthening primary and secondary solid waste management system in the Kolkata city and KMC is now keen to improve the infrastructure of the city and avail Government of India grants under various schemes.

**9. Need of the Project**

The objectives of the DPR are to strengthen the present level of collection, transportation of Municipal Solid Waste by following the guidelines and practices recommended in "MSW Rules 2000" notified in the Gazette of Government of India by the Ministry of Environmental and Forest (MoEF).The deficiencies identified by KMC in the present MSW management system include;

- Segregation of waste at source needs to be introduced in rest of the 134 wards
- Door to door collection system has to be increase from 70%

### **General Guidelines for Project Implementation:**

1. Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) shall obtain the requisite technical and administrative sanctions from the competent authorities/ Government of West Bengal and expedite project implementation immediately after getting the approval of CSMC, Ministry of Urban Development.
2. KMC shall make the required applications to the State Pollution Control Board (SPCB) for setting up the Municipal Solid Waste Treatment Plant (compost plants) and Landfill facility and obtain the necessary authorizations from the SPCB and other statutory bodies / Authorities as required.
3. KMC will be responsible for implementing the MSW Rules and all components of MSWM as per DPR provisions and the correctness of proposed MSWM system components.
4. KMC shall take up simultaneous & sustained IEC (Information, Education and Communication) Campaigns in association with NGOs/CBOs involved in the Sector for effective implementation and success of the project right from inception.
5. KMC shall propose amendment in Buildings Byelaws if necessary for not allowing habitations to come up within the influence zone of MSW treatment plant / land fill site as per applicable rules.
6. The beneficiary urban population should be well informed of the advantages of segregation of waste in the households / places of generation so that they may follow it scrupulously.
7. KMC should ensure provision of adequate storage containers in the street/community bins so that no solid waste spills on to the ground. The storage containers placed on the streets should be closed type to prevent rummaging of the garbage by stray animals and rag pickers etc.
8. KMC shall explore the possibility of primary collection and transport of Municipal Solid Waste from households by organizing the rag pickers/waste pickers in association with NGOs/CBOs.
9. KMC may not issue any Municipality /Government identity card or official documents to the primary waste collectors in order to prevent employment claims later on. However, the primary collectors of Municipal Solid Waste may be organized by NGOs/CBOs/RWAs and they may be educated on the matters of personal protection while dealing with MSW. Community / Informal arrangements may also be made for extending facilities for regular health checkups, preventive immunization etc. to the upgraded rag pickers engaged as primary collectors of MSW.



10. KMC should ensure placement of adequate number of storage containers in high waste generation areas such as vegetable markets, fish/meat markets, business centres, street markets / Hats and places where eateries are concentrated. If necessary, the waste from these areas should be removed twice in a day to ensure hygienic conditions in these areas.
11. KMCs shall set up proper laboratory for analysis of MSW on daily basis. Records of MSW collection, composting, rejects for land filling, analysis of MSW streams at primary level, composting level, landfill stage etc shall be maintained on daily basis and consolidated annually for future reference. Patterns of MSW on special days such as important festivals shall be recorded.
12. KMC should ensure the proper maintenance of the fleet of vehicles for MSW transportation in order to keep the vehicles in fit condition at all times as per the guidelines of the Manual. For this purpose, it may explore the possibility of outsourcing the vehicle maintenance services to private parties under PPP while, at the same time, extending by itself the facility of workshop /garage/parking /washing arrangements for the vehicles.
13. KMC should ensure that all the MSW reaching the compost plant / sanitary land fill facilities is properly documented with necessary details such as weight, place from which lifted, time of receipt, characteristics etc.
14. The MSW processing plant should have enough platform area which can accommodate / receive the higher volumes of MSW on days of special importance such as festival melas.
15. The compost plant and sanitary land fill facilities should have all the infrastructural facilities such as machinery, weigh bridges, operational area, operational buildings with amenities, laboratory for sample analysis, simple vehicle maintenance facilities such as puncture shops, illumination, internal roads, fencing, security etc. as per the Municipal Solid Waste Rules, 2000 and the Manual on Municipal Solid Waste Management published by the Ministry.
16. The setting up and operation of the Municipal Solid Waste treatment plant and sanitary land fill facility shall be in accordance with the MSW Rules 2000 and the norms of SPCB issued from time to time. The sanitary land fill facility shall also be subject to the post-closure operational requirements as laid down in the said Rules / SPCB and other statutory bodies / authorities as applicable. After the plant is set up, its functioning shall be monitored regularly by KMC in association with SPCB to ensure compliance with the Municipal Solid Waste Rules 2000.
17. KMC should ensure that user charges are levied and collected from all the generators of Municipal Solid Waste in order to meet the O&M expenses of MSWM. The KMC should also establish an asset replacement fund as Municipal Solid Waste management equipments schemes have a short life span.
18. The quality of compost shall meet the specification brought out under Fertilizer Control Second (Amendment) order November 2009 by Ministry of Agriculture and its latest amendments.

19. All material procured for SWM project needs to be as per relevant BIS specifications.
20. The estimated cost of DPR proposals has been finalised as per the current SoR(as on 03.03.2014) and the market rates for items not borne on SoR. No escalation in cost is admissible. If there is any escalation on any account, the same shall be borne by KMC& Govt. of West Bengal.
21. KMC shall prepare a detailed PERT-CPM chart once the approval is granted taking into account the infrastructure proposed, both component-wise and project-wise and monitor progress for timely completion by the schedule.
22. KMC shall ensure adherence to the framework for service level benchmarks formulated by the Ministry while implementing the project.
23. No change in the scope/design/nature of the project shall be effected without prior approval by the Ministry / CPHEEO.

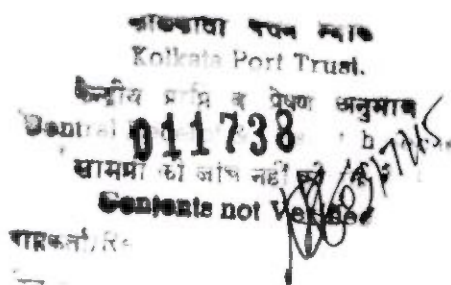

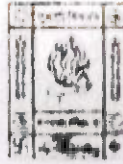



Following points are emerged from the letter of Chief Engineer, MED vide letter No. ME/708/BRGF/5/12 dated 19.06.2015, and listed as follows:


- i) This is 2<sup>nd</sup> call of the tender, Two tenderers participated.
- ii) M/S Tata Metallicks DI pipes Ltd. is found to be lowest for all the diameter pipes i.e. 150 mm, 200 mm, 250 mm and 350 mm. They have reduced their offered rate during negotiation with Chairman, Bishnupur Municipality and have been enclosed.
- iii) The offered cost (all the diameters of pipe taken together) as mentioned above are more than 5% (apportioned, 80%) of DPR provision. As per revised project cost worked out by MED no extra amount would be required to complete the project. Excess amount of this item would be adjusted from savings from other components of the project work. Revised Project Cost is enclosed for reference from which it may please be seen that **there will be savings to the tune of Rs. 644.64 lakh** against different items (excepting Water Meter).
- iv) Lowest offered rates have been compared with PHE-SoR-2013 and that with DPR provision and have been enclosed. From which it may be seen that lowest offered cost (Rs. 307.98 lakh) is 11.28% higher than DPR and 5.93% higher than PHED, SoR-2013.
- v) Chief Engineer, MED has also stated that lowest offered rates are slightly less than the rates earlier recommended for Ranaghat Scheme under UIDSSMT except 350 mm DI-K-7 pipe which is slightly more than approved rate of same diameter pipe for Ranaghat Water Supply Scheme.

Chief Engineer, MED has recommended for acceptance of lowest offered rates of M/S Tata Metallicks DI pipes in the meeting of Technical Committee.

**Sub: Requirement of Additional State Share for implementation of the component of Individual House Hold Latrine (IHHL) and Community Latrine under Swachh Bharat Mission**

It may kindly be recalled that in the original Concept Note submitted to Govt. of India in February 2015 there was a proposal for construction of 11,88,164 IHHL (including conversion pit latrines and insanitary latrines into sanitary latrines) (projected figure for 2019). A copy of the Concept Note submitted to Govt. of India is placed below for ready reference.

Similarly, based on the Guidelines of Govt. of India it was proposed in the note that **11,773 nos of seat of Community Toilet** will be required to be provided by 2019.

In the said Concept Note it was proposed that **90,000 IHHL** would be taken up for construction in the Financial Year 2014-'15. The proposed target for Community Toilets for Financial Year 2014-'15 was fixed as **3750 seats**.

Against this Concept Note the Govt. of India released a sum of Rs 64.01 Crore for Individual House Hold Latrines as well as other components under Swachh Bharat Mission in February 2014. As the said Central funds along with matching State Share could be placed at the disposal of SUDA only in July 2015, (after observing procedural formalities like opening of a Head of Accounts etc.) the target for 2014-'15 is taken as the target for 2015-'16.

It may also be recalled in this connection that in a meeting held in the Chamber of Principal Secretary on 12.08.2015, it was decided that all the ULBs (125 nos.) across the State will be covered for construction of Individual House Hold Latrines (IHHL) and the nos. to be constructed will be proportional to the number of House Holds without latrines and those with insanitary and pit latrines in these towns. It was also tentatively decided that out of an estimated unit cost of an Individual House Hold Latrine of Rs. 20,000/- while the beneficiary and the concerned ULB shall pay Rs. 2,000/- each, Rs. 4,000/- will be available as Central Share and Rs. 1,333/- (one third of Central Share as per Guidelines) as regular State Share. Thus there will be a shortfall of Rs. 10,667/- per unit which the State Government will be required to provide either from other suitable Head in the State Plan Budget or Supplementary Budget Provision.

In consideration of the proposed funding pattern suggested in the foregoing paragraph, the additional liability of the State Government for IHHL (80% of 299574 + 60% of 756885 + 100% of 36641 i.e. 730431 increased by 15% for the year 2015-16 = 839997) works out to Rs. 896.03 Crore during the Mission period. The M.A Department may now be requested to obtain in-principle approval of the additional liabilities of Rs. 896.03 Crore in addition to regular State share of Rs. 111.97 Crore. In other words, the gross liability of the State Government will be of the order of Rs. 1008.00 Crore for Individual House Hold Latrines.

As regards Community Toilets (CT), it was proposed in the Concept Note that 11773 seats would be required to be constructed during the Mission period. For Community Toilets against an estimated construction cost of Rs. 65,000/- per seat

J' the Central Share is Rs. 26,000/- and the regular State Share is Rs. 8,666/- (one third of Central Share as per Guidelines). This leaves the State exchequer with an additional liability of Rs 30,334/- per seat for which the Additional State liability will be of the order of Rs 35.71 Crore for the Mission period. Thus the total liability (regular and additional State Share) for 11773 seats will work out to the order of Rs. 45.91 Crore. The M.A. Department may also be requested to locate a suitable source for this additional resource for construction of Community Toilets.

E As regards current Financial Year (2015-'16) the target for IHHL is 90,000 out of which 12,220 units were constructed in 10 ULBs in Nadia District by July 2015 to render the District ODF. Thus the remaining target for the current Financial Year is 77,780 units. The Additional State liability for 77,780 units is Rs. 82.97 Crore and the gross total liability including the regular State Share is Rs. 93.34 Crore. It may be pointed out in this connection that the M.A. Department has been requested separately to arrange for the Additional State liability of Rs. 5.70 Crore for 12,220 units.

F For Community Toilets in the current Financial Year (2015-'16) the target is 3750 seats and the Additional State liability would work out to Rs. 11.38 Crore and the gross total liability including regular State Share is Rs 14.63 Crore. The position is furnished in a tabular form marked Annexure 'A' and placed in file below.

G In this connection for proper sensitization of the ULBs to implement this programme, it is suggested that copies of the Scheme Guideline of Swachh Bharat Mission alongwith other relevant advisories received from Govt. of India from time to time be circulated to the ULBs for their records and reference. It is also proposed that briefing meetings be organized with the ULBs across the State in batches for better preparedness of the ULBs for implementation of the programme.

H Both for Individual House Hold Latrines and Community Toilets (6 seater - 3 for male and 3 for female) the MED may be requested to prepare detailed plans and estimates (Rs. 20,000/- for Individual House Hold Latrines and Rs. 3,90,000/- for a 6 seater Community Toilets) to be adopted in the implementation of this programme.

Notes from NSP-10 may kindly be perused and earlier discussions held in the Chamber of Principal Secretary, M.A. Department on 12.08.2015 regarding Additional State liability for implementation of Swachh Bharat Mission in Urban areas may kindly be recalled. Accordingly, a detail estimate has been made computing the financial liability as Matching State Share and Additional State Share in respect of construction of Individual Household Latrines (IHL) and Community Latrines based in urban areas on data of Census 2011 which may be seen at Para-A to F at NSP-10 & 11. However, the actual requirement of latrines will emerge from the findings of the current survey of insanitary latrines. It may be seen that the tentative estimate have been made taking the unit cost of IHL as Rs. 20,000/- and cost per seat of community toilet as Rs. 65,000/- as indicated in the SBM (U) Guidelines issued by Government of India. It has been indicated that during Mission Period upto 2<sup>nd</sup> Oct, 2019, the gross liability of State Government will be around Rs. 1008 crore for IHL (Para-C) and Rs. 35.71 crore for community toilet (Para-D) i.e. **total Rs. 1043.71 crore**. The financial liability for other major component i.e. Municipal Solid Waste Management has not been included which has been taken up separately. Accordingly, the Additional State liability for the current year i.e. 2015-16 has also been worked out which comes to Rs. 93.34 crore for IHL and Rs. 14.63 crore for Community Toilets i.e. **total Rs. 107.97 crore** (details may be seen at Annexure-A placed at C.P. side).

In view of above, in principle approval may be accorded for implementation of two components i.e. construction of IHL and construction of Community Toilets in all the ULBs across the State (except 10 ULBs of Nadia District where IHL has already been constructed with Financial Support from SBM and State Government). Other proposals at Para-G & H may also be approved.

# Socio-Economic & Caste Census 2011 Statutory Towns of West Bengal- Urban

- The Government of India has decided that a Socio Economic and Caste Census for rural and urban areas will be held in 2011-12. Accordingly along with the other states, work has started in this state from January, 2012. The primary work of field level enumeration and supervision was taken up concurrently in all the districts in two phases.
- Considering the area , population size and density, Kolkata Municipal Corporation has been treated as a separate district for the Census purpose .
- In this state, State Urban Development Agency ( SUDA) under the guidance of Municipal Affairs Department is acting as the Nodal Agency in respect of the work in urban areas.
- In this survey, the household information has been directly captured in the tablet computers and downloaded in the computers set up at the municipality or borough level.
- As per the guidelines, the collected information is being uploaded in the NIC server. With the completion of enumeration and supervisory round, the captured information published as draft for public viewing and invitation of claims and objections.
- After disposal of claims and objections, the final list was published.

➤ The State Government has decided to use Socio-Economic and Caste Census-20011 data for identification of "eligible beneficiaries under National Food Security Act'2013 (NFSA). It has been determined by the Central Government that the total number of eligible beneficiaries to be covered under the NFSA -2013 in the state determined at 601 lakh, of which rural population shall be 463.31 lakh [74.47%] and urban 138.53 lakh. [ 47.55%]. Further, out of the total 601 lakh for the entire State, 19,85,700 families will be come under the purview of Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) which approximately translate into 100 lakh persons and balance shall be treated as "Priority Households. For Urban areas, 2,85,000 families will be come under the purview of Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) which approximately translate into approximately 14 lakh persons in urban areas. The "eligible households" are those as explained in the section 3(1) of NFSA-2013 ie, "eligible households" means households covered under the priority households and the Antyodaya Anna Yojana.



➤ The contemplation of the Central Government regarding implementation of NFSA-2013 is that the State Government shall firstly, notify the criteria for the eligible households and secondly, identify the actual beneficiaries based on such criteria.

➤ To identify such beneficiaries under NFSA-2013, it is stipulated that the eligibility criteria shall be fixed by the State Government on the basis of which individual beneficiaries will be selected. For rural areas, criterion has been fixed for identification of AAY and priority households under NFSA-2013 by using automatic exclusion, automatic inclusion criteria and thereafter ranking the remaining households using deprivation criteria. Deprivation criterion for selection of eligible beneficiaries, as already determined in the case of rural areas, is yet to be finalised by the Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation, Government of India. Incidentally it may be mentioned here that a Draft Methodology enunciated in the guidelines for proper identification of urban poor issued under Memo. No. F.No. M 11019/13/2011-PP by the Planning Commission, Govt. of India.

➤ Notification for constitution of District Level Committee has already been issued by P&RD Department in respect of both rural and urban areas for monitoring and supervising the claim and objection process to make error-free list under SECC-2011.

➤ Notification containing eligibility criteria has already been issued from the Food & Supplies Department and accordingly as per provision of National Food Security Act (NFSA) using draft methodology the database of AAY & Priority Households of urban areas has already been sent to Food & Supplies Department on the basis of Draft SECC-2011 data for immediate implementation of NFSA.

➤ The Department of Food & Supplies on receipt of such list shall then send such list of eligible beneficiaries under NFSA-2013 to the District Monitoring Committee as constituted by P&RD Department for both Rural and Urban areas, and the Monitoring Committee will endorse the list of beneficiaries and send it back to the Food & Supplies Department to be used for the purpose of extending benefits under the NFSA Act.

❖ By using draft methodology, it transpires that 2,36,129 number of Households are covered under AAY and another 17,49,264 families are treated as priority households thereby leading to total of 19,85,393 households ie. 84,77,628 beneficiaries in urban areas.

❖ After final publication based on claims and objection, 2,47,705 number of Households are covered under AAY and another 17,93,345 families are treated as priority households thereby leading to total of 20,41,050 households ie. 87,96,926 beneficiaries in urban areas.





The average output in excavation against lead upto 80'-0" and lift upto 5'-0" has been considered following the above mentioned G.O. However, in this model estimate, the consumption of un-skilled labour in point of earth work excavation has been shown on Ordinary mixed soil (62 c.ft/ 1 u-sk). Hence, the consumption of un-skilled labour in other soil sectors may be adjusted little a bit following the Government Order & Guideline.

Subject- Focus on Open Defecation Free (ODF) Municipal Wards

Dear Sir,

As you are aware, Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) has been launched on 2<sup>nd</sup> Oct 2014 with two pronged focus to make the Country Open Defecation Free (ODF) and also bring acceptable level of cleanliness in Cities / Towns. While deliberating upon the subject at various fora, it has emerged that since a Municipal Ward is the basic functional unit in Urban areas, a "bottom up" approach starting from Ward level would be most appropriate way to achieve the objectives of ODF Towns.

An ODF Ward would essentially have the following characteristics:

- 1) Sanitary toilets in each household.
- 2) Where not practicable due to space constraints, a set of households are clubbed together to use a Community Toilet constructed in the immediate vicinity, not in any case more than 500 m distance from the user's household.
- 3) Public Toilets are provided as per established standards in commercial establishments such as markets, cinema halls, multiplexes, theatres, museums, hotels, restaurants hospitals and office buildings. In addition, by the municipal authorities to cater for the floating population. It is also recommended that a person should not have to travel more than 1 km to find Public Toilet.

I request you to devise innovative methods to incentivise ward level officials for achieving "Open Defecation Free Wards" under the Mission.

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Status Report on Progress on Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) in West Bengal

As per Guidelines of Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM)-Urban a concept plan was submitted to Government of India in 2014-15 and accordingly 1<sup>st</sup> installment of Central Share amounting to Rs. 64.012 crore has been released by Government of India to the Government of West Bengal. For drawal of the said amount State Government in the Municipal Affairs Department has already moved to Principal AG, West Bengal for approval for opening of head of account.

1. The target for individual household insanitary latrines (IHHL) upto March 2016 is about 90,000. In respect of ten ULBs in the District of Nadia the District Authorities indentified 12,200 households within insanitary latrines or without latrines. All the 12,200 IHHL has been taken up for construction and so far Rs. 400.00 lakh has been released by State Government from SBM account to Nadia District Administration (Zilla Parishad) for this purpose.
2. Further, 3750 seats (Male + Female) of Community Toilet has been planned for 2015-'16. About 8,000 seats (Male + Female) of Public Toilet has been planned for 2015-'16.
3. As regards Solid Waste Management a strategy paper for SWM in the State is under preparation. After this strategy paper is completed individual DPRs of SWM as per SBM Guidelines will be prepared in respect of prioritized ULBs as per Govt. policy. Also, as per Guidelines of Govt. of India City Sanitation Plans (CSP) are being prepared for submission to the Govt. of India before claiming the second installment of Central Share.
4. Necessary steps have been initiated for IEC and Capacity Building under SBM in the State and ULB level. Also under the CCBP, slots have been earmarked for capacity building for municipal functionaries in respect of programs under SBM.
5. Notification for designating State Level Nodal Agency will be issued soon and also a dedicated PMU for SBM is proposed to be in place for which proposal is under consideration of Administrative Department.
6. The Municipal General Elections in as many as 91 Urban Local Bodies in the state were held in April, 2015 and Municipal Boards are in the process of being formed in most of the towns. As such not much of interaction could be made with the Municipalities during the last two months or so (Model Code of Conduct was in force before the Elections).
7. Govt. of India may kindly consider the viewpoint of the State Govt. to increase the Central Share for all the components under the Mission as much funds through PPP mode for these components are not likely to be available.
